## **Robbery**

Oct. 29, 2018 - 9:10 pm – **100 block Atoll** (SFPD 180822528)

A 29 year old victim was standing in front of the home of a relative when two suspects approached him. One suspect held his arms while the other rifled through his pockets, removing his money. Both suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

## **Shots Fired**

Oct, 31, 2018 - 11:17 pm – **1800 block Lane** (SFPD 180828457)

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and located a spent round at the scene. No injuries or damage were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

## **Shots Fired**

Nov, 1, 2018 - 12:12 am – **Ironwood / Catalina** (SFPD 180828548)

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and located several spent casings at the scene. A witness reported a suspect in a Halloween mask firing the rounds prior to fleeing in a black Toyota Rav-4. No injuries or damage were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

## **Hot Prowl Burglary Arrest**

Nov. 1, 2018 - 8:50 pm – **2500 block Marin** (SFPD 180831278)

Officers responded to a call of a burglary and met with the residents of a home who were inside the residence when the suspect attempted to break in through the front door. They raised alarm and the suspect ran off. The officers searched the area and located the suspect, as well as his crowbar, and placed him under arrest. He was booked on attempted hot prowling burglary charges.

**Armed Robbery**

Nov. 1, 2018 - 10:10 pm – **20<sup>th</sup> / Wisconsin** (SFPD 180834103)

A teenage victim was approached on the street by a suspect who tapped him on the shoulder. The victim turned to find the suspect pointing a gun at him. The victim, fearing his life, handed over his phone and wallet. The suspect handed back the wallet, but kept the phone and fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

**Robbery**

Nov. 02, 2018 - 10:50 pm – **Keith / Palou** (SFPD 180834169)

A teenage victim was followed off a MUNI coach by a suspect who struck him and stole his money and cell phone prior to running off. This incident is under investigation.

**Robbery**

Nov. 3, 2018 - 7:30 pm – **Silver / Charter Oak** (SFPD 180838490)

An 18 year old victim was approached by a suspect armed with a knife as he walked on the sidewalk. The suspect demanded he empty his pockets. As he complied, three other suspects joined the first and waited for the victim to hand over his cell phone. The suspects then discussed taking the victim's shoes as well but ultimately chose not to. All four suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

**Robbery**

Nov. 4, 2018 - 4:50 pm – **20<sup>th</sup> / Connecticut** (SFPD 180838531)

A teenage victim was on his bike when he was approached by two suspects who ordered him to get off and stole it. Both suspects fled the scene. This incident is under investigation.

# Department News

## SFPD Strategic Plan



In late 2017, the San Francisco Police Department began developing an inclusive, forward-looking strategic plan that will ensure that the Department is ready and equipped to meet the challenges of modern urban policing and earn the trust and respect of our communities.

We began by taking a **lay of the land**, conducting interviews and reviewing documents from a broad peer set to understand best practices of leading public sector departments across the country. These insights informed both our strategic planning process and the outputs.

We also **looked in the mirror**, meeting face-to-face with more than 70 members (sworn and nonsworn) of the Department through focus groups and interviews to understand aspirations and challenges. In addition, we reviewed in-process initiatives, working groups, and strategic plans across the Department to understand current strengths and efforts. In parallel, a number of sessions focused on community policing were conducted that provided additional input on what the community expects from the Department now and in the future.

The strategic planning process was governed by both internal and external stakeholders in the form of a Steering Committee (comprising the Chief of SFPD, Assistant and Deputy Chiefs and Directors), an Internal Sounding Board (comprising Commanders and representatives of Police Employee Groups) and External Senior Advisors (comprising representatives from the community and the San Francisco Mayor's Office). The output of our strategic process is a **strategy statement** and **five strategic initiatives** to drive the near-term priorities of the Department. These initiatives will encompass ongoing efforts, and help prioritize future initiatives.

### SFPD strategy statement:

**San Francisco Police Department stands for safety with respect for all. We will engage in just, transparent, unbiased and responsive policing; do so in the spirit of dignity and in collaboration with the community; maintain and build trust and respect as the guardian of constitutional and human rights.**

### SFPD's 5 Strategic Initiative Clusters:

1. **Collaborate:** Build strong partnerships with the community and City agencies for addressing community-wide challenges that impact "safety with respect";
2. **Improve Responsiveness:** Improve ability to respond in a timely, informed, unbiased and procedurally just way, and work towards a collaborative resolution;
3. **Measure and Communicate:** Align on a shared vision and transparent way of measuring "safety with respect" in order to work better with each other and our community;
4. **Strengthen the Department:** Instill "safety with respect" into how we organize, evaluate performance, recruit, train, promote, reward, deploy and lead the SFPD;
5. **Define the Future:** Develop a future-focused, longer-term strategic plan (Strategy 2.0) for a more modern, evolving, and inclusive SFPD with input from internal and external stakeholders.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

### Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

**The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:**

- Herbal Remedies**
- Vitamins**
- Supplements**
- Cosmetics**
- Other personal care products**
- Compressed Cylinders**
- Aerosols**
- Inhalers**
- Medical Devices**
- Sharps**
- Illicit drugs**
- L odine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
