Shirley Chisholm 1924-2005

Shirley Anita St. Hill Chisholm was the first African American woman in Congress (1968) and the first woman and African American to seek the nomination for president of the United States from one of the two major political parties (1972).

Her motto and title of her autobiography—Unbossed and Unbought—illustrated her outspoken advocacy for women and minorities during her seven terms in the U.S. House of Representatives.

You may also go to any SFPD district station to make a report. Bayview Station is located at: 201 Williams avenue.

For your convenience, the following crimes may be reported on-line using the SFPD's main website

- * Harassing Phone Calls: When you are experiencing annoying calls - with no known suspects; for example, hang-ups or heavy breathing.
- * Lost Property: When property has disappeared and not stolen. If you think it could have been taken but you have no idea by who, you may enter the report online.
- * Theft: When property is stolen and there is no information about the suspect.
- * Vandalism/Graffiti: The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property, including graffiti.
- * Vehicle Burglary: When property was stolen from a vehicle and there is no suspect information.
- * Vehicle Tampering: Tampering with a motor vehicle, including vandalism/graffiti of the vehicle.

Please remember to dial "311" when you see debris on the sidewalks and streets. Together, we can keep our district clean.

I recommend using "311" to report these individuals/encampments in order to connect them with a Homeless Outreach Team or the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing. Also, "311" can connect you to DPW for the clean-up of debris and rubbish. Here is the link to the DSHS website: <http://hsh.sfgov.org>

Robbery

Jan. 28, 2019 - 2:09 am – **Oakdale / Selby** (SFPD 190053901)

Two victims, ages 36 and 33, were assaulted by a group of suspects after leaving a bar on Palou. The suspects stole property from the victims prior to fleeing the scene. Both victims suffered minor injuries and were treated at the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Shots Fired

Jan. 28, 2019 - 3:36 am – **100 block Kiska** (SFPD 190068546)

Officers responded to ShotSpotter activation and were directed by witnesses to area where a spent round was located, stating that a suspect was seen firing a gun in a southeast direction before fleeing. No damage or injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Shots Fired

Jan. 28, 2019 - 8:18 am – **1100 block Carroll** (SFPD 190068778)

Officers responded to a Shot Spotter activation and located spent rounds in street. A bedroom window at a residence on Giants Dr. had been hit by a bullet, shattering it, and waking the residents inside. No injuries were reported and no other damage located. This incident is under investigation.

Carjacking

Feb. 1, 2019 - 6:55 am – **Mansell / Brussels** (SFPD 190079305)

A 29 year old father and his son were approached by two suspects as they were getting ready to get into their parked vehicle. One suspect pointed a gun at the father and demanded his keys. The father pushed his son behind himself, to protect him, and handed the car keys over to the suspects. The suspects got into the victim's car and drove off. The Robbery Unit is investigating this incident.

Attempted Homicide Arrest

Feb. 1, 2019 - 5:40 pm – **4800 block 3rd** (SFPD 190080835)

A 26 year old male victim was shot by a suspect during an altercation that occurred at a store. A 17 year old female victim was also hit. The suspect fled the scene. Both victims were transported to SFGH for treatment. The crime scene was secured and evidence collected. Gang Task Force officers were able to identify the suspect during the course of their investigation. He was located and arrested on February 6th in Turlock, CA.

Shooting at Vehicle, Firearm Arrest

Feb 2, 2019 - 12:00 pm – **unit block Cameron** (SFPD 190082336)

Officers responded a call of shots fired and located casings next to a damaged car. Surveillance footage from the area captured video of the suspect firing at the parked car from another vehicle which fled the scene. The suspect vehicle was located in the area of **3rd / Oakdale**. The suspect was arrested and the **9mm semi-automatic pistol** was seized from his car.

Robbery

Feb. 3, 2019 - 4:00 pm – **Felton / San Bruno** (SFPD 190085352)

A 40 year old victim was driving his car when he was rear ended. He got out to check on the damage and was approached by a suspect armed with a knife. The suspect demanded his wallet and the victim complied. The suspect removed the money and threw wallet back at the victim before running off. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Feb. 3, 2019 - 10:45 pm – **Dartmouth / Mansell** (SFPD 190086093)

A 28 year old victim was driving home when he was flagged down by two suspects. They pointed to a third subject on the ground, told victim that their friend was drunk and asked the victim for a ride home. The victim agreed and all three suspects got into his car. During the ride, the victim was asked to pull over so one of them could vomit. When the victim came to a stop, the suspect sitting in the front seat produced a knife and lunged at him. The victim's hand was cut when he raised it to deflect the blade. The suspect in back seat held the victim around neck as suspect in front seat robbed him of his property. All three suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Department News

Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant


The San Francisco Police Department will conduct a Traffic Safety Enforcement Operation on February 8th with a focus on distracted driving, especially through the use of handheld cell phones and texting. Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road, or your hands off the steering wheel. These are some of the most dangerous things we do behind the wheel that many people do not think about because these actions are so common.

It is important to recognize the dangers of distracted driving. In California, cell phone laws were enacted to help prevent distracted driving and make roads safer. The law prohibits driving while holding a cell phone in your hand. If the cell phone is used in a hands-free manner, such as voice command or the use of a mounting device, it is completely legal. While driving, you can single swipe or tap the screen to activate or deactivate a feature or function, but you cannot text, scroll or tap multiple times. The law allows using your cell phone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity. Any driver under the age of 18 cannot use a cell phone or any other electronic wireless device at all (not hand-held, hands-free, Bluetooth, speaker phone, or any other means) except for the above emergency purposes.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.



on the San Francisco Civil Grand Jury**

San Francisco Superior Court is seeking volunteers for the Civil Grand Jury. The Civil Grand Jury is the "watchdog" for the City and County of San Francisco. The Civil Grand Jury investigates the operations of City government, including officials, departments, and agencies. Each year, the Civil Grand Jury issues reports based on its findings. Those reports are heard before the Board of Supervisors.

The Civil Grand Jury will serve from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The application deadline is May 17, 2019.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 18 years of age or older and a United States citizen.
- San Francisco resident for at least the past 12 months.
- Able to commit time consistently throughout the term.
- Desire to work together with other committed San Franciscans.

What is the Civil Grand Jury?

- As required by the California Constitution, the Civil Grand Jury is a "watchdog" that investigates the operations of the City and County government, including its officers, departments, and agencies.
- The Civil Grand Jury is 19 members randomly drawn from a pool of applicants who volunteer to serve for a one year term.

How does it Work?

- Each Civil Grand Jury determines, by majority vote, which issues related to the government of the City and County of San Francisco to investigate. Typically, the Jury divides itself into committees, which carry out the investigations and write the reports.
- To do the investigations and write its reports, Civil Grand Jurors review records and financial documents; interview City and County department heads, elected officials, and staff; and visit government facilities. The entire Jury must vote to approve reports.
- After the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court reviews the reports to ensure they meet legal requirements, the reports are issued. The affected departments are required by law to respond to each finding and recommendation contained in the reports.
- The Board of Supervisors holds a public hearing on each report. The Civil Grand Jury presents the report, and each affected department responds. The Board of Supervisors then issues its own response.

When?

- The entire Civil Grand Jury meets once per week, generally in the late afternoon. Subcommittees meet as needed. Most of the Jury's work takes place during regular business hours.
- Jurors must be able to serve the entire term, from July 1 through June 30. Jurors must be able to commit time consistently throughout the term.

Who is Eligible?

- In order to volunteer to be considered for the Civil Grand Jury, you must be a United States citizen; at least 18 years of age; have lived in San Francisco for at least the past one year; have no felony convictions; and have the ability to communicate in English.

How do I Apply?

- Applications may be downloaded from <http://civilgrandjury.sfgov.org/join.html>, or you may pick one up at San Francisco Superior Court, 400 McAllister Street, Room 007. The application deadline is on May 17, 2019.
- The most qualified applicants will be invited to attend a mandatory informational session on May 21 or May 30, 2019.
- Selection by a panel of Superior Court Judges will be held on June 7, 2019.
- The 2019 - 2020 Civil Grand Jury will be trained on June 10, 17, 18, and 24, 2019.
- The 2019 - 2020 Civil Grand Jury takes office on July 1, 2019.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back-up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

**Herbal Remedies
Vitamins
Supplements
Cosmetics
Other personal care products
Compressed Cylinders
Aerosols
Inhalers
Medical Devices
Sharps
Illicit drugs
Lodine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
