# Incidents of Interest

## Home Invasion Robbery Arrest

Jan. 22, 2019 - 2:13 pm – 1100 block Hollister (SFPD 190053901)

Officers patrolling in the area observed a dark sedan accelerate quickly in reverse towards a residence. They saw two suspects, who were carrying crowbars and had their faces covered, run out of the building and get into the car. The car drove off and the officers, believing that the suspect had just been involved in a burglary or robbery, immediately began to pursue the vehicle. After the suspects became involved in a minor collision at **3rd and La Conte**, the officers took all three into custody after several foot pursuits. Meanwhile, officers at the residence located the 83 year old victim inside. He stated that the suspects forced open his front door, located him in his room, and forced him not to move as they ransacked the residence, stole property, and fled. All three suspects were booked on multiple charges including 1<sup>st</sup> degree burglary, robbery, and conspiracy. This incident is being investigated by the Burglary Detail.

## Carjacking

Jan. 23, 2019 - 12:30 pm – 3000 block San Bruno (SFPD 190056325)

A 33 year old stopped his car and ran into a nearby store, leaving his keys in the ignition. He then saw a suspect get into his vehicle and start it. The victim ran out and tried to stop the suspect who drove off but collided with a MUNI coach at the end of the street. The suspect then got out of the car and fled on foot. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is being investigated by the Robbery Detail.

## **Grand Theft Arrest**

Jan. 23, 2019 - 7:30 pm - 300 block Bayshore (SFPD 180587186)

Officers made an arrest of a subject after he had been identified as the suspect in an August 6, 2018 larceny incident. The suspect had stolen over \$1000 in coins from a car wash facility on the 300 block of Bayshore. The suspect was booked on grand theft charges

## Burglary Arrest

## Jan. 25, 2019 - 1:24 am – 2400 block San Bruno (SFPD 190060780)

Officers responded to an audible building alarm at a convenience store. The doors were locked but they were able to gain access to a live video feed that revealed that the suspect was on the roof of the building. The suspect attempted to escape by running across multiple rooftops but was ultimately apprehended and arrested on a roof on a building on the unit block of Felton. The suspect was booked on multiple charges including burglary and probation violation offenses.

## Bank Robbery

Jan. 25, 2019 - 3:30 pm – 2400 block San Bruno (SFPD 190062300) A 31 year old bank teller was working in his bank when the suspect entered and approached the counter. The suspect handed the victim a note demanding cash and the victim complied. The suspect fled on foot. The Robbery Unit is investigationg.

## Shots Fired

Jan. 25, 2019 - 7:50 pm - Newcomb / Newhall (SFPD 190253642)

Officers responded to a call of shots fired and located multiple casings in the street as well as a parked vehicle that had been damaged by the gunfire. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident and the suspect has been identified with and arrest warrant pending.

## Hit and Run

## Jan. 25, 2019 - 9:00 pm – **Bayshore / Marin** (SFPD 190063091)

Officers responded to the scene of a hit and run where a 28 year old pedestrian was struck by a vehicle that had fled the scene. The victim suffered serious injuries and was transported to SFGH for treatment. The Traffic Collision Investigations Unit is investigating.

## Shots Fired, Firearm Arrest

## Jan. 26, 2019 - 1:07 am – 1400 block Innes (SFPD 190064607)

Officers responded to a call of shots fried and learned from witnesses that the suspect was seen shooting a handgun in a courtyard prior to throwing in into a neighboring yard and going inside of a residence. The suspect, a convicted felon prohibited from possessing weapons, was located and arrested. The loaded **9mm pistol** was recovered and seized. The suspect was booked multiple weapons related charges.

## **Robbery**

Jan. 26, 2019 - 6:45 pm - San Bruno / Felton (SFPD 190065865)

A teenage victim was tackled by a suspect shorty getting off of a bus. As the suspect held him down, a second suspect removed his cell phone from his pocket. Both suspect fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

## **Recovered Firearm**

Jan. 26, 2019 - 10:22 pm - 800 block Larkin (SFPD 190058428)

Officers investigating a January 23<sup>rd</sup> auto burglary that involved the loss of a rifle were able to develop information that led to the location of the weapon. The **assault rifle** was recovered and seized at a location on the **800 block of Larkin**. The investigation is ongoing.

## Robbery

Jan. 28, 2019 - 2:09 am - Oakdale / Selby (SFPD 190068499)

Officers detained responded to a call of an assault and met with two victims, ages 33 and 36. The victims told the officers that they got into an altercation with a group of suspects after leaving a night club. The victims were attacked and assaulted by the suspects who stole their personal items in the process prior to fleeing on foot. This incident is under investigation.

# Department News

## SFPD Arrests Keonte Gathron in Visitacion Valley Assault Case Suspect Linked to Carjacking and Two Separate Robberies



On January 8, 2019 at approximately 6:45AM, San Francisco Police officers responded to a residence on the 1000 block of Visitacion Avenue. A witness reported seeing an unknown male suspect exit the residence from an interior staircase then walk eastbound on Visitacion Avenue.

Officers noticed that the front door of the residence was unlocked and open and searched the residence but were unable to locate the occupant. Shortly thereafter, an 88 year-old woman suffering from severe head injuries was located in a nearby park on Leland Avenue. The victim was transported to Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital where she is still being treated for her injuries.

The two incidents were linked by video surveillance footage and evidence located at the scene of the assault and the victim's residence. Investigators believe the suspect assaulted the victim, stole the keys to her residence, and

was in the process of committing a burglary at the residence when he was interrupted by a witness.

Over the course of two weeks, SFPD investigators worked tirelessly to identify the suspect. Investigators reviewed surveillance footage, conducted multiple interviews, collected evidence and distributed a forensic artist sketch of the suspect to the public for assistance in our investigation. Evidence collected from the incident was submitted to SFPD's crime lab and on January 18, investigators were notified that DNA analysis linked 18 year-old San Francisco resident Keonte Gathron to the assault and subsequent burglary.

An immediate search began to locate and apprehend Gathron. Almost simultaneously, Gathron was also identified as a suspect in a carjacking which occurred in the early morning hours of January 16, on the 1600 block of Visitacion Avenue. The carjacked vehicle was later found abandoned at gas station on San Bruno Avenue. Video evidence obtained at the scene led to the identification of Gathron as the carjacking suspect.

On Saturday, January 19 at approximately 4:45PM, a 14 yearold girl was approached on the 1000 block of Woolsey Avenue



by a suspect on a red bicycle and robbed of her cell phone at gunpoint. At approximately 6:00PM, a 17 year-old girl was approached at Charles Avenue and Belle Avenue in the Taraval district by a suspect on a red bicycle. The suspect punched the girl in the face and stole her phone.

Responding officers from Ingleside Station were able to track the cell phone to the Sunnydale district of San Francisco. During a search, officers made contact with Gathron, whose clothing matched the description of the robbery suspect. After a short foot pursuit and search, officers located Gathron hiding in a vehicle and placed him under arrest.

Gathron's charges are as follows:

Assault/Burglary Case: Attempted Murder, Kidnapping, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Elder Abuse, Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Attempting to Destroy Evidence.


Robberies: Robbery (2 counts), Child Endangerment, Possession of Stolen Property, and Resisting Arrest.

"SFPD investigators, patrol officers and our crime lab personnel worked relentlessly to identify and arrest a suspect in these brutal crimes," said San Francisco Police Chief William Scott. "We thank all of the community members who came forward to work with us and address safety concerns related to this case."

# Volunteer to serve on the San Francisco Civil Grand Jury

San Francisco Superior Court is seeking volunteers for the Civil Grand Jury. The Civil Grand Jury is the "watchdog" for the City and County of San Francisco. The Civil Grand Jury investigates the operations of City government, including officials, departments, and agencies. Each year, the Civil Grand Jury issues reports based on its findings. Those reports are heard before the Board of Supervisors.

The Civil Grand Jury will serve from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The application deadline is May 17, 2019.

#### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- 18 years of age or older and a United States citizen.
- San Francisco resident for at least the past 12 months.
- Able to commit time consistently throughout the term.
- Desire to work together with other committed San Franciscans.

## SAN FRANCISCO CIVIL GRAND JURY FACT SHEET AND SELECTION TIMELINE

#### What is the Civil Grand Jury?

- As required by the California Constitution, the Civil Grand Jury is a "watchdog" that investigates the
  operations of the City and County government, including its officers, departments, and agencies.
- The Civil Grand Jury is 19 members randomly drawn from a pool of applicants who volunteer to serve for a one year term.

#### How does it Work?

- Each Civil Grand Jury determines, by majority vote, which issues related to the government of the City
  and County of San Francisco to investigate. Typically, the Jury divides itself into committees, which carry
  out the investigations and write the reports.
- To do the investigations and write its reports, Civil Grand Jurors review records and financial documents; interview City and County department heads, elected officials, and staff; and visit government facilities. The entire Jury must vote to approve reports.
- After the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court reviews the reports to ensure they meet legal requirements, the reports are issued. The affected departments are required by law to respond to each finding and recommendation contained in the reports.
- The Board of Supervisors holds a public hearing on each report. The Civil Grand Jury presents the report, and each affected department responds. The Board of Supervisors then issues its own response.

#### When?

- The entire Civil Grand Jury meets once per week, generally in the late afternoon. Subcommittees meet as needed. Most of the Jury's work takes place during regular business hours.
- Jurors must be able to serve the entire term, from July 1 through June 30. Jurors must be able to commit time consistently throughout the term.

#### Who is Eligible?

 In order to volunteer to be considered for the Civil Grand Jury, you must be a United States citizen; at least 18 years of age; have lived in San Francisco for at least the past one year; have no felony convictions; and have the ability to communicate in English.

#### How do I Apply?

- Applications may be downloaded from http://civilgrandjury.sfgov.org/join.html, or you may pick one up at San Francisco Superior Court, 400 McAllister Street, Room 007. The application deadline is on May 17, 2019.
- The most qualified applicants will be invited to attend a mandatory informational session on May 21 or May 30, 2019.
- Selection by a panel of Superior Court Judges will be held on June 7, 2019.
- The 2019 2020 Civil Grand Jury will be trained on June 10, 17, 18, and 24, 2019.
- The 2019 2020 Civil Grand Jury takes office on July 1, 2019.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: 911 for emergencies and 3-1-1 for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. 311 relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, 311 operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the 311 call center will function as a back-up.

### Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

**Herbal Remedies** Vitamins Supplements Cosmetics Other personal care products **Compressed Cylinders** Aerosols Inhalers **Medical Devices** Sharps Illicit drugs



#### L odine containing medication.

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
