Definition of Community Policing

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

- Homeless Outreach and Outreach to Drug Users: Ingleside Station officers coordinate with city agencies to provide outreach and assistance to rehabilitate those who are dependent on illegal drugs and outreach to homeless individuals to connect them with resources and support.
- Foot Patrols: Ingleside Station has foot beat officers assigned to the Geneva and Cortland corridors.
- Monthly Police Community Relations Meetings: Community Meetings are held continuously. Station personnel also attend meetings with merchants groups, business groups, development authorities and others. Concerns are voiced and addressed through problem solving.
- Email Updates: Ingleside Station sends out newsletter updates to residents in the District that alerts residents of crime trends, upcoming community events, crime prevention tips, and information on how to contact officers at the District Station.



Definition of Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

The following are some examples of Suspicious Activity that are “In progress” crimes, which demand an immediate call to 9-1-1:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try, and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/ or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or

Crime Definition

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery - (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

***Assault** is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.

Aggravated Assault – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Petty Theft – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.

The victim's granddaughter said her grandmother was sitting at a bus stop when a man, sitting next to her, grabbed her house keys and other property from her purse and ran away. The officers broadcast a description of the suspect and Ingleside Officers Dungca and Calupad found him a short time later sitting at Bayshore and Blanken. He had the victim's property with him. A confrontation between a passenger and the operator of MUNI bus prompted dispatch to send Ingleside Officers Marshall, Thomas, and Park to investigate. The driver, who refused medical attention, told the officers that the passenger was talking incoherently to other passengers on the bus. Ingleside Officers Trujillo and Lau were the first of several Ingleside officers to respond after a report of "shots fired" on the 100 block of Dublin Street. When they arrived they found bullet casings in the street and several gunshot holes in a home on the block. A search of the home found no casualties. Witnesses and nearby surveillance video showed two suspects in, what later turned out to be a stolen Honda Accord, driving past the home. One of the suspects was seen holding a firearm out the passenger window and firing three shots at the residence. Later that afternoon, Ingleside Officers Lee, Barajas, and Seavey located another vehicle involved in the shooting at Turk and Jones Street. The officers arrested the occupant of the vehicle and confiscated ammunition matching the ammunition casings found on Dublin Street. Report number: 180165271

Witnesses, driving past the Balboa Park BART Station, called police to report two, possibly, three men attacking a pedestrian near the north on-ramp to Highway #280. Ingleside Officers Leung and Zandanel were the first to arrive and found the victim with a knife wound to his hand. He said he was walking south on Geneva when an unknown subject walked up to him holding a knife. The suspect tried to stab the victim while grabbing the victim's cellphone from his pocket. The victim tried to ward off the attack with his hand. Once the suspect gained control of the victim's property he ran to a waiting vehicle, occupied by two other men, and sped away. A cashed \$5000 tax refund check. A picture of the tax recipient holding the cash on a social network site. Then a shooting and a serious gunshot wound. That was three acts of a tragic play on the 1700 block of Felton. The victim, after posting the pictures, was sitting in his car parked in front of his home. Suspects, driving a Green Audi, pulled up and fired three shots at the victim who was able to bail out of his car and ran into his home bleeding profusely from a gunshot wound to his right arm. He was driven to the hospital by his wife where surgeons quickly saved his life. Report number: 180160817

5:13pm Mission & Valencia Aggravated Assault

Ingleside Officers Quinlan and Freed were flagged down by pedestrians who said there was a man bleeding on the #14Muni bus stopped at the corner. Inside the officers found a victim sitting in the back of the bus bleeding from his nose and lips. The officers summoned medical help. Witnesses said the passenger got into a verbal dispute with two other passengers who suddenly punched him in the face before exiting the bus. Report number: 180161423

A man walking home from the store was suddenly attacked by two suspects. 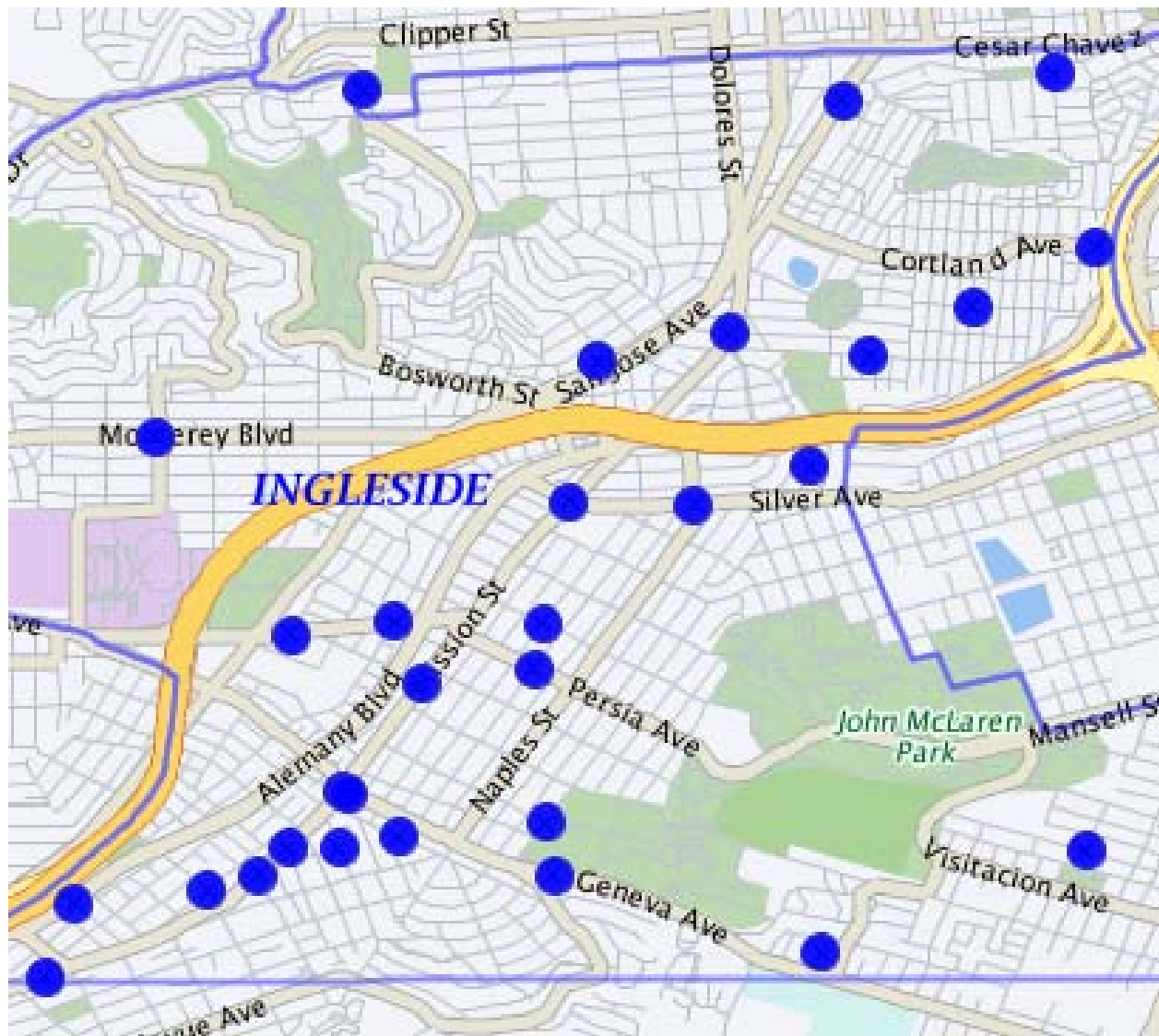

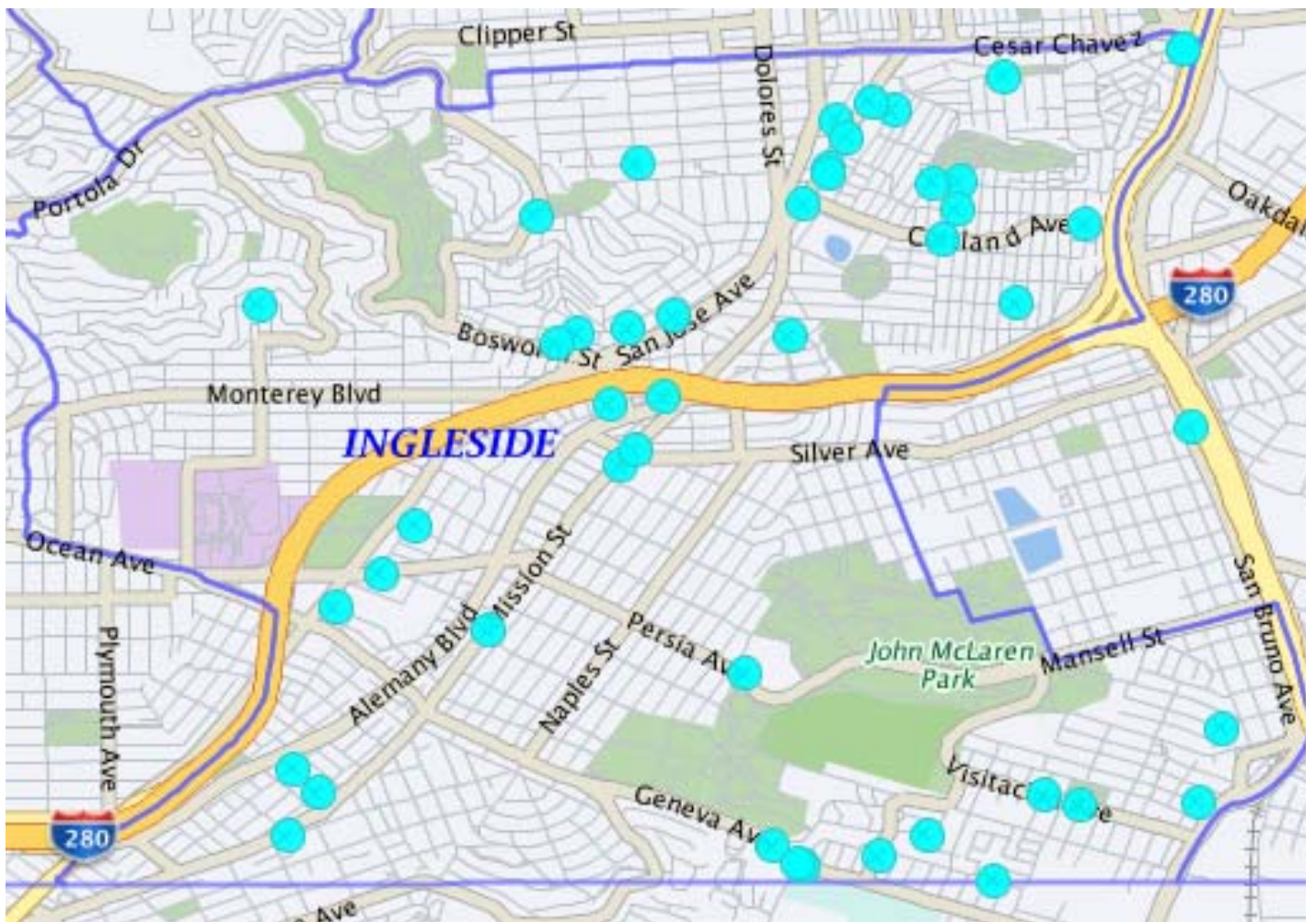

San Francisco Police Department Releases 2017 Year-End Crime Statistics

Data shows decrease in homicides, shooting incidents, burglaries and auto thefts

The San Francisco Police Department today released its 2017 crime data as reported to the FBI through the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. The data indicates that while Part I crimes increased 11.8 percent in 2017,

- Homicides decreased 3.4 percent
- Homicides by firearms decreased 5 percent
- Non-fatal shooting incidents decreased 15.8 percent
- Human trafficking decreased 32.6 percent
- Assaults against SFPD police officers decreased 4 percent compared to 2016

Through enforcement efforts, the SFPD seized 1,023 firearms in 2017 and collected 275 guns during buyback events, a 29.7 percent increase over 2016.

"Reducing violent crime is and will always be our top priority," said Police Chief William Scott. "We're working closely with community members and our City partners to reduce gun related violence. Protecting lives and providing safety for the public- particularly our youth- is key to ensuring a vibrant future for everyone."

UCR data shows San Francisco and neighboring Bay Area cities experienced a rise in property crimes during the first six months of 2017. San Francisco saw a 24 percent increase in thefts from vehicles last year.

To address these types of crimes, SFPD in 2017 doubled its citywide uniformed foot patrols to deter street crime and focus on neighborhood quality of life issues. Last November, the department created a General Crimes Unit to address serial residential and commercial burglaries, auto break-ins, bicycle thefts and other neighborhood property crimes. In January, 2018, SFPD command staff assigned district

station officers to work directly with community members on crime trends, education and prevention strategies.

Last year, San Francisco police officers booked or cited 790 people for thefts from vehicles. The 2017-2018 data shows a downward trend in auto burglaries, auto thefts and burglaries:

- Auto burglaries decreased 11 percent citywide between November 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017
- Auto burglaries decreased 5 percent citywide between December 1, 2017 and January 31, 2018
- Auto thefts decreased 11 percent in 2017
- Burglaries decreased .8 percent in 2017

"We take these crimes seriously and are allocating our resources toward deterrence and investigations," said Chief Scott. "By collaborating with community members, San Francisco businesses and law enforcement partner agencies, we can address crime through education, prevention and the effective investigation and prosecution of criminals."

The UCR program counts crimes when they become known to the police. A series of 13 reports are submitted to the California Department of Justice each month; CA DOJ in turn reports this data to the FBI. Crime incidents, values of stolen and recovered property values, homicide information, crimes against seniors, hate crimes and domestic violence incidents are some of the summary reports submitted each month to CA DOJ. The submittal deadline is the 10th of the month following the close of the month.

The UCR program is considered a "snapshot of crime" reported in one month. Crime is counted based upon a hierarchical rule following FBI definitions and guidelines, so that

all jurisdictions participating in the UCR program follow the same rules. Figures are only updated twice annually.

The San Francisco Police Department also produces a monthly CompStat profile, which often includes additional crimes which have been reported after the UCR submittal deadline. CompStat focuses on crimes which have occurred during the month, an important distinction from the UCR standard. These profiles provide a more up-to-date picture of crime in San Francisco, and are used to better evaluate crime fighting strategies and deployment efforts. CompStat reports are posted on our website at sanfranciscopolice.org/compstatreports.

The 2017 UCR year-end crime statistics accompany this news release and are also available on the CompStat webpage. For more information about the UCR program, please visit ucr.fbi.gov/word.

San Francisco Police Arrest Armed Robbery Suspects

On January 2nd at approximately 10:50 PM, San Francisco Police responded to the 100 block of Powell Street regarding a robbery of a convenience store. In this incident, a masked and gloved armed suspect entered the store, went directly to the manager's office, and demanded money from an employee. The suspect fled to a waiting vehicle, driving away with over \$21,000 in cash.

The SFPD Night Investigations Unit (NIU) responded out to the scene to conduct an investigation, and were able to secure valuable video surveillance and witness statements. Leads were generated, and investigators assigned to the SFPD Robbery Unit were able to identify three suspects. Based on evidence obtained, arrest warrants for all three suspects were issued.

The investigation revealed that two employees who were present at the time of the robbery were actually involved in the commission of the crime. On January 6, 2018, the following suspects were taken into custody without incident:

Anthony Sherwood, 21 years old, Daly City resident, arrested and booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of grand theft, first degree burglary, conspiracy, embezzlement, and misdemeanor making a false report of a crime.

Lionel De Leon, 26 years old, San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of grand theft, first degree burglary, conspiracy, embezzlement, and misdemeanor making a false report of a crime.

As the third suspect involved was believed to have fled the state, SFPD's Special Investigations Division became involved. On February 20, 2018, Dezmond Tayeh, 24 years old, San Francisco resident, was taken into custody without incident and booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of grand theft, second degree burglary, and conspiracy.

Due to pending investigatory matters, booking photos are not available at this time.

Homicide Investigation Leads to Officer Involved Shooting

On Friday, February 16, 2018 at approximately 6:28PM, SFPD officers responded to a shooting homicide at Oak and Stanyan Streets. Two adult males were shot and one died from his injuries.

Following that incident, a silver Toyota 4 Runner was taken in a carjacking. Through the course of an investigation, it was determined that the Toyota was stolen by the homicide suspect. The SFPD Homicide Detail issued a crime alert listing the suspect and vehicle description.

On Saturday, February 17, 2018 at approximately 12:13 AM, uniformed SFPD officers in a marked vehicle located the stolen Toyota on Alameda Street near De Haro Street. The Toyota was unoccupied and parked behind a recreational vehicle. Officers determined that the RV was occupied and contacted the occupants to conduct a wellbeing check. Multiple persons exited the RV. Officers determined that one person remained inside the vehicle.

Officers made contact with the subject who remained in the RV and an officer involved shooting occurred.

The officers established a perimeter and requested the Tactical Unit and Crisis/Hostage Negotiation Team. The occupant of the RV did not respond to officers' orders to exit the vehicle.

At approximately 2:20AM, the occupant exited the RV and was taken into custody. He was taken to a hospital for evaluation.

At approximately 3:05AM, the SFPD Tactical Unit determined that there were no additional occupants in the RV.

The occupant from the RV is the person of interest in the homicide and carjacking from the earlier incident at Oak Street and Stanyan Street. Following an evaluation at the hospital, he was taken to the SFPD Homicide Detail for an interview. No one involved was injured by gunfire in the officer involved shooting incident.

This is an active and ongoing investigation in the early stages. Investigations are being conducted by the SFPD Homicide Detail, the SF District Attorney's Office, the Department of Police Accountability and the SFPD Internal Affairs Unit.

Additional information will be released as it becomes available. As part of our commitment towards transparency and accountability, a town hall meeting regarding the officer involved shooting will be held within ten days.

San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Shotgun Robbery Series

On February 18, 2018, at approximately 7:19 PM, San Francisco Police officers from Park Station responded to a market on the 4100 block of 17th Street regarding a robbery. Upon arrival, the victim, a 28 year-old male told the officers that a suspect armed with a shotgun confronted him at the entry to the market. The suspect demanded money and the victim, fearing for his life, walked into the store and opened the cash register. The suspect grabbed US currency from the till and fled the scene in a gold colored sedan driven by another suspect. Officers searched for the suspects and vehicle but were unable to locate them.

On February 20, 2018 at approximately 10:27 PM, San Francisco Police Officers from Ingleside Station responded to a store on the 5500 block of Mission Street regarding a man with a gun. Upon arrival, officers learned that the suspect had fled the scene. The victim, a 41 year-old female told the officers that the suspect entered the store, pointed a handgun at her and demanded money. The clerk opened the cash register. The suspect grabbed US currency from the register and fled the scene east bound on Guttenberg Street. Officers searched the area but were unable to locate the suspect. The Night Investigations Unit assumed the investigation and the scene was processed by the Crime Scene Investigation Unit.

On February 24, 2018 at approximately 9:18 PM, SFPD officers from Ingleside Station responded to a store on the 600 block of Monterey Boulevard regarding a robbery. Upon arrival the victim, a 35 year-old male told them that he was working in the store when the suspect entered and demanded money. The victim looked up and saw the suspect pointing a shotgun at him. The victim backed away from the register and the suspect grabbed US currency before fleeing the store. Officers recognized the suspect's description as being similar to the suspect listed in a crime alert for prior robberies. The SFPD Night Investigation Unit responded and assumed the case.

Believing that the same suspect was responsible for a series of brazen armed robberies involving a shotgun, the SFPD Investigations Bureau worked diligently to identify the suspect. Through the course of that investigation, the Department's Robbery Detail identified the suspect, Michael Sweets, a 47 year-old resident of Oakley.

On February 27, 2018 at approximately 2:20 PM, SFPD Investigators located Sweets in Fairfield. Sweets was in a gold colored sedan that stopped at a store on the 700 block of 5th Street. San Francisco Police seized the opportunity to arrest Sweets when he exited the sedan. Officers took Sweets into custody without incident. He was later transported to San Francisco and booked into the County Jail on multiple counts of robbery, multiple counts of being a felon in possession of a firearm, kidnapping and a parole violation. His booking photo accompanies this news release. The gold sedan was towed and other evidence was seized as part of the investigation.

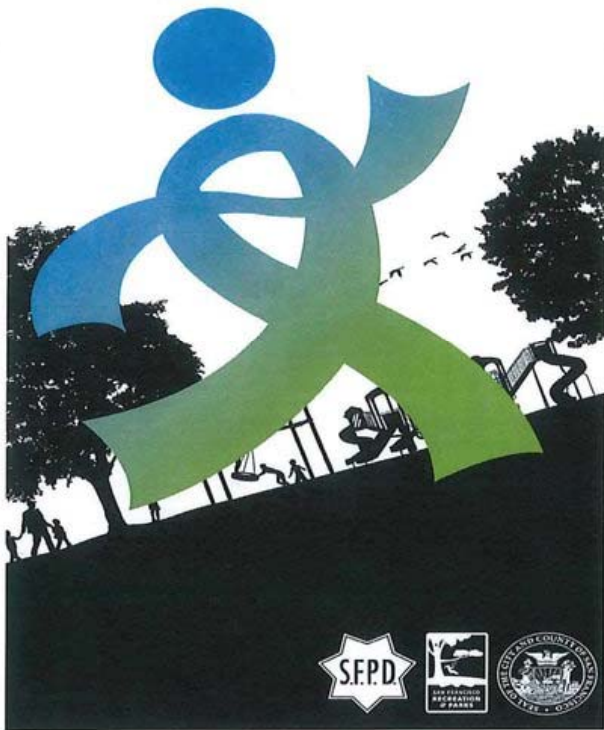

Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.
