## **CAPTAIN'S MESSAGE:**

Hello Richmond District Residents,

School is back in session for most San Francisco schools as of this week. SFPD and other city agencies are working together to keep our students safe. By slowing down and watching for pedestrians drivers can greatly reduce the odds of a collision. Please see pages 13 and 14 for more back to school safety information.

Distracted driving is a major contributor to traffic collisions. This includes using your cell phone while driving. Check out this weeks tips.

# **Cell Phone Tips While Driving:**

**1.** Use speaker phone or a headset. Use a hands-free device like a headset or talk on speaker phone. Cont'd on page 2

- **2.** Hang up when necessary. Just because you can talk in the car doesn't mean you always should.
- **3. Don't dial while driving.** Become familiar with your phone's speed dialing and voice-activation features to minimize dialing.
- **4. Remember to focus on driving.** Don't look up phone numbers, don't take notes or play with your PDA (personal digital assistant) while driving. These activities prohibit you from watching where you are going. Of course, you shouldn't read the paper, apply eye make-up or write notes while driving either. Driving is serious business!
- **5.** Keep conversations to a minimum while driving, Keep conversations short and sweet. Don't use the cell phone for social visiting while you drive.
- **6.** Ask your passenger to dial when you're in the driver's seat. If possible, ask a passenger to make or take a call for you.
- 7. Know the laws when driving. Familiarize yourself with the laws concerning distracted driving.



### DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

### **Examples of Suspicious Activity:**

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

### **DEFINITIONS OF CRIME**

**Robbery**– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily in jury.

\*\* Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**—Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.


**Burglary**– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

### INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Robbery, Arrest 08/19/18 1852 Hours Fulton St/16th Ave

The victim exited a muni bus and saw two suspects get off the bus at the same time. The suspects then approached the victim and demanded money and his jacket. The victim refused and the suspects punched and kicked the victim and stole his cell phone. Both suspects fled and the victim chased after them. A passer-by called the police and attempted to stop one of the suspects. Police arrived and where able to detain one of the suspects. The victim was able to identify the detained suspect. The second suspect was not located.

Suspect 1 was placed under arrest and booked at the Juvenile Justice Center on the following charges: Robbery, Assault, Resisting Arrest, Conspiracy.
Suspect 2 is described as an unknown race Male, wearing a gray shirt and black sweatpants. This suspect is still outstanding.

Sutter St/ Broderick St

Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with a registration violation. The driver then stated he did not have a license. Upon further investigation the registration tab on the vehicle was found to be fraudulent. A records check revealed the driver had a suspended license. An inventory search prior to towing the vehicle, for the above violations, recovered an illegal collapsible baton in the drivers compartment.

The suspect was placed under arrest and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Possession of a Prohibited Weapon, False Display of Registration, Driving on a Suspended License.







# Back to School Safety Tips



Safe Routes to School is an important component of Vision Zero SF, the road safety policy that will build safety and livability into our streets. Through Vision Zero SF, we commit to working together to prioritize street safety and eliminate traffic deaths in San Francisco by 2024. Visit www.visionzerosf.org for more information.



### Walking to School

- 1. Use sidewalks or walking paths.
- 2. The safest place to cross streets is at crosswalks and corners.
- 3. Check for moving cars at driveways and intersections.
- 4. Obey all traffic signs and crossing guards.
- 5. Have a parent or trusted adult help you find the safest route.

#### Crossing the Street Safely

- 1. Stop at the curb or edge of the street.
- 2. Look left, right, left and behind you for traffic.
- 3. Wait until no traffic is coming and begin crossing.
- 4. Keep looking for traffic until you have finished crossing.
- 5. Walk, don't run across the street.
- 6. Don't use your phone when crossing the street.





### Biking to School

- 1. Always wear a helmet.
- 2. Ride in the direction of traffic.
- 3. Watch for opening car doors.
- 4. Wear bright clothing to help drivers see you.
- 5. Install reflectors on the rear, front, pedals and spokes.
- 6. Install lights on the front **and** back of your bike.

# If You Have to Drive

# Do

the street.

Pull into a passenger loading zone for drop-off. If there is no passenger loading zone or no space available, park in a legal parking space further away. Walking is healthy.

Drop your child off at the curb on the school side of the street rather than crossing into Incoming traffic or having your child run across

Have your child sit on the passenger side with their backpack so they can get out of the car easily, quickly and safely.

**Talk about crossing safely:** Cross at corners, look all ways before crossing, and *never* run across the street.



# Don't

Park in the loading zone. You can wait in the zone for up to 5 minutes but you must stay with your car. FINE: \$106

Park in a school bus zone during posted times. This blocks bus access and forces children to cross between

parked cars. FINE: \$106

Double park, which creates an unsafe situation for children who are often difficult to see between cars. FINE: \$110

Block driveways. FINE: \$106

Block a crosswalk. FINE: \$288

**Block a curb ramp** or a Muni bus zone

**FINE: \$288** 

Let your child out on the traffic side of the car. Pull over to the curb and teach your child to be a safe pedestrian.


