Residential Burglary Arrest

July 30, 2018 - unit block Topeka (SFPD 180567467)

Officers responded to a call of a burglary in progress. The suspects fled out of the back door as the officers approached. A perimeter around the home was set up and the officers' subsequent search led to the arrest of three suspects as well as the recovery of property stolen from the residence.

Firearm, Shots Fired

August 1, 2018 - **1500 block Palou** (SFPD 180573016)

Officers responded to a Shot Spotter activation and attempted to detain two subjects who matched the description provide. Both subjects fled and a foot chase ensued. The officers located a **9mm handgun**, loaded with an extended magazine, that had been thrown down by one of the suspects. One of the suspects, a 17 year old, was located and identified prior to being released to a guardian pending further investigation.

Homicide Attempt Arrest

August 1, 2018 - **200 block Harbor** (SFPD 180560574)

An arrest was made in the July 27th shooting of two victims in the **Oakdale / Baldwin** area.

Officers responded on a call of shots fired and located evidence of a shooting. After the investigation revealed the identity of the suspect, officers who recognized him responded to his residence and placed him under arrest. The suspect, a convicted felon on active probation, was booked on two counts of attempted homicide and firearms related charges.

Shooting

August 3, 2018 - **3rd / Revere** (SFPD 180580340)

A 25 year old suspect walked into ZSFGH with a gunshot wound to the shoulder. He was uncooperative in providing information to the responding officers that night. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

August 4, 2018 - Cesar Chavez / Indiana (SFPD 180580732)

The victim, a MUNI driver, had just left work when he was approached by three suspects who demanded to know what was in his bag. One of the suspects brandished a knife at the victim, who dropped the bag as he was in fear for his life. One of the suspects then demanded the victim's wallet and punched him in the face before all three took off with the stolen items. This incident is under investigation.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- Herbal Remedies
- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices
- Sharps
- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
