# San Francisco Police Make Arrest in OMI Serial Vandalism Investigation 21-121

In April of 2021 investigators from the Taraval Station Neighborhood Team (TNT) began an investigation into a series of vandalism crimes in the Ocean Avenue area of San Francisco. The investigation led to the identity of Steven Gaffney, 43 of San Francisco as a suspect. Investigators determined that Gaffney was responsible for a series of window smash vandalisms and burglaries in the Taraval, Ingleside, Mission and Central Police Districts.

On June 21, 2021, at approximately 9:15 p.m., Taraval Station officers located and arrested Gaffney on the 100 block of Holloway Avenue. Gaffney was later booked at the San Francisco County Jail for the following: three counts of burglary (459 PC, 2<sup>nd</sup> degree), thirteen counts of felony vandalism (594(b)(1) PC), three counts of possession of burglary tools (466 PC), committing a felony while armed with a deadly weapon (12022(b)(1) PC, and a probation violation (1203.2(a) PC). Gaffney is on probation in San Francisco for a prior vandalism incident.

The cost of damages to victim businesses is estimated to be over \$35,000.

The Taraval Neighborhood Team (TNT) in collaboration with our foot beat officers did an outstanding job of working together to identify Steven Gaffney and take him into custody.
