**Share:** Your location and destination with a friend or family member. Some ride share apps offer a "trusted contacts" feature that allows customers to automatically share a trip itinerary with friends or relatives.

### **DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY**

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

### **Examples of Suspicious Activity:**

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

### **DEFINITIONS OF CRIME**

**Robbery**– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily in jury.

\*\* Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**—Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary**– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

### INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Burglary Arrest 09/05/18 13:00 Hours Lincoln Way / MLK Dr

The suspect was wanted in connection with a Burglary that occurred on 4/22/2018. During the Burglary the suspect damaged a change machine in a laundromat and stole the money from it. Richmond Station Investigation Team (SIT) identified the suspect and the suspect was subsequently located by uniformed Patrol Officers and arrested for the Burglary.

The suspect was booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Burglary and Vandalism.

Driving Under the Influence, Arrest 09/07/18 1923 Hours 17th Ave / Anza St

Officers responded to a call regarding a possible drunk driver who had hit a parked car and was now weaving slowly northbound on 17th Ave. A responding officer observed a vehicle matching the description, coming in the opposite direction, and stopped. The suspect vehicle swerved into the stationary patrol car and stopped, at which point the driver refused to exit the vehicle.

The Officers suspected the subject was under the influence of alcohol based on established physical signs of intoxication. Officers conducted Field Sobriety Tests, which the subject failed. The subject's Driver's License was found to be suspended for a prior DUI in January 2018.

The driver was placed under arrest and booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Driving Under the Influence, Resisting & Delaying Arrest, Hit & Run of Property, Driving with a Suspended License & No Insurance.







#### Burglary Awareness and Prevention Tips for Construction Sites

#### SECURING & PREVENTING


- 1) Secure all equipment and vehicles at all times
- 2) Take effort to reduce the visability of tools and equipment secured in vehicles, or on job sites.
- Make use of adequate lighting in conjunction with open chain-link fencing on the perimeter to allow for high visability to the job site.
- Strongly consider the use of security systems such as alarms and video surveillance. Ensure signage for such is clearly visable.

#### PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES

- Photograph all tools. Ensure photographs clearly show the associated serial number, and/or distinctive markings.
- 2) Ensure job site keys are marked "Do Not Duplicate" and are controlled at all times.
- 3) Attempt to park employee vehicles within visable range of the job site.

#### SHOULD A BURGLARY OCCUR

- If the crime is in progress call 911, if not please use the non-emergency line at 415-553-0123. Be prepared
  to provide the following information:
  - a. Date and time of Incident
  - b. Suspect discription (if available)
  - c. Video (if available)
  - Items Taken, (including make, model, description, location taken from, value, photos and serial numbers)
  - e. Owners Information
