**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**INTRODUCTION**

As part of the national conversation on police reform, including accountability and transparency in law enforcement, accurate data collection has taken center stage. In the forefront is whether specific identifying characteristics (i.e., race/ethnicity, gender, or age) play a role in the outcome of encounters between law enforcement officers and members of the public, especially as it relates to the level of force used, the rate of arrest, and/or the propensity to search an individual.

In order to evaluate the effectiveness of the reforms undertaken by the San Francisco Police Department (the Department), and more importantly, to ensure procedural justice is evenly applied throughout all neighborhoods within our city, the Department has done a thorough analysis of the processes in place for collecting data as required by recently passed legislation.

On January 3, 2017, the Department implemented a new contact data collection program, eStop, to be used by officers to record relevant information gathered during encounters, whether self-initiated or dispatched. (This first quarter report does not contain data for the first two days of January although some of the tables are labeled January 1 to March 31.) The eStop application used to collect the data during an encounter is available via Department-issued mobile devices. Although this data collection has streamlined the process of gathering information electronically, manually inputting some required data directly from incident reports continues. The goal is to have the process fully automated.

When reviewing the results of this quarter's report, the Department is dedicating resources to re-evaluate the data collection process, especially the data sets captured within the eStop application, in order to provide more defined results. It is important to the Department that the information collected is properly reported and these reports will continue to evolve as the technology is streamlined in our efforts to provide clear and concise data.

The Department has continued its efforts to rebuild the community's trust in a variety of ways including training all sworn members in fair and impartial policing strategies focusing on procedural justice and implicit bias. Coupled with the updated training in use of force principles that emphasize proportionality and the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) philosophy, officers are being equipped with the tools and knowledge needed to assess and de-escalate situations with the goal of preserving life.

Detailed encounter reports are generated and forwarded to the Chief of Police, Assistant Chiefs, and Deputy Chiefs for review. The final reports are provided to commanding officers for review with district captains and unit supervisors as a means to monitor and identify concerns immediately.

At the Chief's direction, work continues on developing a program which will expand on existing processes to audit station captains monthly on their unit's performance, use of force, stops, arrests, and other metrics with the intent of providing comprehensive and concise data in a timely manner.

The Department is committed to partnering with a research/academic institution to perform an unbiased, in-depth analysis of the data contained in this report.

## **DATA COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS**

Two recently passed laws governing the collection of data are California Assembly Bill 953 ([oag.ca.gov/ab953](http://oag.ca.gov/ab953)) and San Francisco Administrative Code 96A. Local law, Administrative Code 96A, mandates the Department collect data relating to race/ethnicity, gender, and age during all self-initiated encounters, as well as any contacts resulting in the use of force. State law requires this information be collected during all encounters, both self-initiated and dispatched. The eStop program was developed to meet the expanded requirements of the state law.

Per local law, the Department began reporting on use of force data beginning June 30, 2016, all of which are available online ([sanfranciscopolice.org/use-force](http://sanfranciscopolice.org/use-force)). Chapter 96A further requires that expanded reporting is to begin in June 2017. Reporting requirements for the state law does not begin until January 2018.

The attached Encounters report for the first quarter of 2017 (January, February, March) is intended to comply with Chapter 96A and includes the below information for both self-initiated and dispatched encounters. Please note that the use of force report and arrest data for the same time period was released on May 1, 2017, and is available online at (<http://sanfranciscopolice.org/2017-admin-code-96a-reports>).

This Executive Summary only contains information on 'self-initiated' encounters and traffic stops conducted by officers as required by Chapter 96A. For the entire report including 'dispatched' and 'self-initiated' encounters and traffic stops as required by Assembly Bill 953 and Chapter 96A, please refer to the attached report.

  - (1) The total number;
  - (2) The total number broken down by race or ethnicity, age, and sex;

  - (6) The total number of each type of disposition, and the total number for each disposition broken down by race or ethnicity, age, and sex; and
  - (7) The data for Encounters required to be reported by this subsection (a) shall be reported separately for Detentions and Traffic Stops;
- (b) Use of Force – Released on May 1, 2017 and available online.
- (c) Arrest Data – Released on May 1, 2017 and available online
- (d) Reason for Encounters.
- (e) Each Use of Force – reported under (b) as listed above

(f) Department of Police Accountability data on alleged bias related complaints.

This quarterly report will be available to the public on the Department’s website as part of the ongoing commitment to transparency. Once the process is fully automated, the datasets used to generate all reports will be published to provide the information in a searchable format. Future quarterly submissions will combine the use of force and encounter data into one report.

**Definitions:**

**Encounter:** The definition for encounter per Chapter 96A specifically states, “A detention or traffic stop where the officer initiates activity based solely on the officer’s own observations or the observations and direction of another officer, rather than on information provided by dispatch or reported by a member of the public, i.e., self-initiated stops.”

In order to comply with state law, AB 953, the Department collects data for all encounters; self-initiated and dispatched. However, the information is reported separately in order to meet the requirements of Chapter 96A.

**Detention:** An interaction between an officer(s) and an individual(s) in which the officer(s) detains the individual(s).

**Traffic Stop:** An interaction between an officer(s) and an individual(s) driving a vehicle, in which the officer conducts a stop of the vehicle. When enforcing traffic laws during a traffic stop, the Department uses the definition of a vehicle to include motor vehicles and bicycles.
