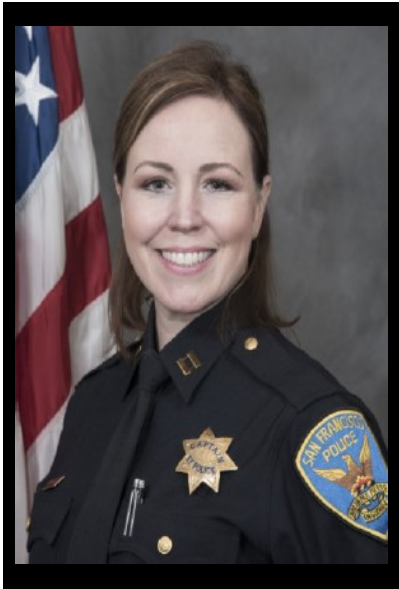

DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ♦ An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ♦ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- ♦ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITION OF COMMUNITY POLICING

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

Homeless Outreach: Richmond Station Officers coordinate with city agencies to provide assistance and offer City services as needed. The Officers handle quality of life issues and find programs for willing individuals.

Foot Patrol: Richmond Station has dedicated foot patrols on Clement St., Geary Blvd, Golden Gate Park as well as the Cliff House.

Richmond Station Community Meetings: Community Meetings are held once a month for the public and residents of the Richmond District to attend. People can voice their comments or concerns about issues in the Richmond District.



Definitions

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

****Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. ****

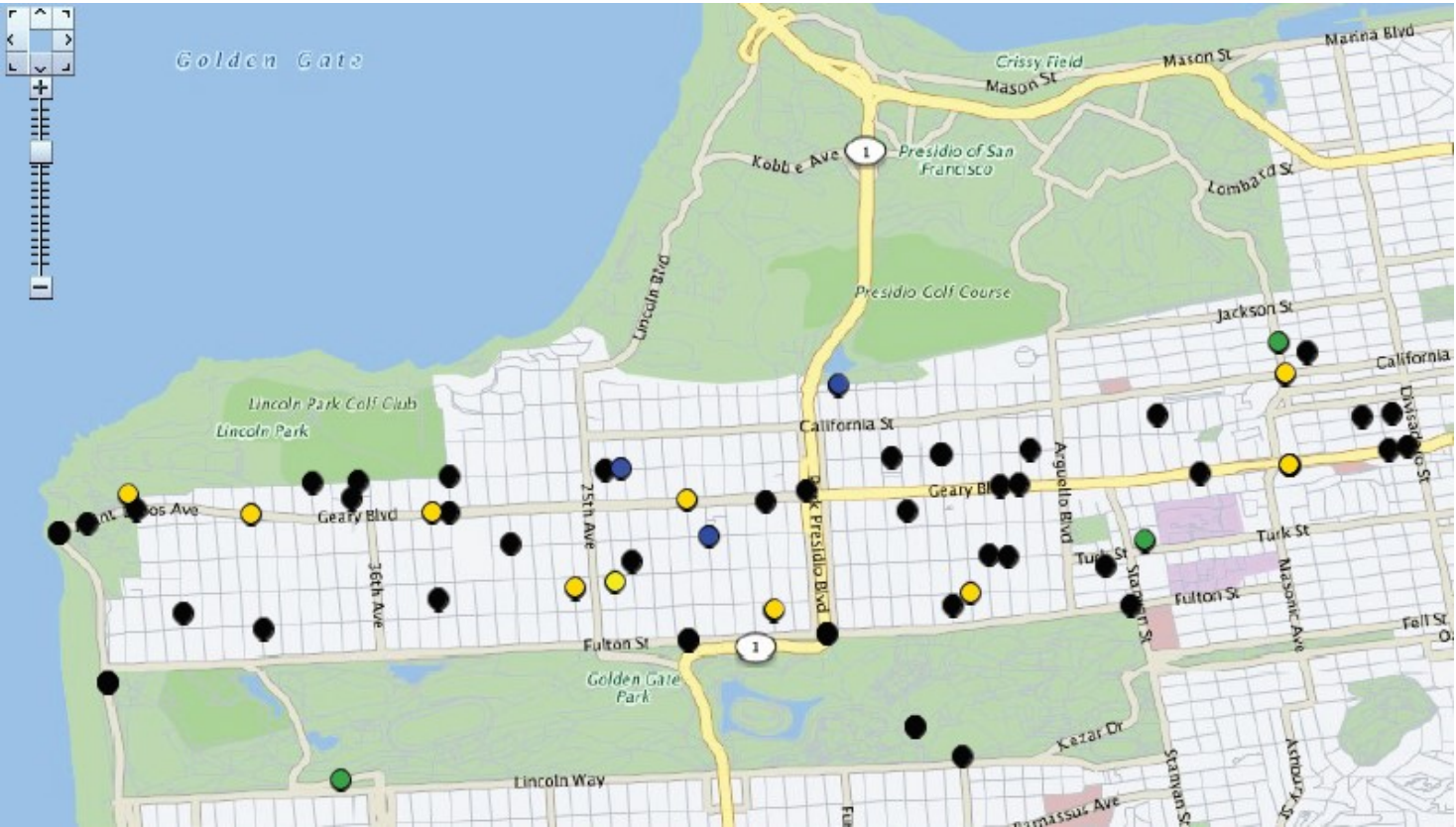
Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Burglary, Vehicle (Arrest) **03/13/18 1500 hours** **34th Ave & Anza St**

At 1500 hours, Plainclothes Officers were conducting auto burglary surveillance. Officers spotted a vehicle matching the description of a auto break-in suspect vehicle seen earlier in the day at the Legion of Honor . The driver of the vehicle also matched the description from earlier calls.

Officers followed the vehicle for several blocks and eventually where able to take the

suspect into custody without incident.

Further investigation revealed the vehicle was the suspect vehicle in numerous auto break-ins, that occurred earlier in the day, in the Central District.

Glass shards and a wide variety of miscellaneous items, clothing and backpacks were present in the back of the vehicle.

Officers from several district stations provided information leading to the identification of the vehicle and

eventual arrest of the suspect driver. Great city wide team work!

The suspect was booked into County Jail 1 for the following charges: Second degree Burglary, Probation Violation, and Violation of a Court Order.

Robbery, W/Knife, Terrorist Threats, Weapon, Deadly Exhibiting (Arrest) **03/18/2018 2000 hours** **2200 block Clement St.**

The suspect arrived at a restaurant and ordered drinks and food. When the bill was presented by the victim, the suspect refused to pay and picked up a knife. The suspect stood up and walked toward the victim who was backing away. The suspect stated to the victim "I'm go-

ing to kill you" as he walked toward the victim, knife in hand.

The suspect then fled the building. The victim was able to provide a description and last direction of travel to arriving Officers. The suspect was detained by Officers a few blocks away with the knife in his possession.

The suspect was identified by the victim. The suspect was booked at County Jail 1 on the following charges:

Robbery with a Knife, Exhibiting a Deadly Weapon, Terrorist Treats, and Defrauding Providers of Food.



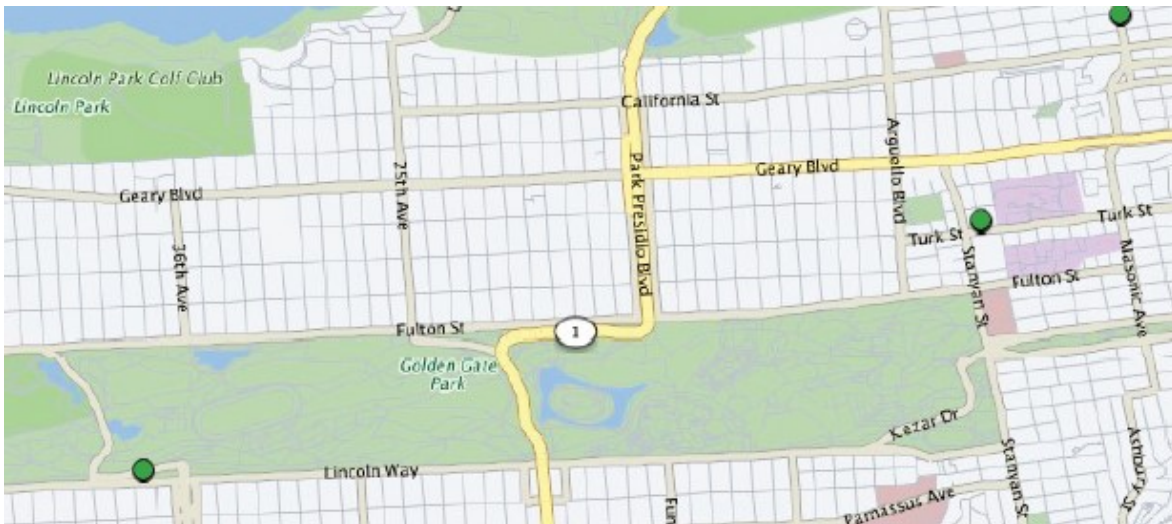

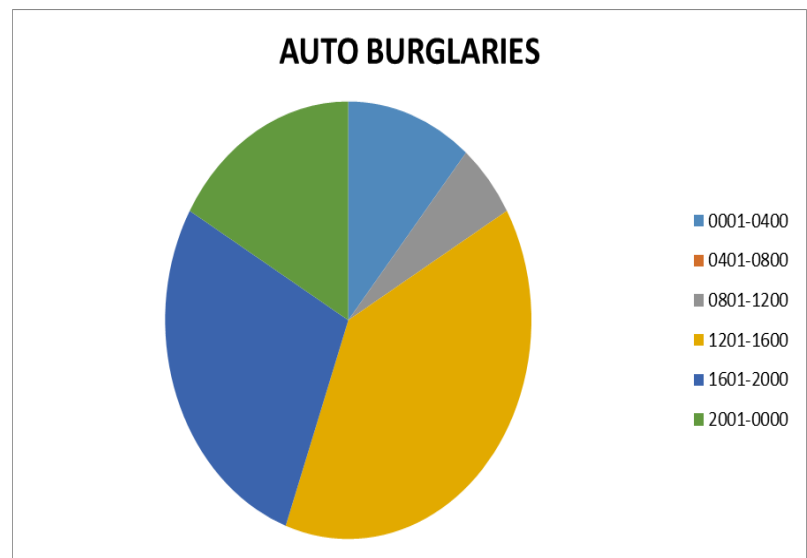

The above pie chart represents the time of day auto boosts occur.



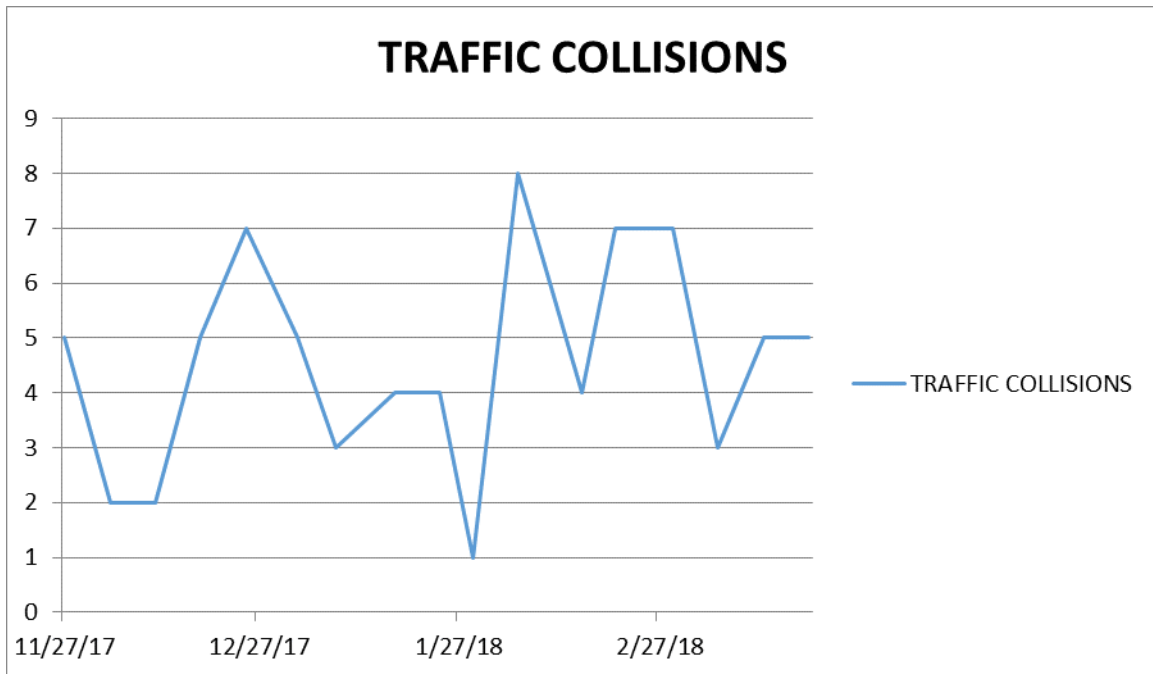

Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.

SFPD OFFICERS TO TAKE SAN FRANCISCO TEENS TO AFRICA

On Thursday, March 22nd, 10 African-American high school students from San Francisco's Bayview and Western Addition communities and three San Francisco Police Department officers will embark on a nine-day trip to Accra, Ghana. The Operation Genesis program aims to instill a sense of self-discovery in the teenagers as they learn the history of their African ancestors, meet local youth and learn about the differences between life in Africa and the United States.

Officer Jason Johnson- a ten year veteran of the San Francisco Police Department who is assigned to the Community Engagement Division created Operation Genesis in hopes of making education a pivotal point in the lives of youth. Students have spent weeks studying Ghana culture and raising money for the trip. As in previous years, the students will bring books and gently used clothing for their younger counterparts in Ghana.

This is the fifth year of a program that previous participants have described as a life-changing experience. Documentaries on the 2014, 2015 and 2016 Operation Genesis trips to Ghana can be viewed on SFPD's YouTube website and on SFGovTV. This year's trip can be followed via Twitter at @op_genesis. SFPD Make Arrests Commercial Robbery Investigation, Seeking Three Outstanding Suspects

On February 6, 2018, nine suspects entered a high-end fashion establishment on the 100 block of Geary Street in San Francisco. Within seconds, the suspects selected over twenty (20) handbags and wallets from the display area and attempted to flee the store. An employee recognized the snatch and grab tactics of the group, immediately ran to the point of entry/exit, and attempted to close the door in an effort to prevent the loss of merchandise. The employee's attempt at preventing their escape was unsuccessful. He was rushed by the group, and overwhelmed with such force that he sustained an injury to his knee. The assailants fled with over \$48,000.00 worth of merchandise.

An investigation into the incident was launched by SFPD's Robbery Detail. Utilizing the store's security surveillance system and other resources within in the Union Square area. Mission Station Housing Units and Gang Task Force arrested two of the wanted suspects. Arrest warrants were obtained, which led to the arrests of four additional suspects. The following individuals have been arrested in relation to this investigation:

Shanique Kyer, 25 years old, San Francisco resident, booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of robbery, grand theft, and a misdemeanor charge of providing false identification to a police officer. Kyer's booking photo accompanies this news release.

Sharome Jones, 21 years old, San Francisco resident, booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of robbery and grand theft. Jones' booking photo accompanies this news release.

Joshua Washington, 18 years old, San Francisco resident, booked into San Francisco County Jail on felony charges of robbery and grand theft. Washington's booking photo accompanies this news release.

Auto Burglaries in San Francisco Drop 31% Between January and February 2018 *SFPD Report Shows Double-Digit Decreases in All 10 Police Districts*

Data from the San Francisco Police Department's newly released February, 2018 CompStat Profile indicates significant progress in police efforts to curb vehicle burglaries in the city. The report shows that:

- Thefts from vehicles citywide decreased 31 percent in February, compared to January, 2018
- The city's ten police districts saw a decrease in auto burglaries ranging from 11 to 44 percent
- Year-to-date thefts from vehicles are down 15 percent

"The increased visibility of our officers and our efforts to educate the public through our Park Smart program are paying off," said San Francisco Police Chief William Scott. "While these numbers are encouraging, these crimes continue to impact too many residents and visitors to our city. There is still much work ahead. We will continue to use data to evaluate and adjust our strategies in order to effectively prevent and investigate auto burglaries."

San Francisco last year saw a 24 percent increase in thefts from vehicles compared to 2016. In response, the San Francisco Police Department doubled its citywide uniformed foot patrols to deter street crime and focus on neighborhood quality of life issues. Last November, the department created a General Crimes Unit to address serial residential and commercial burglaries, auto break-ins, bicycle thefts and other neighborhood property crimes. In January, 2018, SFPD command staff assigned district station officers to work directly with community members on crime trends, education and prevention strategies. Last year, San Francisco police officers booked or cited 790 people for thefts from vehicles.

Types of Crime Reports That Can Be Filed Online:

- **Harassing Phone Calls:** When you are experiencing annoying calls - with no known suspects; for example, hang-ups or heavy breathing.
- **Lost Property:** When property has disappeared and not stolen. If you think it could have been taken but you have no idea by who, you may enter the report online.
- **Theft:** When property is stolen but there has been no illegal entry or contact by the thief.
- **Vandalism/Graffiti:** The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property, including graffiti.
- **Vehicle Burglary:** When property was stolen from a vehicle.
- **Vehicle Tampering:** Tampering with a motor vehicle, including vandalism/graffiti of the vehicle.

Calling the Police:

Dispatchers ask questions in a particular order for a reason. It is best to stay calm and answer all questions to the best of your ability.

Complaint: **Location, Hazards (ie. weapons at scene), Victim info (sex, age, condition)**

Suspect Description: **Gender, Race, Age, Clothing, distinguishing features**

Vehicle Description: **Color, Make, Model, License Plate, distinguishing features**
