

CAPTAIN'S MESSAGE:

Hello Richmond District Residents:

San Francisco adopted Vision Zero in 2014 to build safer streets and eliminate traffic deaths. Pedestrians and cyclists are at a heightened risk of injury in speed-related crashes. Studies show that if a pedestrian is hit by a car traveling 40 mph there is an 80% chance the pedestrian will be killed, but if a driver strikes a pedestrian traveling 20 mph there is a 10% chance the pedestrian will be killed.

Most of the streets in the Richmond District have speed limits of 25 MPH. Slowing down could save someone's life. Stop at stop signs, red lights, and remember to yield to pedestrian in crosswalks. Lets all do our part to keep pedestrians safe.

DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily in jury.

** Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault—Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.


Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Roll Over Traffic Collision 07/08/2018 0512 Hours Cabrillo St/ 24th Ave

The vehicle was traveling westbound on Cabrillo St. when the driver fell asleep at the wheel and then crashed into two parked vehicles. The vehicle flipped over, pushed one of the parked cars into a tree, and rolled onto the top of the second vehicle. The driver was able to crawl out of the vehicle after the crash. Police and Fire arrived on the scene and transported the driver to the hospital.

Structure Fire 07/02/2018 0230 Hours Golden Gate Park Golf Course Club House

Police Officers and Fire Fighters responded to an alarm call at the location. The structure was on fire and required several Engines to extinguish the blaze. The structure is estimated to be a total loss. Arson investigators responded to the scene. This is an on going investigation.

Burglary, Probation Violation 07/07/2018 1620 Hours Walgreens 25 Point Lobos Ave

Store employees recognized a shoplifting suspect in the store shoplifting again and advised the suspect to leave. The suspect refused to leave and began taking more items from the store, and consumed some items before leaving with the stolen goods. Police arrived and detained the suspect and recovered some of the stolen items. A records check revealed the suspect was on felony probation for a similar offense.

The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Burglary, Probation Violation, Trespassing.







San Francisco Police Arrest Serial Armed Robbery Suspect

San Francisco Police have arrested a suspect in a series of armed commercial robberies that were primarily concentrated in the Market Street corridor. The first robbery occurred on the 600 block of Van Ness Avenue on May 1, 2018 at approximately 8:50PM. Over the next eight weeks, eleven other liquor stores, restaurants and other commercial establishments were targeted by the suspect.

Members of the Night Investigations Unit and Robbery Detail connected the cases by the distinctive appearance of the elderly suspect and his silver revolver. Investigators from the Robbery Detail coordinated with patrol and street crimes officers at the district stations in an attempt to locate and arrest the suspect before he could commit another robbery.

On June 29, 2018 at approximately 6:30PM, the suspect struck a final time (the 13th robbery of the series) on the 2300 block 16th Street. Patrol officers from Mission Station had been fully briefed on the series and quickly located the suspect and placed him under arrest near the intersection of 18th and Bryant Streets. A replica handgun was recovered from the suspect at the time of his arrest.

Lloyd Banks, a 64 year-old San Francisco resident, was arrested for all thirteen incidents and has been charged with 37 felonies stemming from the series of robberies. Due to pending identification matters, Banks' booking photo is not being released at this time.

San Francisco Police Arrest Suspect in Internet Crimes Against Children Investigation

In March 2018, the San Francisco Police Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Unit began an investigation into an individual who was uploading graphic child pornography to a file hosting website.

As the result of the investigation, the ICAC unit was able to identify the suspect as Robert Sudakow, a forty-four (44) year old San Francisco resident. Investigators found that Sudakow is a registered sex offender for a 2003 arrest in New York for sending harmful material to a minor.

On June 14, 2018, SFPD investigators executed a search warrant at his residence on the 1200 block of Harrison Street.

During the search warrant investigators located a media device belonging to Sudakow, which contained graphic child pornography videos and images.

Sudakow was arrested and booked into San Francisco County Jail for possession of child pornography, possession of child pornography as registered sex offender, and distribution of child pornography. His booking photo accompanies this news release.

San Francisco Police Arrest Armed Robbery Suspect

On June 24, 2018 at approximately 11:20 PM, San Francisco police officers assigned to Northern Station responded to a sandwich shop on the 2000 block of Van Ness Avenue regarding a robbery. Store employees told the officers that the suspect, who was armed with a handgun, robbed the store and fled the scene.

On June 27, 2018 at approximately 7:45 AM, officers responded to a robbery call at a business on the 1600 block of Vallejo Street. An employee told the officers that the suspect entered the business holding a gun and demanded cash. The suspect pulled the victim's hooded sweatshirt over her head prior to fleeing with the money.

Using information provided by victims and witnesses (including the description of the suspect's vehicle), investigators from the SFPD Robbery Detail conducted an investigation that led to the identity of the suspect. A crime bulletin was published and provided to local law enforcement partners. On June 30, 2018 at approximately 12:45 AM, Jarrod Calvert, a 42 year-old Santa Rosa resident, was taken into custody by a Sonoma County Sheriff's deputy. The deputy saw Calvert drive in to a gas station on the 16000 block of Main Street in Guerneville, recognizing Calvert's vehicle from the crime bulletin.

Calvert's maroon Toyota minivan was impounded and Calvert was later booked into the San Francisco County Jail on two counts of robbery. Calvert was released on his own recognizance on July 3, 2018 and was arrested for a new robbery offense in Santa Rosa on July 9th. His booking photo accompanies this news release.
