Shooting, Firearm Arrest

August 7, 2018 - **1500 block Jennings** (SFPD 180590634)

Officers responded to a call of a shooting, they located a 24 year old female subject with a gunshot wound to the leg inside a vehicle. A **loaded handgun** was found in the vehicle and the injury was believed to have been accidently self inflicted. The subject was transported to ZSFGH for treatment. This incident is under investigation.

Auto Burglary Arrest

August 10, 2018 - **100 block Marlin** (SFPD 180401514)

Officers arrested a suspect who was identified during the course of an investigation into an auto burglary that occurred on the 100 block of Marlin in May. An investigation into an auto burglary that occurred in May revealed the identity of the suspect. He was booked on felony burglary charges.

Aggravated assault

August 10, 2018 - 1700 block Quesada (SFPD 180598133)

Officers responded to a call of an assault and located the 55 year old victim. He told the officers that his relative had approached him demanding money. The suspect then picked up a gallon paint can and swung it at the victim, striking him. the suspect then punched the victim in the face and fled the scene in a vehicle. This incident is under investigation with an arrest warrant pending.

Burglary Arrest

August 11, 2018 - **3800 block 3rd** (SFPD 180600603)

Officers responded to a call of a burglary and located the suspect who was arrested, they located stolen property in the suspect's possession that was determined to have been stolen in a separate burglary that occurred on July

28th. The suspect was booked on both burglaries along with possession of stolen property as well an outstanding warrant.

Robbery

August 12, 2018 - Wayland / Somerset (SFPD 180603986)

A 69 year old victim was walking with her purse slung over her shoulder when a suspect ran up and attempted to rip the bag away from her. The victim struggled with the suspect but he was able to force the purse away from her before running into a waiting dark colored sedan. This incident is under investigation.

Narcotics, Parole Warrant Arrest

August 12, 2018 - **2100 block Jennings** (SFPD 180604285)

Officers conducting a narcotics abatement operation witnessed a hand to hand transaction and detained the parties involved. An arrest was made on a suspect who had a no bail parole violation warrant. Crack cocaine and heroin were found in the suspects possession and were seized.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication **except** for:

• Herbal Remedies

- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices
- Sharps
- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.



Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city



services with only two numbers to remember: 911 for emergencies and 3-1-1 for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
