One of the trends I want to bring to your attention are the number of firearms related arrests made by our officers on a regular basis. Firearms in the hands of criminals pose tremendous danger to our communities and the officers that have to deal with them. Here is a brief summary of the arrests Central Station Officers have made in the past six months:

Location of Arrest: Unit block of O'Farrell Street

Officer Reggi and Officer Kresley arrested a suspect for robbery, possession of a loaded firearm and possession of firearm by prohibited person.

Location of Arrest: Geary Street and Powell Street

Officer Roberts and Officer Glenn arrested a suspect for possession of firearm by prohibited person and possession of loaded firearm in vehicle.

**Assault** – An unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

One of the suspects walked away and approached the victim from behind. The suspect punched the victim in the head and the victim fell to the ground. The suspects then fled the scene.

### Robbery

**Robbery –** Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

6/18	1:30am	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force</b> 400 BLK of Powell	The suspect entered the store and stole property. An employee confronted the suspect as he was exiting the store. The suspect punched the employee in the face. The suspect fled the store and as officers approached the store, the employee pointed the suspect out to the officers. <b>Arrest made.</b>
6/18	7:20pm	<b>Robbery, With Force</b> Hyde/Jackson	An unknown suspect shoved the victim from behind and stole her cell phone from her hands. The suspect then fled the scene.
6/20	2:15am	<b>Robbery, With Gun</b> Unit BLK of Ross	An unknown suspect got out of a vehicle and pointed a gun at the victim. The suspect reached into the victim's pants pocket and removed his wallet. The suspect pulled the victim's shirt over his head and pistol whipped him on the head. By the time the victim took his shirt off his head, the suspect fled away in the vehicle.
6/20	12:25pm	<b>Robbery, With Force</b> Unit BLK of Powell	The suspect approached the victim and stole her cell phone from her hands. The victim chased the suspect and was able to grab the suspect by her hair to stop her. During the struggle, the suspect dropped the cell phone. A second victim tried to pick up the cell phone, but was surrounded by two other suspects and was struck multiple times. Officers responded to the scene and numerous witnesses pointed to the suspects. <b>Arrests made.</b>
6/20	11:25pm	<b>Robbery, With Other Weapon</b> 2500 BLK of mason	Three unknown suspects approached the victim and demanded her property. The victim attempted to flee, but the suspects pepper sprayed her in the face and grabbed her purses. The suspects then fled the scene in a vehicle.
6/21	5:37am	<b>Robbery, With Force</b> Sacramento/Drumm	The suspect was standing in front of a store as the victim walked by. The suspect asked the victim for money, but she told him she did not have any money. The suspect followed the victim and yanked her wallet from her hands. The suspect took money from the wallet and returned to the store he was standing in front of. Officers arrived and the victim positively identified the suspect. <b>Arrest made.</b>
6/21	9:52pm	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force</b> 2600 BLK of Mason	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect outside of the store. The suspect began yelling at her and refused to pay. The employee returned to the store and the suspect reentered the store. The suspect punched the employee in the chest. The employee attempted to call the police on her cell phone, but the suspect grabbed the phone and threw it on the ground. The suspect then fled the scene.
6/22	2:20am	<b>Robbery, With Force</b> Unit BLK of 2 <sup>nd</sup>	The victim noticed a group of juveniles following him and crossed the street thinking they may rob him. As he was crossing the street, an unknown suspect pushed him from behind and grabbed his bag. The suspect then fled the scene with the other juveniles.
6/22	10:30am	<b>Robbery, Bank, With Knife</b> 500 BLK of Montgomery	An unknown suspect approached the teller window with a knife in his hand and demanded money. Fearing for her safety, the victim gave the suspect money. The suspect took the money and fled the scene.
6/22	11:46am	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force</b> 400 BLK of Bay	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect at the exit. The employee and suspect struggled for the bags that the suspect was holding. The employee was able to pull the bags from the suspect and the suspect fled the scene.

6/24	1:36pm	<b>Robbery, With Force Taylor/Post</b>	The suspect approached the victim on a bicycle and stole his cell phone from his hand. The victim chased the suspect and the suspect fell off his bicycle. The suspect continued to flee on foot. The victim attempted to detain the suspect, but the suspect pushed the victim to the ground. With the help of two good Samaritans, the suspect was detained. <b>Arrest made.</b>
6/24	9:00pm	<b>Robbery, With Knife California/Leidesdorff</b>	An unknown suspect approached the victim from behind and threw him to the ground. While on the ground, the victim saw another suspect holding a knife. The suspects grabbed his cell phone and fled the scene.
6/25	8:20am	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force 300 BLK of Bay</b>	The suspect entered the store and filled a shopping cart full of merchandise. As the suspect exited the store, he charged at security with the shopping cart. A struggle ensued, but security was able to hold the suspect till officers arrived. <b>Arrest made.</b>
6/25	10:30am	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force Unit BLK of Powell</b>	Five unknown suspects entered the store and stole merchandise. As the suspects exited the store, an employee grabbed merchandise from one of the suspects. A struggle ensued, but the suspect was able to forcefully pull the merchandise from the employee.
6/26	1:41 pm	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force 500 BLK of Pine</b>	Four unknown suspects entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee tried to stop them by standing in front of them. One of the suspects punched the employee and forced past him. The employee moved out of the way and the suspects fled the scene.
6/26	9:30pm	<b>Robbery, With Knife 2500 BLK of Taylor</b>	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. The suspect was confronted by security at the door. The suspect attempted to push past security, but security blocked him. The suspect pulled out a knife and swung it at security. Security moved out of the way and the suspect fled the scene.
6/26	9:35pm	<b>Robbery, Attempt, With Force 400 BLK of Sansome</b>	An unknown suspect grabbed the victim from behind and held him by the neck. A second suspect attempted to grab the victim's cell phone from his hand. The victim started to swing his arms trying to escape. Bystanders saw the incident and began to yell. The suspects then fled the scene.
6/28	3:45am	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With a Knife 600 BLK of Market</b>	The suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee followed the suspect outside of the store and demanded that the suspect return the items. The suspect pulled out a box cutter and chased the employee. The employee returned to the store and held the doors shut. The suspect punched and kicked the glass attempting to gain entry. Officers arrived and arrested the suspect. <b>Arrest made.</b>
6/28	4:30am	<b>Robbery, With Gun 600 BLK of Filbert</b>	An unknown suspect approached the victim and pointed a gun at her face. The suspect demanded the victim's property. Fearing for her safety, the victim gave the suspect her property. The suspect got into a vehicle and fled the scene.
6/28	1:00pm	<b>Robbery, With Force Grant/Clay</b>	An unknown suspect approached the victim from behind and grabbed her cell phone. The victim had a firm grip on the phone, so the suspect was not able to take it. The suspect then grabbed her wrist and pulled the phone from her hand. The suspect then fled the scene.
6/28	7:40pm	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force 100 BLK of Powell</b>	Five unknown suspects entered the store and stole merchandise. Security chased after the suspects outside of the store. They were able to grab one of the suspects. The suspect began screaming for help and the other suspects returned. The suspects punched and pulled security away. All the suspects then fled the scene.
6/30	3:20am	<b>Robbery, With Force 300 BLK of Post</b>	The victim was sleeping in front of a store when an unknown suspect hit him in the face and stole his suitcases.
7/1	5:15am	<b>Robbery, With Force Powell/Bay</b>	An unknown suspect approached the victim and wrapped his arms around her. The suspect ripped a lanyard from around her neck and took her grocery bag. The suspect then fled the scene.

7/1	9:50pm	<b>Robbery, Commercial, With Force</b> 300 BLK of Jefferson	The suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect and the suspect pushed the employee. The suspect exited the store, but was arrested by officers. <b>Arrest made.</b>

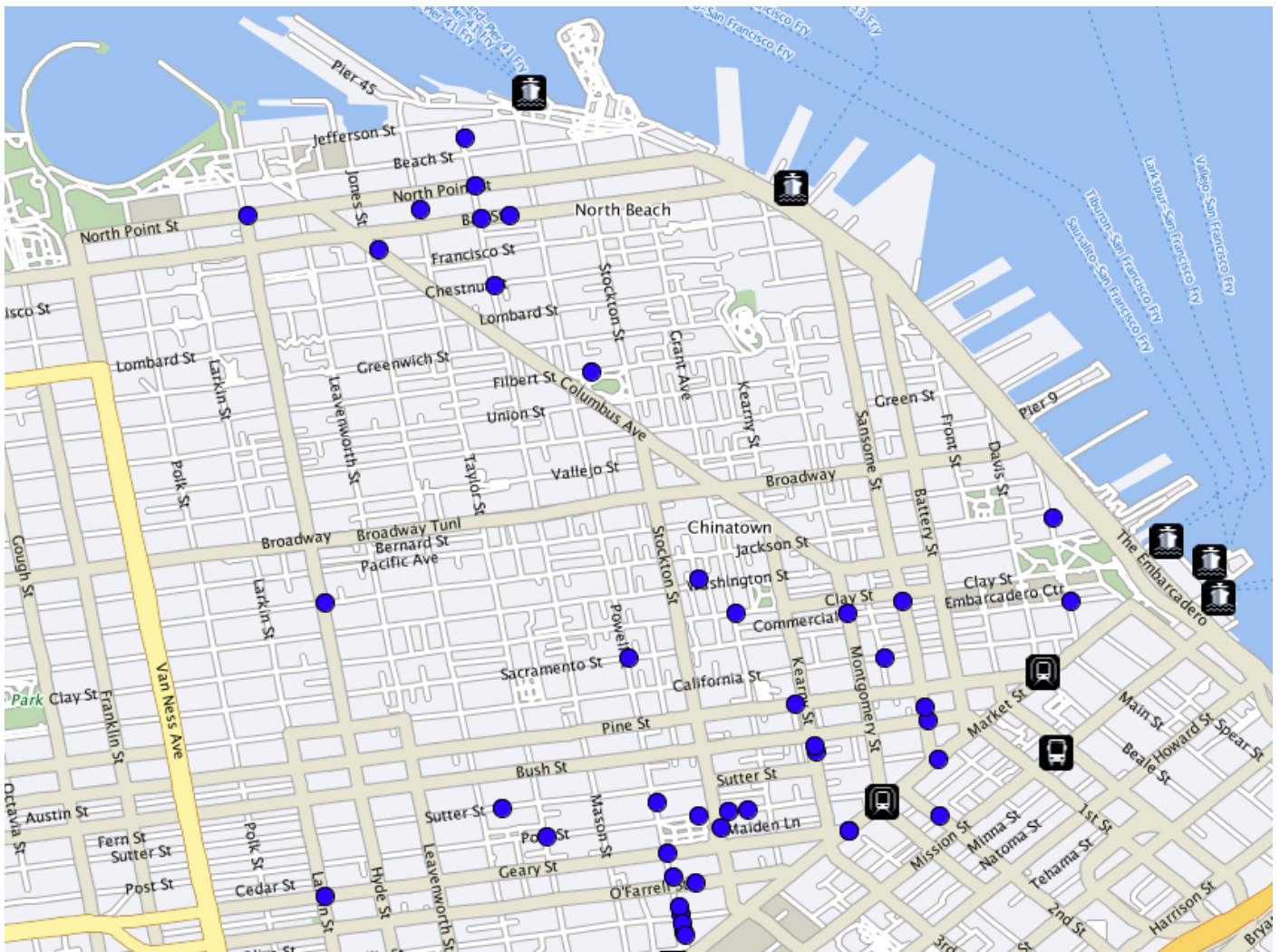

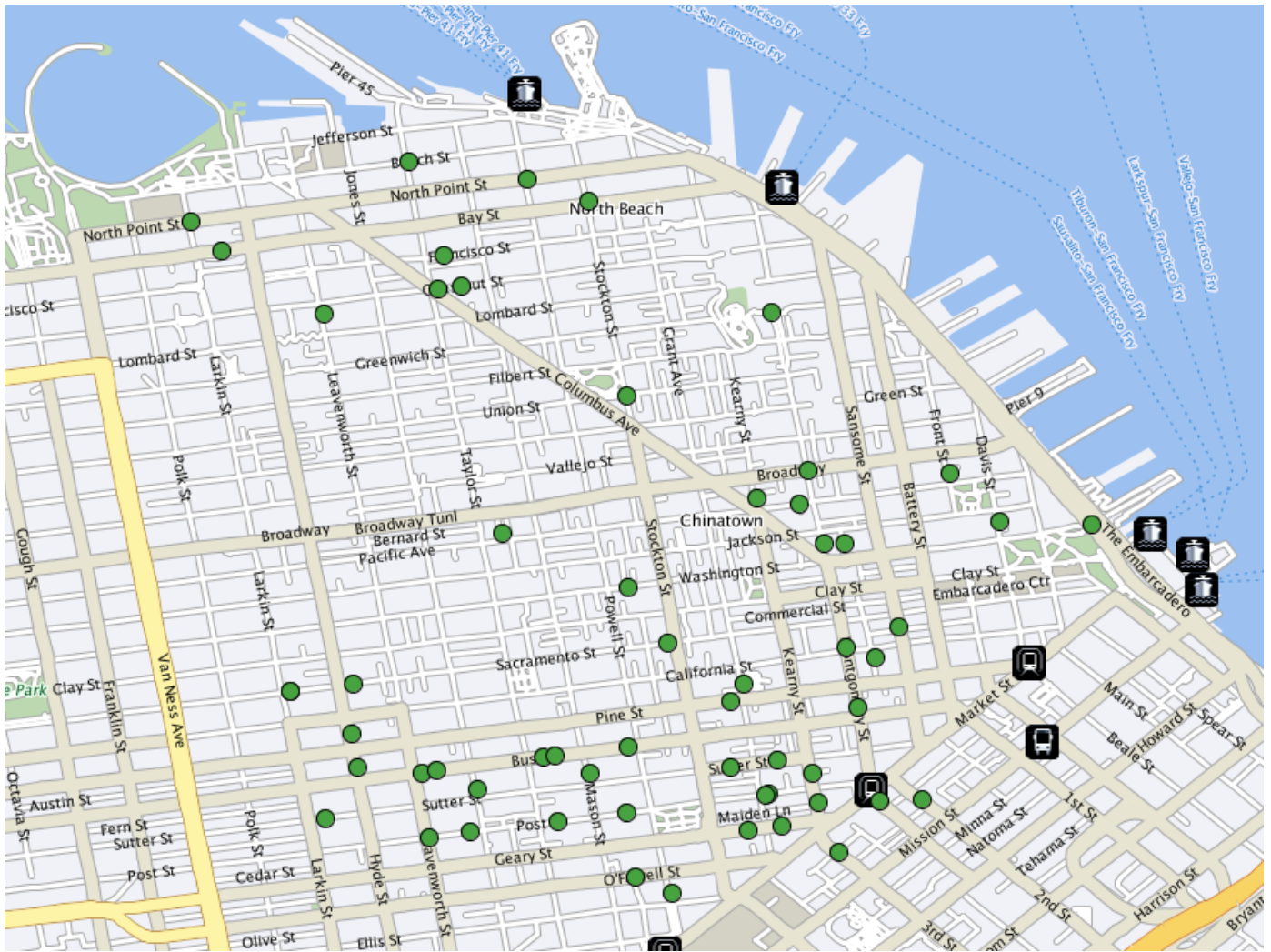

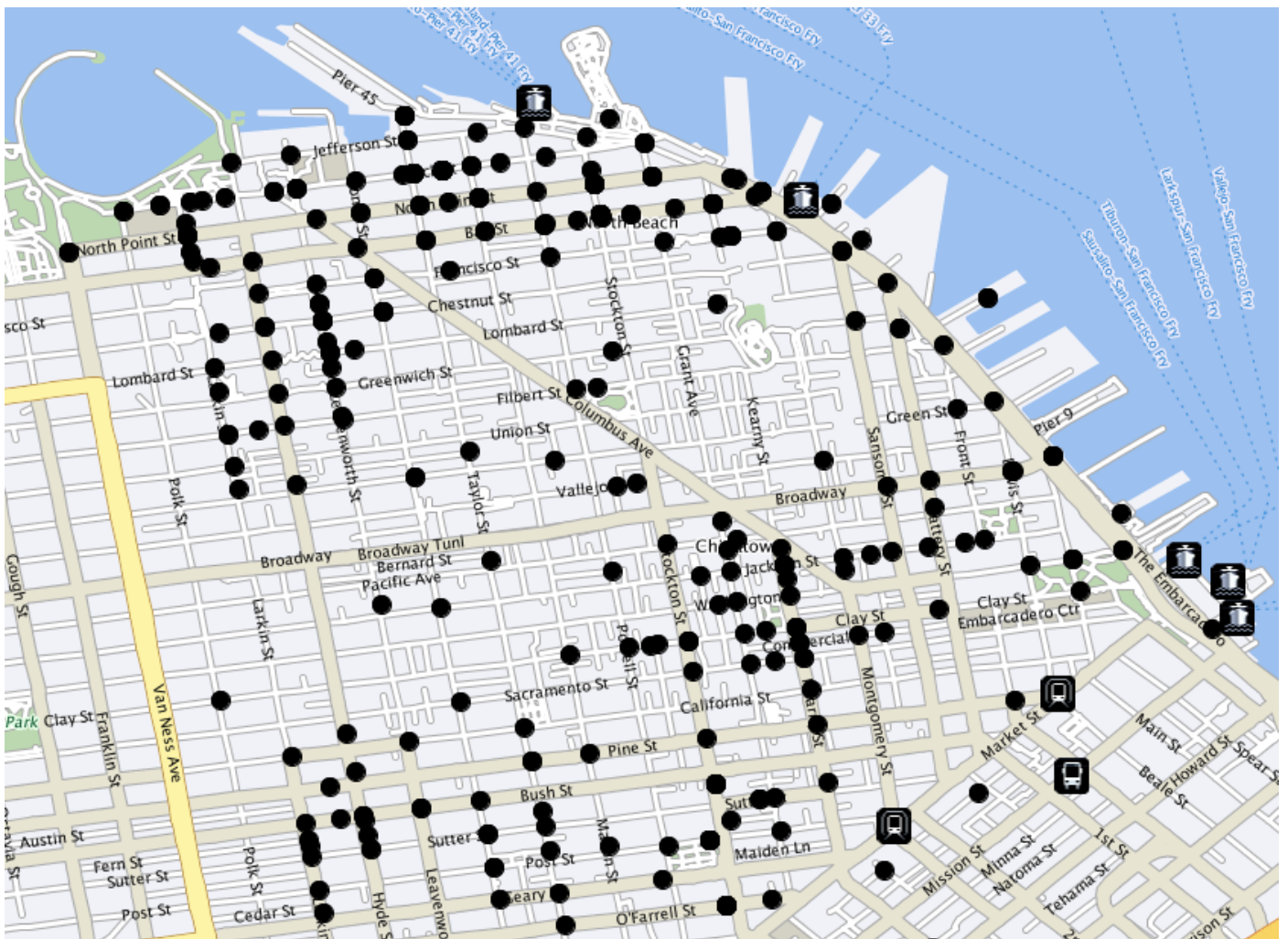

## Incidents of Note

### **Robbery, with Force**

6/21/18 0537 hrs

Sacramento/Drumm Streets

Uniformed officers responded to 50 Drumm Street on reports of a robbery. Officers arrived on scene and detained the suspect who matched the description provided by dispatch. A computer query revealed the suspect to have a no bail warrant. Officers made contact with the victim who positively identified the suspect. Officers learned the suspect forcefully grabbed the victim's wallet from her hands and took a \$10 bill from the wallet before handing the wallet back to her. The victim felt intimidated by the suspect. A \$10 bill was recovered from the suspect during an arrest search. A computer query revealed the suspect to be on probation. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

### **Assault, Aggravated, with Force**

6/21/18 1858 hrs

Powell/Geary Streets

Uniformed officers responded to Geary and Powell Streets regarding a battery. Officers arrived on scene and observed the victim who was conscious but confused in an ambulance before he was transported for further medical treatment. Officers met with a witness who took cell phone video of the incident. The witness told officers that the victim was in a verbal altercation with three males. One of the males walked away from the victim but returned from behind while the victim was still in the altercation with the other males. The suspect walked behind the victim delivered one punch to the back of the victim's head, causing the victim to fall to the ground and lose consciousness. The suspect and his friends fled the scene on foot. A crime bulletin was issued for the incident.

On 6/24/18, uniformed officers in Hallidae Plaza recognized the suspect from the crime bulletin. The officers stopped the suspect and placed him under arrest. The suspect was Mirandized and interviewed about the incident. The suspect admitted to being the person involved in the incident during the interview. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

### **Burglary, Vehicle**

6/23/18 1300 hrs

2200 BLK of Stockton St

Uniformed and plainclothes officers responded to a parking garage for reports of an auto boosting that just occurred. Officers arrived on scene and observed a suspect head towards the stairwell of the parking garage. A short foot chase began and the suspect was taken into custody a short distance away without further incident. Discarded property was located and recovered in the stairwell the suspect had been seen exiting the parking garage from. A total of five vehicles were observed with broken windows in the parking garage. The property located on the stairwell was recovered by officers and transported to Central Station. Several pieces of stolen property were recovered from the suspect during an arrest search. Victims responded to Central Station where they identified the property recovered as belonging to them. A computer query revealed the suspect to be on probation out of San Francisco for burglary. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

**Firearm, Possession by Prohibited Person**

6/24/18 1602 hrs

California/Kearny Streets

Uniformed officers responded to reports of a person in a vehicle with a firearm, who had been involved in a hit & run vehicle collision. Officers located the driver and the vehicle in the area and waited for more officers to respond to their location. Officers conducted a felony traffic stop and detained the suspect without further incident. The victim of the hit & run arrived on scene and positively identified the suspect. The victim explained to the officers that after the vehicle collision, they went to exchange information with the suspect. The suspect then brandished a firearm at the victim and fled the scene in the vehicle. A computer query revealed the suspect to be on probation out of San Francisco for carrying a concealed firearm. Officers located and seized a semiautomatic pistol with an extended magazine on the backside of the passenger seat of the vehicle. The firearm was reported stolen out of Marin County. Officers observed signs of intoxication on the suspect. The suspect refused to participate in a chemical test to determine if he had been driving under the influence. A search warrant for a forced blood draw was prepared and approved by a judge. The blood draw was performed by a phlebotomist at Mission Station. The suspect's vehicle was towed to the CSI lot for processing. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

**Burglary, Other Building, Unlawful Entry**

6/26/18 1027 hrs

100 BLK of Powell Street

On 6/26/18, a uniformed foot beat officer was flagged down by a Walgreen store employee who wanted to report a theft from the store on 6/19/18. The officer obtained the information for the theft and shortly after obtaining the information, the employee observed one of the suspects from the theft walk by. The officer detained the suspect without further incident. From information from the store employee as well as crime bulletins, the officer was able to connect the suspect to eight total theft cases from Walgreen store and similar stores for theft of toiletries. A computer query revealed the suspect to be on parole and probation out of San Francisco. The suspect was mirandized and interviewed. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

**Burglary, Residence, Attempted Forcible Entry**

7/01/18 0224 hrs

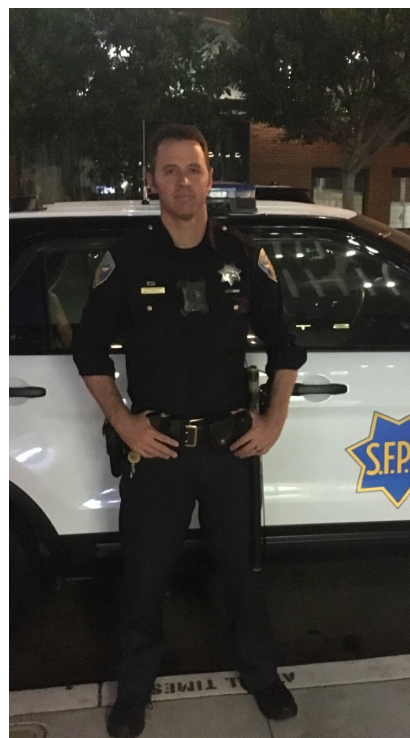
300 BLK of Vallejo Street

Uniformed officers responded to a report of a suspect in the area ringing door bells and trying door handles to residences. Officers made contact with a resident and learned they had observed the suspect inside of their locked security gate trying to gain access through their front door. As the officers were obtaining the information, the suspect walked by the residence again and was pointed out by the victim. The suspect was arrested without further incident. During an arrest search, suspected methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia were recovered from the suspect's person. A computer query revealed the suspect to have a warrant for his arrest out of San Francisco. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

# Featured Officer of the Month

## Officer Justin Leach

*Each month Central Police Station features one of its officers in an effort to learn more about the men and women who police our neighborhood. This month, we interviewed Officer Justin Leach, a 2-year member of Central Police Station.*



Officer Leach was born in Marin at Marin General Hospital. He graduated from Casa Grande High School in Petaluma and went on to attend college at University of New Mexico Highlands where he received a degree in Kinesiology.

## Definition of Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles to locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/ or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

## Definition of Community Policing

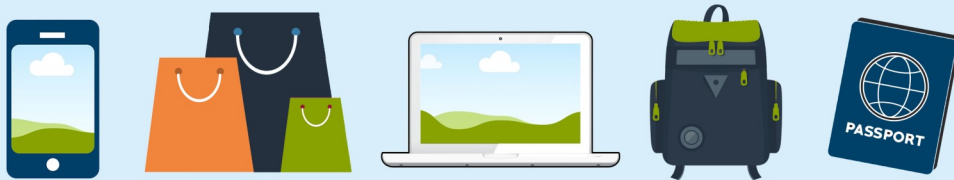
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

- Homeless Outreach and Outreach to Drug Users: Central Station officers coordinate with city agencies to provide outreach and assistance to rehabilitate those who are dependent on illegal drugs and outreach to homeless individuals to connect them with resources and support.
- Foot Patrols: Central Station have beat officers assigned to Union Square, Fisherman's Wharf, Chinatown, North Beach and Market/Drumm area.
- Monthly Police Community Relations Meetings: Community Meetings are held continuously. Officers also attend meetings with merchants groups, business groups, development authorities and others. Concerns are voiced and addressed through problem solving.
- Email Updates: Central Station sends out newsletter updates to residents in the District that alerts residents of crime trends, upcoming community events, crime prevention tips, and information on how to contact officers at the District Station.

## Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.

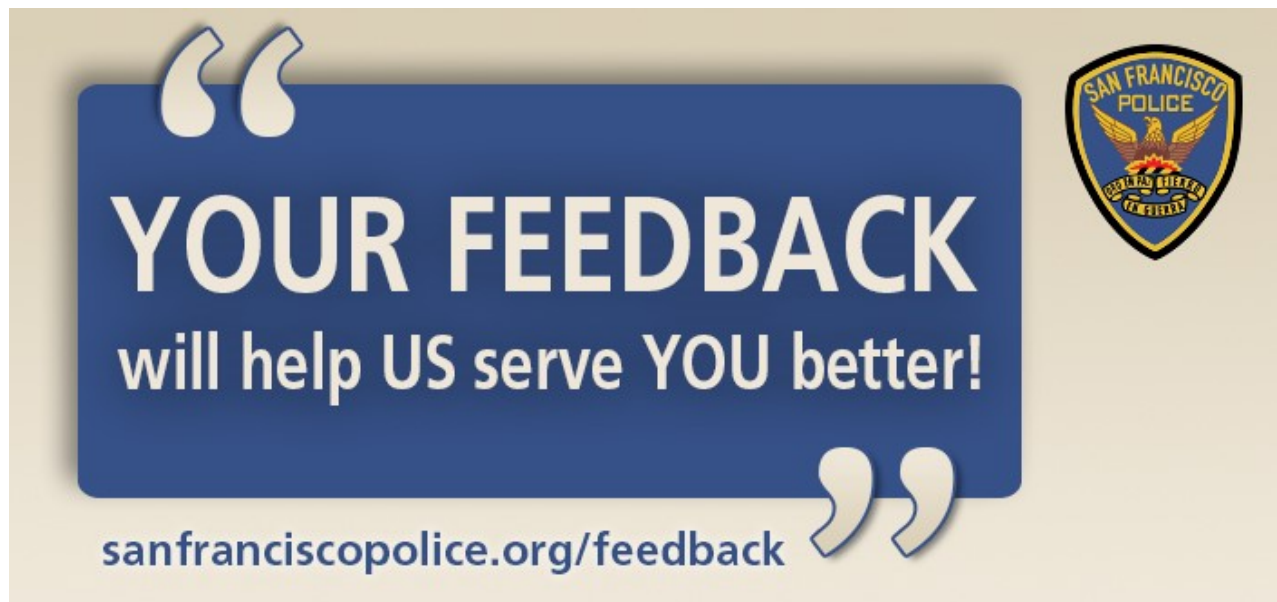
