Captain's Message

Halloween is almost here and I would like to share some safety tips from SFPD and SF SAFE to make it a safer and fun night for all:

- 1. Make sure your children know how to call 911 or SFPD Dispatch's direct line (415-553-8090) if they have an emergency or get lost.
- 2. Always accompany younger children trick-or-treating.
- 3. For older children going out without adults, plan and review an acceptable route and agree on a return time when they should be home.
- 4. Only go to homes with a porch light on and never into a home or car for a treat.
- 5. Visibility is key! Consider attaching reflective tape, glow sticks, or battery-operated twinkle lights to costumes.
- 6. Walk in well-lit, well-traveled areas, in a group if possible.
- 7. If you are passing out candy keep your home safe for visiting trick-or-treaters by clearing porches, yards and walkways of any trip hazards. Keep pets restrained for safety (and to not scare little ones!).
- 8. Advise your children to not eat their candy until you have checked it.
- 9. Any candy not in its original wrapper or that appears to have been opened should be thrown out immediately.

Firearm, Narcotics Arrest

Oct. 1, 2018 - 7:50 pm – 1000 blk Connecticut / 100 blk Dolphin (SFPD 180744502) Officers initiated an investigation into illicit narcotics sales on and were able to obtain search warrants for two residences. The search warrants were executed and yielded a large amount of narcotics (methamphetamine and cocaine), a .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol and a 12 gauge shotgun. The investigation resulted in the arrest of three suspects.

Armed Robbery

Oct 2, 2018 – 8:30 am – **1500 block Bayshore** (SFPD 180745306)

Officers responded to a call of a suspect with a gun and made contact with the 42 year old victim who reported being robbed. The victim stated that he had been approached by the suspect who was armed with a rifle. The suspect stole the victim's car keys and fled the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm, Narcotics Arrest

Oct. 3, 2018 - 2:40 pm - 100 block Blythedale (SFPD 180749245)

An investigation into illicit narcotics sales led the officers to a location in the Ingleside District for which they were able to secure a search warrant. They served the warrant during which they seized a large amount of methamphetamine and **three semi-automatic handguns**. A suspect was arrested and booked on narcotics and weapons charges.

Robbery

Oct 5, 2018 – 11:30 pm – **900 block Connecticut** (SFPD 180756325)

A 60 year old victim was pepper sprayed and robbed of his possessions and car keys. His car was later stolen. This incident is under investigation.

Home Invasion Robbery

Oct 6, 2018 – 3:50 am – unit block Topeka (SFPD 180756626)

Officers responded to a residence on a report of a robbery and met with the six residents of the home, ages ranging from 26 to 66. Five suspects entered the home. One was armed with a handgun that he used to pistol whip one of the victims. Items including

jewelry and cash were stolen from the house before the suspects fled. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

Oct 6, 2018 – 8:30 pm – **25th / Wisconsin** (SFPD 180758462)

Officers on foot patrol observed a suspect parking haphazardly in a reckless manner. They approached the vehicle and spotted **a .40 caliber pistol with an illegal extended magazine** in plain view inside the car. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and booked on weapons violations.

Shots Fired

Oct 6, 2018 – 10:55 pm – **700 block Innes** (SFPD 180758713)

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and found several spent casings in the street. No damage or injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Robbery Arrest

Oct 7, 2018 – 6:45 pm – **900 block Connecticut** (SFPD 180740942)

Officers located a suspect who they knew was wanted in connection with a robbery that occurred on September 30th in the Tenderloin District. On seeing the officers, the suspect fled on foot and they gave chase. The officers successfully overtook the suspect and placed him under arrest. He was booked on robbery charges.

Firearm Arrest

Oct 7, 2018 – 5:50 pm – unit block Whitfield (SFPD 180760467)

Officers made contact with a suspicious subject in a vehicle and conducted an investigation that resulted in the discovery of a .40 caliber pistol with an extended magazine inside the glove box of the car. The suspect, a felon prohibited from possessing weapons, was booked on weapons violations.

Ammunition, Warrant Arrest

Oct 9, 2018 – 4:11 pm – **Oakdale / Baldwin** (SFPD 180766039)

Officers made contact with a subject who was on active probation with a search condition. A search of the suspect revealed a concealed and loaded pistol magazine. The suspect also had an active warrant for his arrest. He was booked on multiple related charges.

Robbery

Oct 9, 2018 – 6:00 pm – **1300 block Hawes** (SFPD 180766277)

An 18 year old victim was approached by two suspects from behind. One suspect put his hands over the victim's mouth while the second suspect went through his pockets, removing his valuables. The suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Burglary Arrest

Oct. 10, 2018 – 3:10 am – **1600 block Jerrold** (SFPD 180767372)

Officers responded to a call of a burglary of a warehouse being used as a marijuana grow facility. They found a damaged door and a suspect inside. The suspect attempted to flee but was apprehended and arrested. He was booked on burglary and resisting arrest charges.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Oct 12, 2018 – 6:40 pm – **18th / Pennsylvania** (SFPD 180775109)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary and were alerted to the suspect by several witnesses. He was taken into custody and booked.

Homicide

Oct. 15, $2018 - 6:30 \text{ pm} - 5100 \text{ block } 3^{rd} \text{ (SFPD } 180782988)$

Officers on patrol heard gunfire and responded to the source. They located a 21 year male victim who had suffered multiple gunshot wounds. He was transported to SFGH where he succumbed to his injuries two days later. The Homicide Detail in investigating.

Firearm, Assault Arrest

Oct 16, 2018 – 11:00 am – **100 block Van Dyke** (SFPD 180784730)

A victim came to Bayview Station and reported having been physically assaulted by the suspect who she was able to identify. Officers were able to located the suspect and take him into custody at his residence along with two firearms that were located as a result of their investigation. The suspect was booked on multiple related charges.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Oct 16, 2018 – 1:02 pm – **800 block Missouri** (SFPD 180781861)

Officers made an arrest of a suspect who was identified in a series of auto burglaries that had occurred in the Central District. He was booked on two separate counts of vehicle burglary.

Robbery

Oct 17, 2018 – 8:00 am – **Girard / Mansell** (SFPD 180787091)

Officers responded to a call of a robbery and met with the victim who reported that he had been approach on the street by a suspect who demanded his property. The suspect stole the victim's backpack as the victim attempted to run away. The suspect followed the victim until he was able to successfully hide. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

Oct 17, 2018 – 1:20 pm – **Mendell / 3rd** (SFPD 180787897)

Officers received a tip regarding an armed suspect inside Mendell Plaza. They responded to the area and located the suspect, who immediately took off running. The officers gave chase and apprehended him. A **loaded .40 caliber pistol** was seized form his person. The suspect was booked on weapons charges.

Carjacking

Oct 18, 2018 – 12:00 pm – **Vermont / 20th** (SFPD 180790931)

A 37 year old victim had left his car keys in the ignition as he stepped away from the parked car. He returned to find a suspect sitting behind the wheel. The victim ran up to the car and grabbed the door at which point the suspect began to drive off. The vehicle was later located a short distance away. This incident is under investigation.

Armed Carjacking

Oct 18, 2018 – 11:58 pm – **Phelps / Galvez** (SFPD 180792705)

A 30 year old victim had pulled over and got out of his car to urinate, leaving the keys in the ignition. A suspect, armed with a gun, confronted the victim and held him at bay as she entered his vehicle and drove off. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery Arrest

Oct 19, 2018 – 11:35 am – **3800 block 3rd** (SFPD 180793515)

Officers responded to a call of a robbery at a store and met with the security officer who had caught the suspect shoplifting. When he confronted him, the suspect pulled out a knife and threatened him with it. The suspect accidentally dropped the knife, as his hands were too full of stolen merchandise to hold it properly, at which point the guard was able to hold him until the officers arrived. The suspect was booked on robbery charges.

Robbery Arrest

Oct 19, 2018 – 11:54 pm – **Thomas / Keith** (SFPD 180795373)

A 41 year old victim was getting out of her car when she was punched in the face by a suspect on the street. The suspect stole the victim's cell phone and fled the scene on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Homicide Arrest (Outside Agency)

Oct 20, 2018 – 10:15 am – 3rd / Shafter (SFPD 180795925)

On October 19th, Sacramento PD discovered a deceased victim in the trunk of a vehicle, developed suspect information, and issued an APB to all surrounding agencies. The following day, the officers had located the suspect, in a car in the Bayview district, and coordinated with Bayview officers to conduct a traffic stop. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and remanded to the custody of Sacramento PD.

Shots Fired

Oct 21, 2018 – 1:15 am – **1100 block Palou** (SFPD 180798032)

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and found several spent casings in the street. No damage or injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Stabbing Arrest

Oct 21, 2018 – 4:15 pm – **Oakdale / Loomis** (SFPD 180799563)

Officers, on patrol, witnessed a physical altercation between two subjects with box cutters and immediately intervened, detaining both parties. One of the subjects, the victim, was bleeding from a cut to his throat. He was transported to SFGH for treatment. The suspect was arrested and booked on aggravated assault charges.

Armed Robbery

Oct 21, 2018 – 11:48 pm – **Armed Robbery** (SFPD 180800580)

A 31 year old USPS employee was robbed in the parking lot of the postal facility. The suspect had approached the victim while wearing a mask and brandishing a handgun. The victim was made to hand over her money to the suspect who then fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

SFPD Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Hit and Run Vehicle


Friday, October 19, 2018

On Tuesday, August 21, 2018 at approximately 5:40AM, a hit-and-run collision occurred at the intersection of Valencia Street and Hill Street in San Francisco's Mission District. The suspect vehicle, a maroon 4-door sedan, was traveling southbound on Valencia Street when it struck the victim who was operating a bicycle. The collision caused the victim to be ejected off his bike and fall to the ground.

The victim, a 33 year-old San Francisco resident, sustained non life-threatening injuries and was transported to a local hospital.

This incident occurred on a well-traveled thoroughfare. Investigators ask anyone who was in the area of Valencia Street and Hill Street on August 21, 2018 around 5:40AM to check cell phones, dash-cams and surveillance systems for photos or video of the collision and/or the suspect vehicle. Investigators are asking anyone with information to contact the SFPD 24 hour tip line at (415) 575-4444 or Text a Tip to TIP411 and begin the message with SFPD.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

<u>Dispose of Unwanted and Expired</u> <u>Medication at Bayview Station</u>

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication <u>except</u> for:

Herbal Remedies
Vitamins
Supplements
Cosmetics
Other personal care products
Compressed Cylinders
Aerosols
Inhalers
Medical Devices
Sharps
Illicit drugs
L odine containing medication.



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
