# SFPD, Community Partners Kick-Off Annual Toy Giveaway With Holiday Party for San Francisco Children 19-144

The annual toy giveaway will kick-off with a free holiday party for boys and girls ages 12 years and younger at the **Potrero Hill Recreation Center (801 Arkansas Street) on Friday December 13<sup>th</sup> 2019 from 4:00PM until 7:00PM.** The celebration will include free snacks and surprises along with several special guests.
