Auto Burglary Arrest

Nov. 26, 2018 - 6:34 pm – **3800 block 3rd** (SFPD 180894787)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary that had just occurred and located the victim and the boosted vehicle. Officers searching of the area located the suspect near Youngblood Coleman Park and took him into custody. The suspect was booked on auto burglary charges.

Reckless Evasion

Nov. 27, 2018 – 4:06 am – **Napoleon / Evans** (SFPD 180895484)

Officers on patrol observed a black Infinity sedan run a red light. An attempt to stop the car resulted in the vehicle taking off at a high rate of speed. The officers did not pursue the vehicle in the interest of public safety, but continued driving in the area in search for it. They located the vehicle and driver a short distance away and were able to take the suspect into custody. He was booked on numerous vehicle related violations including felony evading.

Warehouse Burglary Arrest

Nov, 28, 2018 – 4:42 am – **6200 block 3rd** (SFPD 180897844)

Officers responded to a warehouse on a call of a burglary in progress. A witness had reported that a vehicle drove up to and struck the roll-up door of the warehouse, knocking it off the tracks. Multiple suspects had entered the premises. The arriving officers set up a perimeter and conducted a search of the interior with a K9 unit. All five suspects were located inside and taken into custody. A **loaded 9mm pistol** was recovered along with multiple burglary tools. The suspects were booked on multiple charges including burglary, conspiracy and added gang enhancements.

Robbery

Nov. 28, 2018 - 7:15 pm – **unit block Sweeny** (SFPD 180900055)

A 55 year old victim was walking home when a suspect approached her from behind and grabbed her purse. The victim struggled for her bag and was struck on the head by the

suspect. She fell to the ground and the suspect made off with the purse. This incident is under investigation.

Aggravated Assault Arrest

Nov. 29, 2018 – 11:40 am – **1300 block Fitzgerald** (SFPD 180901451)

Officers responded to a call of a person damaging property and assaulting passers-by. They located the suspect who was positively identified by the two victims. The suspect was booked on aggravated assault charges.

Aggravated Assault Arrest

Nov. 29, 2018 – 7:40 pm – **700 block Tennessee** (SFPD 180902794)

A security guard was making her rounds when she found a suspect trespassing on the property. Her order for him to leave was met with the suspect brandishing a knife and making threats to the victim before fleeing. The officers searching the area located the suspect and placed him under arrest. He was booked on aggravated assault and threats charges.

Robbery

Nov. 30, 2018 - 12:22 am – **3rd / Hollister** (SFPD 180903231)

A 30 year old victim was walking with a cell phone in her hand when a suspect ran up to her, shoved her, and snatched the phone away. The suspect ran off and got into a dark sedan that had pulled up beside him. The vehicle drove from the scene. This incident is under investigation

Shots Fired

Dec. 01, 2018 - 8:10 pm – **250 block Griffith** (SFPD 180908037)

Officers responded to a Shot-Spotter activation and located several spent rounds and other evidence in the street. No damage or injuries were reported as a result of this incident, allegedly involving three subjects. The officers were able to identify one of the subjects and an investigation into the incident is ongoing.

Robbery

Dec. 02, 2018 – 3:12 am – **3800 block 3rd** (SFPD 180908645)

A 30 year old victim was seated in the passenger seat of a parked vehicle when a suspect came up to his rolled down window and pointed a gun at him. The suspect ripped a gold chain from the victim's neck and took off running. This incident is under investigation.

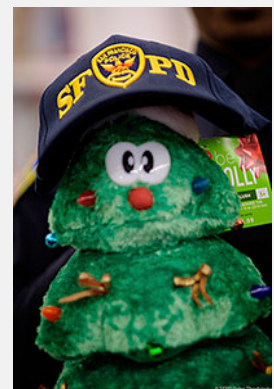

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- Herbal Remedies**
- Vitamins**
- Supplements**
- Cosmetics**
- Other personal care products**
- Compressed Cylinders**
- Aerosols**
- Inhalers**
- Medical Devices**
- Sharps**
- Illicit drugs**
- Lodine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
