Captain's Message

Bayview Station has recently rolled out a new way to partner with the community to help better formulate crime prevention strategies and assist in the investigation of criminal activity. If you have a surveillance camera outside your business or residence, please consider registering it with Bayview Station below.

Surveillance footage is vital in criminal investigations and can provide additional information and insight into an event. Voluntary registration of private exterior cameras allows us to consult the registration database in the event of a crime in order to ascertain the possibility that the incident may have been recorded.

You would only be contacted by Bayview Station if we are investigating criminal activity that occurred in the vicinity of your registered camera in which case we may request a copy of the footage to assist in the investigation. Our registry is limited to surveillance cameras in the Bayview Police District. You can also register you camera separately with SF District Attornev's Office.

Carjacking Arrest – 1100 block Thomas – 2/21/18, 11:30 am

On January 20th, a 41 year old victim reported a carjacking at Mission Station. He told the officers that he was loading his car, which was idling, at **Rankin and Quesada**, when a suspect approached and held a knife to his neck. The suspect removed the victim's personal property from his pockets before getting into the victim's vehicle and driving off. Mission officers advised the Bayview officers who located the vehicle the following day along with the suspect in the driver's seat. The suspect was arrested and booked. (SFPD Case No. 180135434)

Auto Burglary Arrest - unit block Navy - 2/21/18, 11:47 am

Officers on patrol spotted a suspect who they recognized as being wanted in connection with a February 15th auto burglary that occurred on the **900 block of Northridge**. The officers were familiar with the suspect, who also had a \$50,000 warrant for his arrest out of San Mateo County for robbery. The suspect was taken into custody without incident

and booked. (SFPD Case No. 180123138)

Firearm Arrest- unit block Conkling - 2/22/18, 8:40 am

On January 20th, officers were made aware that that a 15 year old student was seen to be in possession of a gun while on the school campus several days prior. Surveillance footage captured the suspect picking up the gun, which had fallen from his pocket, and replacing it. Bayview inspectors responded to the suspect's residence in the unit block of Samoset where they received permission to search his room. The .380 pistol was recovered and the suspect was arrested and booked on weapons charges at the Juvenile Justice Center. (SFPD Case No. 180135412)

Aggravated Assault Arrest – 300 block Williams – 2/22/18, 9:40 am

Officers made an arrest in a brutal unprovoked assault of a 30 year old victim that occurred on November 17th, at 10:10 am, on the **2500 block of San Bruno**. The victim had been standing on the sidewalk when a suspect shoved her from behind causing her to hit her head on a parking meter. The suspect fled on foot. The officers, through their follow up investigation, were able to identify the suspect. He was subsequently located, arrested, and booked on aggravated assault charges. (SFPD Case No. 170936054)

Firearm Arrest- 700 block Kirkwood - 2/22/18, 5:13 pm

Officers patrolling the area noticed several cars stopped in the street and went to investigate the traffic violations. One of the subjects was seen dipping into one of the cars through an open window as the officers approached. One of the officers approached the car and looked in, spotting a handgun wedged in between the passenger seat and passenger door. The suspect was arrested for firearms offenses and the **loaded .40 caliber pistol** was seized. (SFPD Case No. 180142768)

Robbery – 1000 block Hollister – 2/26/18, 12:55 am

A 23 year old victim was joined by some friends at his home where the group was consuming alcohol. Several of the attendees were unknown to the victim as they came as guests of the victim's acquaintance. At one point, the victim got into an argument with the two unknown guests and they physically attacked him. The victim stated that his phone fell out of his pocket as they were hitting him and that one of the suspects grabbed the phone and took it with him when the pair fled the scene. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180151117)

Firearm Arrest- unit block Commer Ct- 2/26/18, 9:38 pm

Officers patrolling the area came upon several subjects who appeared to be drinking alcohol inside of a parked vehicle. As the officers approached the car, they noticed the subject in the passenger seat furiously bobbing up and down as if attempting to conceal

something. They made contact with the subject and when he rolled down the window, they detected the odor of burnt marijuana in the car. Both subjects were removed from the vehicle at which point the officers located a **9mm semi-automatic firearm** under the passenger seat. An additional handgun, **a .40 caliber with a mounted flashlight**, was located concealed in a bag on the passenger seat. The suspect was arrested and booked on firearm related charges, (SFPD Case No. 180153527)

Firearm Arrest- 3rd / Palou- 2/27/18, 5:03 pm

Officers patrolling the Mendel Plaza stopped a subject who was walking his dog without a leash in order to admonish him. The subject appeared excessively nervous and walked away, stating that he would collect his loose dog. The officers kept an eye on him and noticed what appeared to be a pistol grip sticking out of his jacket pocket. The officers approached the suspect again and he made a motion to conceal the item as he took off running. The officers gave chase and apprehended the suspect. A .38 caliber revolver was recovered from his jacket pocket. The suspect was arrested and booked on firearms related charges. (SFPD Case No. 180155567)

Suspicious Activity Defined

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident had been committed, or about to be committed.

Examples:

- An individual peering into vehicles or trying door handles, appearing to trying to locate any valuables
- An individual checking front doors of residences, or attempting to locate unattended packages, or following delivery trucks to see where packages are being dropped off.

Crime Defined

Robbery- The taking of property from another by use of force or fear.

Assault- The unlawful attempt, coupled with present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person. *Assault* is when a person swings their arm and *Battery* is when that arm makes contact with another.

Misdemeanor Battery- Any willful and unlawful touching of another

Community Policing Defined

Community policing, or communityoriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the community.

 outreach to Drug Users: Bayview
 Station officers coordinate with city
 agencies to provide outreach and
 assistance to rehabilitate those
 who are dependent on illegal
 drugs and outreach to homeless
 individuals to connect them with
 resources and support
- <u>Foot Patrols</u>: Bayview Station has beat officers assigned to the 3rd St. corridor, 18th St., and San Bruno Avenue.
- Monthly Community Relations
 Meetings: Community Meetings are held continuously on the first Tuesday of each month. Officers also attend meetings with merchant groups, business groups, development authorities

Felony Battery- The use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

Aggravated Assault- Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft- Theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950

Petty Theft- Theft where the value of property taken is less than \$950

- and others. Concerns are voiced and addressed through problem solving
- Email Updates: Bayview Station sends out weekly newsletter updates to district residents that outline crime trends, upcoming community events, crime prevention tips, and contact information.

Types of Crime Reports That Can Be Filed Online:

- Harassing Phone Calls: When you are experiencing annoying calls with no known suspects; for example, hang-ups or heavy breathing.
- Lost Property: When property has disappeared and not stolen. If you think it could
 have been taken but you have no idea by who, you may enter the report online.
- Theft: When property is stolen but there has been no illegal entry or contact by the thief.
- Vandalism/Graffiti: The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property, including graffiti.
- Vehicle Burglary: When property was stolen from a vehicle.
- Vehicle Tampering: Tampering with a motor vehicle, including vandalism/graffiti of the vehicle.

Calling the Police:

Dispatchers ask questions in a particular order for a reason. It is best to stay calm and answer all questions to the best of your ability.

Complaint: Location, Hazards (ie. weapons at scene), Victim info (sex, age, condition)

Suspect Description: Gender, Race, Age, Clothing, distinguishing features
Vehicle Description: Color, Make, Model, License Plate, distinguishing features





Each San Francisco neighborhood (defined by zip code) can visit the California Academy of Sciences for free over a three-day weekend (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday) in the spring and fall of each year. So that means as long as you have a driver's license or other proof of residency, you can save yourself \$34.95 and visit the museum for free. Read the full rules.

The Rules: Each visiting adult must show a valid photo ID with proof of residency (you may not bring out of town guests for free; they still have to pay). Visiting adults are limited to six children for free entry.

The following items or combinations are acceptable:

- A driver's license or state ID card
- Photo ID plus postmarked envelope, postcard, or magazine label with name and date
- Photo ID plus utility bill (gas/electric/cable) or bank statement
- Letter from a government agency with name and home address (not a P.O. box)
- Only residents from the zip codes invited on the designated dates will be admitted free of charge

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication **except** for:

- Herbal Remedies
- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices
- Sharps
- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city



services with only two numbers to remember: 911 for emergencies and 3-1-1 for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
