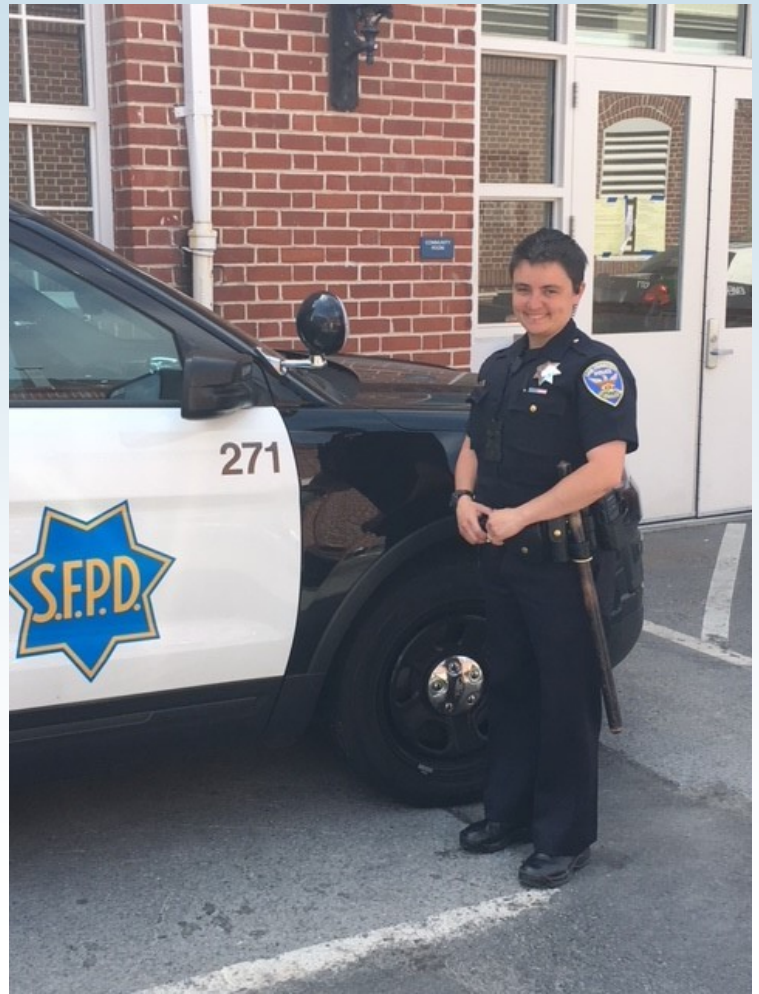
LAURA PRESLEY

DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ♦ **An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.**
- ♦ **An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.**
- ♦ **An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.**

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

****Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. ****

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.



DEFINITION OF COMMUNITY POLICING

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

Homeless Outreach: Richmond Station Officers coordinate with city agencies to provide assistance and offer City services as needed. The Officers handle quality of life issues and find programs for willing individuals.

Foot Patrol: Richmond Station has dedicated foot patrols on Clement St., Geary Blvd, Golden Gate Park as well as the Cliff House.

Richmond Station Community Meetings: Community Meetings are held once a month for the public and residents of the Richmond District to attend. People can voice their comments or concerns about issues in the Richmond District.



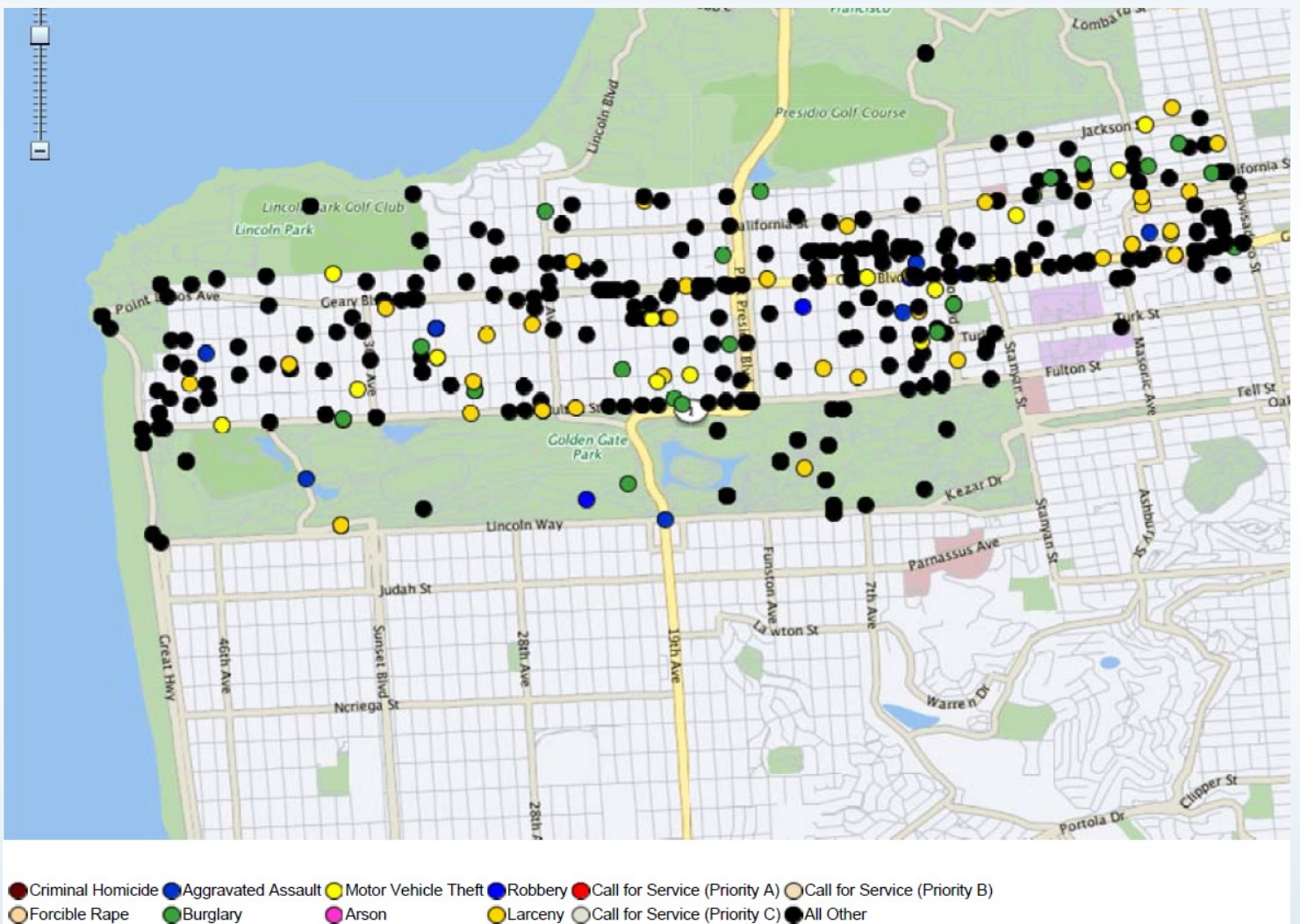
MAP OF CRIMES

**Aggravated Assault W/ Gun, Terrorist Threats, Exhibiting Deadly Weapon (Arrest)

The victim was in the common area of her mutli unit building when she was confronted by the suspect. The suspect then pointed a gun at the victim and stated "I will kill you both". The victim believed the suspect would kill her and ran back to her apartment and called police.

Police arrived and located the suspect who denied having a gun or confronting the victim. Additional witnesses where located and the suspect was placed under arrest. A search incident to arrest located several rounds of ammunition. A search warrant was obtained and officers located the gun and more ammunition.

The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Terrorist Threats, Assault w/ a Gun, Exhibiting a Deadly Weapon, Using a Firearm While Committing a Felony, Carrying a Loaded Firearm.

Plain clothes officers from Richmond Station were searching for the suspect in a stabbing that took place in the city last week. Investigators released the information in a crime bulletin and Officers went to the area they knew the suspect to frequent. Officers located and arrested the suspect without incident. The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Attempted Murder



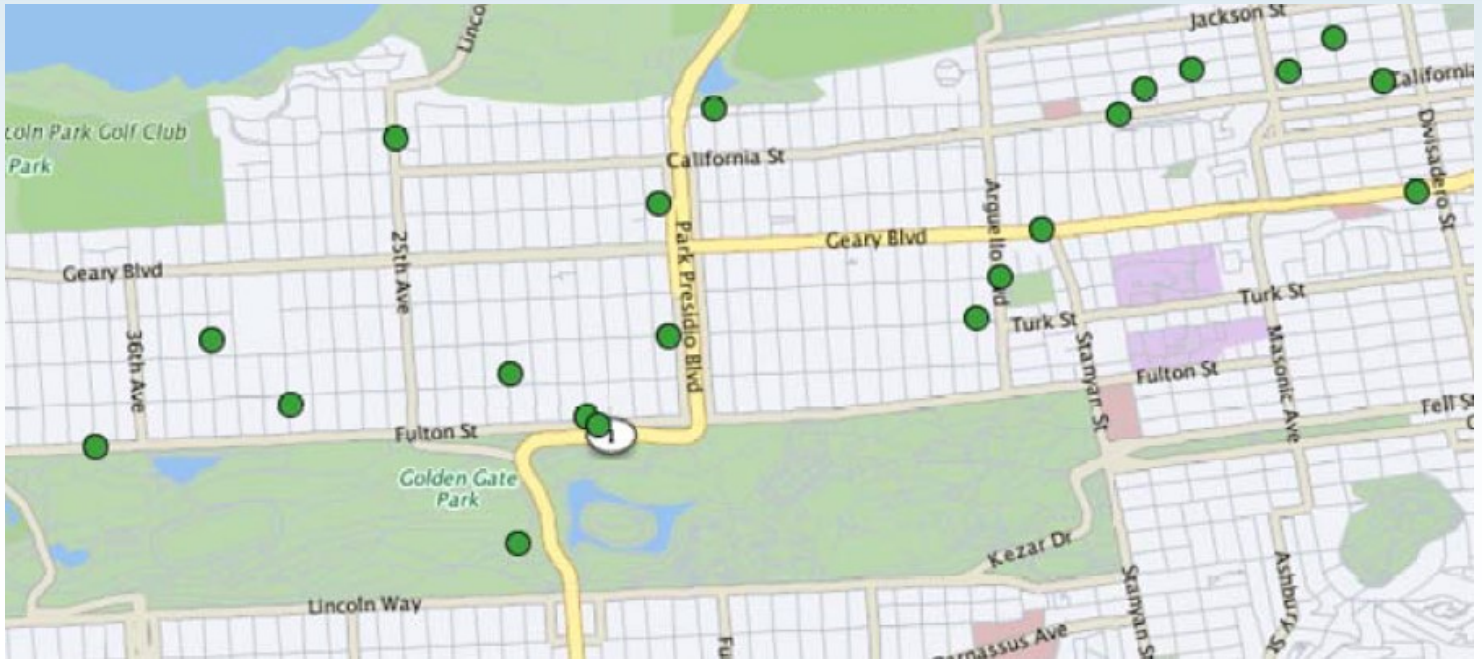

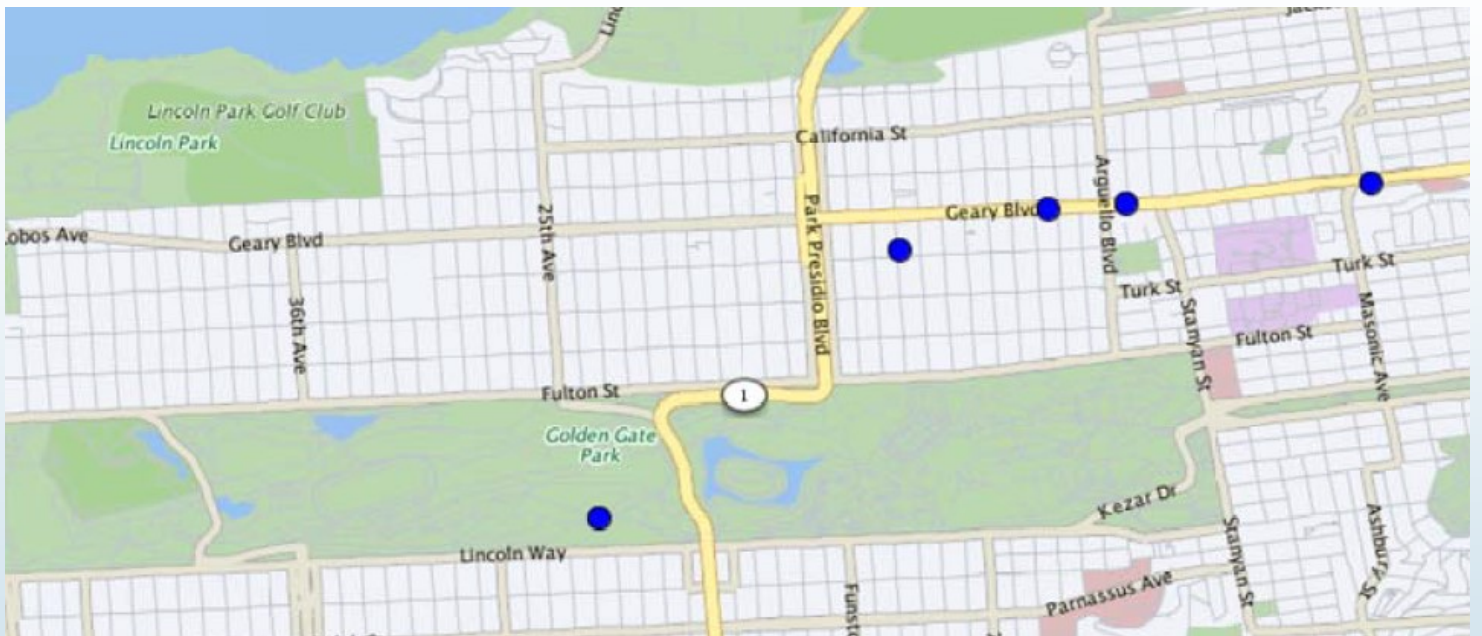

Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on June 12th, 20th, 22nd and 28th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these non-motorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Types of Crime Reports That Can Be Filed Online:

- **Harassing Phone Calls:** When you are experiencing annoying calls - with no known suspects; for example, hang-ups or heavy breathing.
- **Lost Property:** When property has disappeared and not stolen. If you think it could have been taken but you have no idea by who, you may enter the report online.
- **Theft:** When property is stolen but there has been no illegal entry or contact by the thief.
- **Vandalism/Graffiti:** The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property, including graffiti.
- **Vehicle Burglary:** When property was stolen from a vehicle.
- **Vehicle Tampering:** Tampering with a motor vehicle, including vandalism/graffiti of the vehicle.

Calling the Police:

Dispatchers ask questions in a particular order for a reason. It is best to stay calm and answer all questions to the best of your ability.

Complaint: **Location, Hazards (ie. weapons at scene), Victim info (sex, age, condition)**

Suspect Description: **Gender, Race, Age, Clothing, distinguishing features**

Vehicle Description: **Color, Make, Model, License Plate, distinguishing features**
