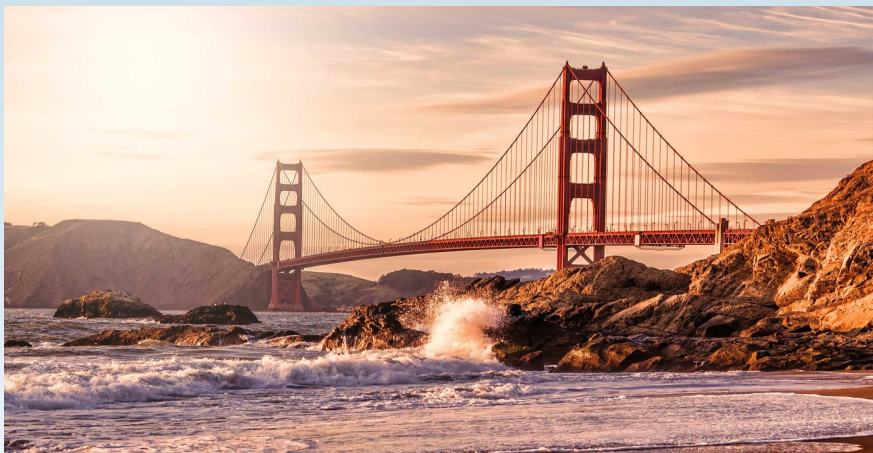

## DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

### Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

## DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

**Robbery**– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery- (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\***

**Aggravated Assault**– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

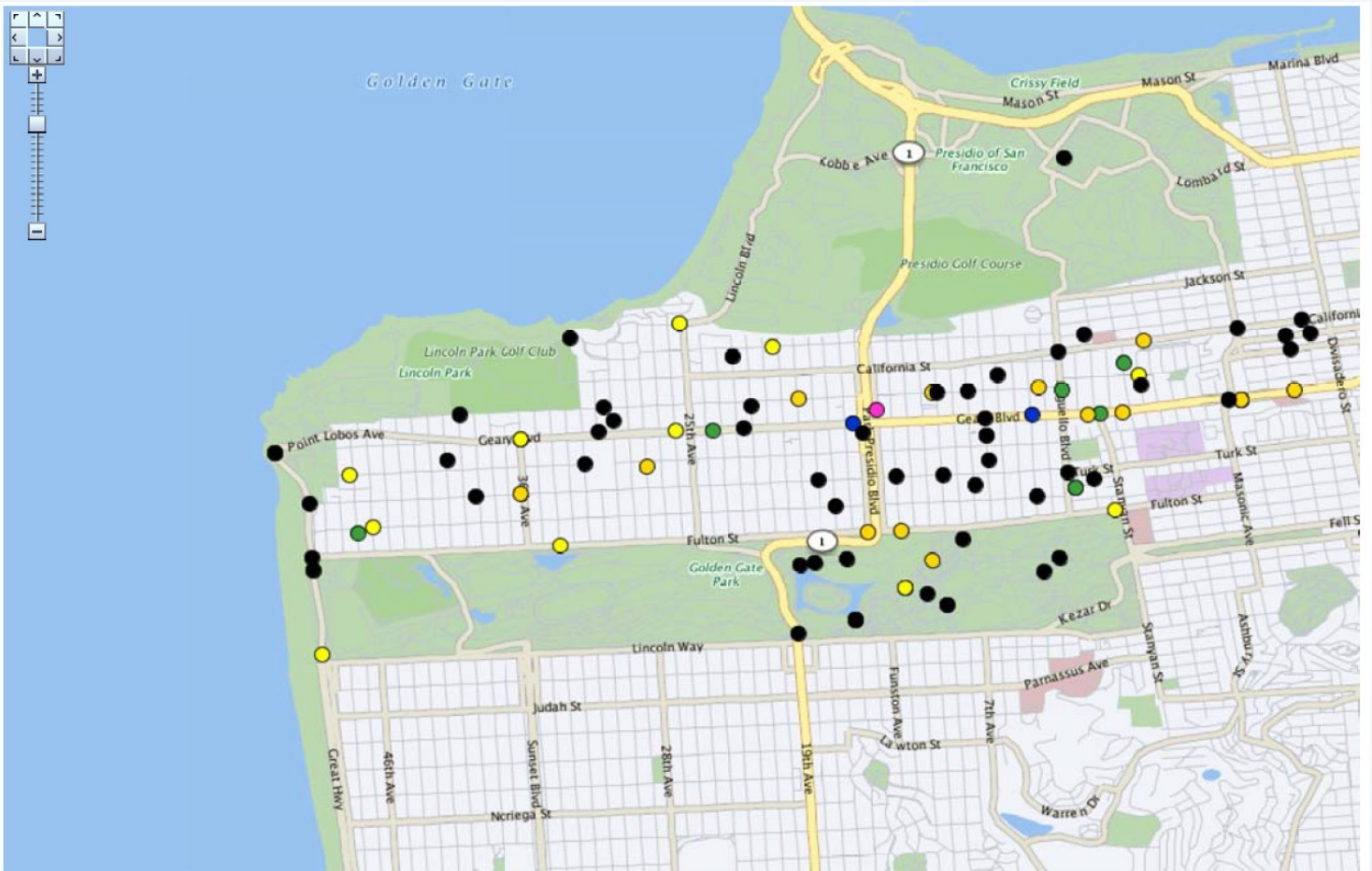
**Burglary**– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

### **Burglary Arrest**

**09/11/18 05:10 Hours**

**Beverages and More (BevMo), 3455 Geary Blvd**

The burglar alarm at BevMo was triggered at approximately 0509 hours on 9/11/2018. Responding units located a suspect in front of the store and detained him. The suspect spontaneously stated that he kicked in the door of BevMo because it was cold outside, and, since the door was now open, he thought he would go inside and grab a drink. He was subsequently arrested for the Burglary.

The suspect was booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Burglary and Vandalism. He was released on his Own Recognizance (OR) on 9/12/18, failed to appear at his court date on 9/17/2018, and now has an active felony warrant for his arrest.

### **Mental Health Detention**

**09/12/18 19:51 Hours**

Officers responded to the scene where the subject's ex-girlfriend said he was having a "psychotic episode", was under the influence of a hallucinogenic and had been drinking heavily. Subject's ex-girlfriend stated he had handguns and a shotgun in his room and had told her that people were coming to kill him around 1900-2000 hours. Units on scene were trained in Crisis Intervention, had less-lethal "bean bag" weapons and requested additional units.

At this point the subject's mother frantically approached officers and said the subject was in the backyard of the apartment complex, yelling. Due to the proximity of other apartment building windows and ease of flight through adjoining backyards, the officers entered the property in an attempt to contact the subject, for the safety of the neighbors. The officers observed the subject behind cover, pointing a flashlight at them. The officers announced themselves as San Francisco Police Officers and told the subject they were there to get him some help.

### **Mental Health Detention (continued)**

The subject moved away from cover and the officers noticed he was holding what appeared to be a long-barreled firearm, so they asked him what he was holding and he replied that it was a shotgun. The officers instructed him to put the shotgun down and he complied. The officers instructed him to walk backwards with his hands in the air and then kneel down, which he did, at which point the officers placed him in handcuffs.

Upon searching the subject, the officers found two revolvers in his pants and jacket pockets. A fourth firearm was seized from the subject's bedroom.

The subject was transported by SFFD to Kaiser for a Mental Health Evaluation. At Kaiser the subject told the officers that he had been in Las Vegas two days ago when he had consumed a large amount of mushrooms and methamphetamine and that day he had consumed a large amount of whisky and oxycodone.

### **Exhibiting Imitation Deadly Weapon, Impounded Vehicle 09/14/2018 12:43 Hours Willard St North & Golden Gate Ave**

An Officer noticed a parked unoccupied vehicle blocking wheelchair access to the sidewalk at Willard St North and Golden Gate Ave. A license plate records check showed that the vehicle had \$3,000 of unpaid parking violations on file and the vehicle registration had expired in January 2018 so the Officer ordered a tow truck. The Officer approached the vehicle to check the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and observed what appeared to be a firearm under the driver's seat.

As the tow truck arrived, the vehicle owner emerged from a nearby house, indignantly yelling that she didn't want her car towed. After the Officer confirmed that the vehicle did, indeed, belong to her, he placed her in handcuffs.

The gun turned out to be a pellet gun with the paint removed, to leave a metal finish, leaving it indistinguishable from a genuine firearm, without close examination.

The vehicle owner was cited for 20170(a) PC "No person may openly display or expose any imitation firearm in a public place", issued a parking citation for blocking wheelchair access to the sidewalk, and her vehicle was towed with holds for registration and unpaid parking violations.

### **Rollover Traffic Collision**

**9/12/2018 01:21**

### **Park Presidio Blvd south of Fulton St**

A Lyft driver from the East Bay, who was obviously unfamiliar with the local roads, was heading southbound on Park Presidio (35mph limit) at an unsafe speed and failed to make the sharp right hand turn. The vehicle rode up the concrete median barrier and overturned into oncoming traffic lanes. The driver sustained serious injuries.

Due to the cumulative damage to the barrier and our concerns over safety, Captain Jean has requested the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) to inspect the barrier with a view to repairing or improving it.

Please remember that speed limits are there for safety and greatly exceeding them is likely to result in an undesirable outcome.

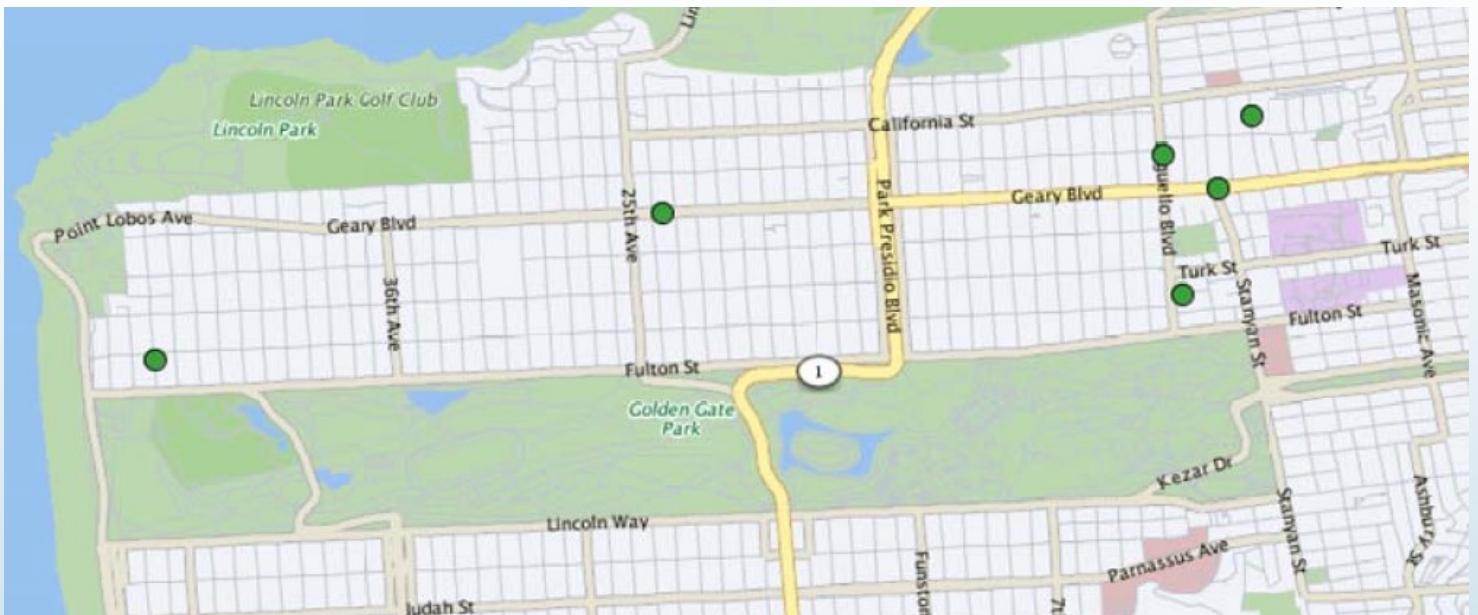

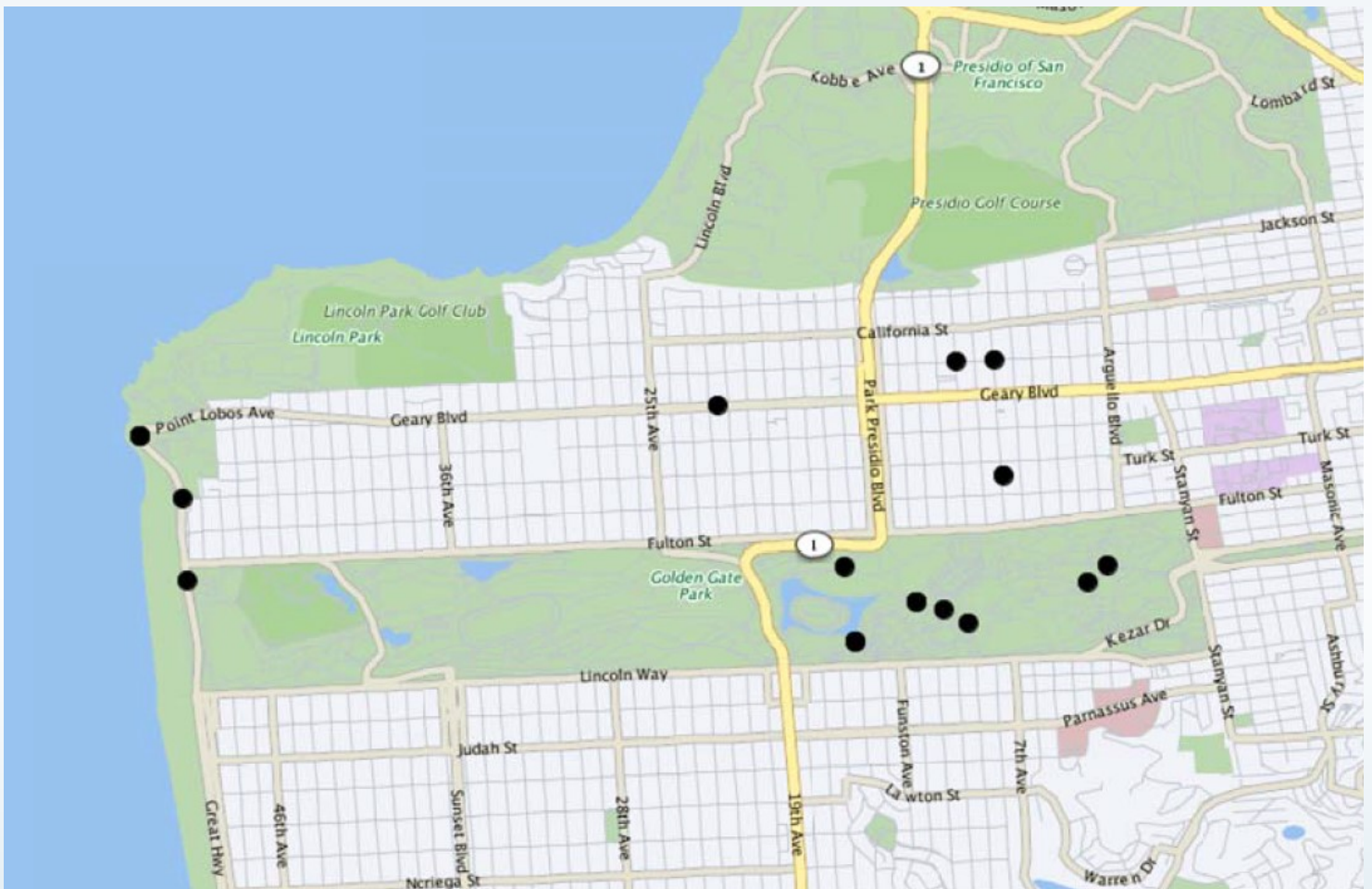

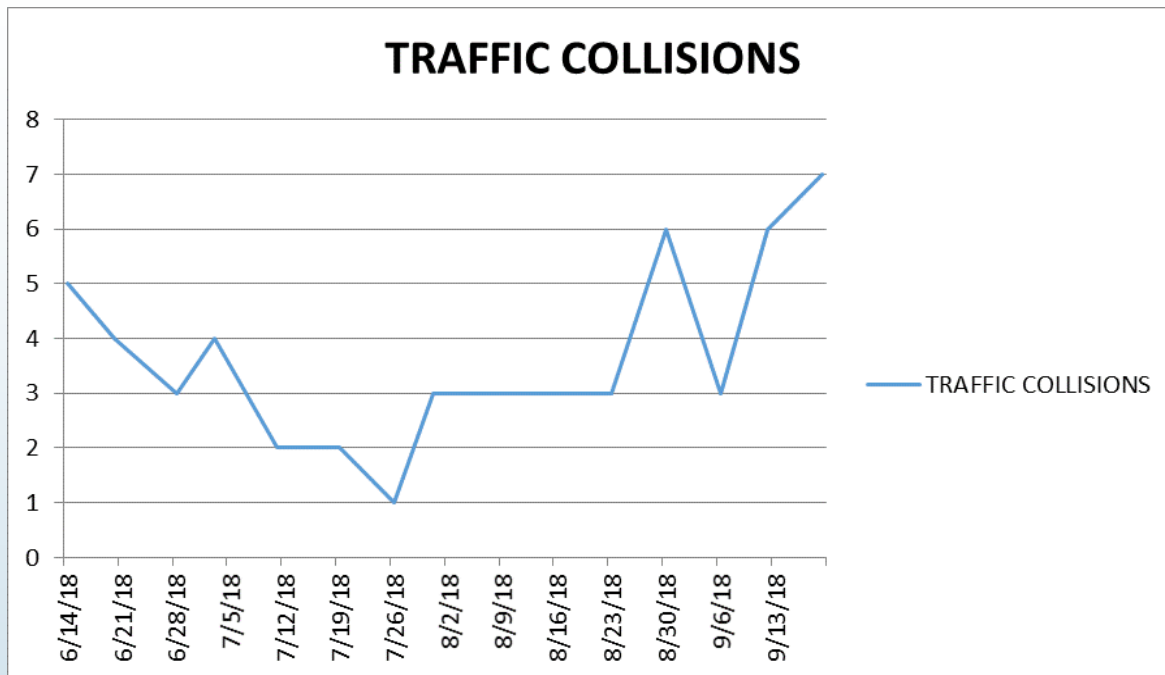

**Wednesday, September 19, 2018 - SFPD Arrest Prolific Burglary Suspect**



On September 12, 2018, at approximately 6:30 AM , San Francisco Police officers arrested 61 year-old George Lima of San Francisco. Lima was charged with several residential burglaries and a robbery that took place between August 14, 2018 and September 7, 2018. Lima was identified as the suspect in several residential burglaries, where he entered and stole items such as bicycles, laptops, electronics, and currency. The burglaries primarily targeted residential buildings throughout the Mission and Ingleside Police Districts over a four week period. Losses in the burglaries total nearly \$115,000.00 worth of items.

Officers at Mission Station were on patrol and saw Lima, who m they recognized from Crime Alerts sent out by burglary investigators . The officers placed Lima under arrest in the area of 22nd Street and Capp Street.

The San Francisco Police Department's Burglary Unit charged Lima with two counts of Burglary 1st degree, two counts of Attempted Burglary 1st degree, and one count of Robbery. Although an arrest has been made, investigators are asking anyone with information on these cases to contact the San Francisco Police at 415-575-4444 or text-a-tip to TIP411 with SFPD at the start of the message. ### **Wednesday, September 19, 2018 - SFPD Make Arrest in Polk Street Shooting Death**

On September 15, 2018 at approximately 2:34 AM, San Francisco Police officers assigned to Northern Station responded to the 1100 block of Polk Street after hearing a possible motor vehicle collision. Upon arrival, they saw that a black Toyota Corolla and a gray Honda Civic were involved in a collision.

The officers approached the Toyota and saw that the driver, 23 year-old Victor Sosa of San Francisco, was suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. The officers summoned an ambulance and initiated CPR until relieved by San Francisco Fire Department paramedics. Unfortunately, despite efforts to resuscitate him, Mr. Sosa died at the scene.

The San Francisco Police Department Homicide Detail responded to the scene and initiated an investigation. On September 15, 2018 at approximately 3:00 PM, investigators took San Francisco resident Jose Manuel Beltran into custody at 850 Bryant Street. Beltran, who had been a passenger in the rear seat of the Toyota, was booked into San Francisco County Jail for manslaughter, carrying a concealed firearm in a vehicle and carrying a loaded firearm in public. Due to pending identification matters, his booking photo is not being released at this time.

While an arrest has been made, this remains an active and ongoing investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call the SFPD 24 hour tip line at (415) 575 - 4 444 or Text a Tip to TIP411 and begin the text message with SFPD. You may remain anonymous.

### **Monday, September 17, 2018—San Francisco Police Arrest Suspects in Violent Robbery Series**

On July 27, 2018 at approximately 5:00 AM, San Francisco Police officers from Mission Station were flagged down on the 3100 block of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street regarding a robbery and stabbing. The victim, a 48 year-old, male San Francisco resident, had been robbed and stabbed in the torso in the area of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and South Van Ness Avenue. The victim was transported to a local hospital where he was treated and later released.

An investigation was begun by the Department's Robbery Detail, and over the course of several weeks, investigators received two additional robbery reports:

- On August 27, 2018 at approximately 11:20 PM, a 26 year-old, female San Francisco resident was robbed at knifepoint near Church Street and Clipper Street.
- On August 31, 2018 at approximately 2:15 AM, a 29 year-old, female resident of Edina, Maine was robbed and stabbed near Broderick Street and Golden Gate Avenue. The victim sustained lacerations to her face and was transported to a local hospital for treatment and was later released.

During the investigation of the August 31st robbery, investigators followed leads which lead them to San Rafael, California. Investigators located the robbery suspects and arrested 21 year-old Daisy Rodriguez, and 19 year-old Fernando Herrera, both residents of San Rafael, California.

Both Rodriguez and Herrera were charged by the San Francisco District Attorney's Office for nine felonies stemming from the series of robberies listed above. Booking photos will not be released at this time due to identification matters.

Although arrests have been made, this is an open and active investigation. Investigators are asking anyone with information to contact the San Francisco Police at 415-575-4444 or Text-a-Tip to TIP411 and begin the text message with SFPD. You may remain anonymous.
