



Mission Incidents

Robbery, Commercial Establishment W/Weapon/ Assault, Aggravated. W/Other Weapon/ Probation Violation

On 01/01/2019 at approximately 2133 hours, Officer Ospital and Officer Marcic were on uniformed patrol while driving a marked police vehicle. They responded to the 3100 block of 16th St. regarding a fight with weapons. Officers Connell and Officer Kajasa were on scene and detained a subject, later identified as suspect 1. (B1) Byron Hood.

Officer Kajasa located a glass pipe on the sidewalk in front of the above address. Upon arrival Officer Marcic spoke with reporting victim 1 who said he is an employee at the K&D Market and at approximately 2130 hours, suspect 1 walked into this premise and picked up the a bag of chips, and beef jerky. Suspect 1 walked past the line of sale and reporting victim 1 asked suspect 1 if he had money to pay for the above listed items. Suspect 1 refused to answer and reporting victim 1 asked suspect 1 to put the items on counter. Suspect 1 complied then exited the premise. Suspect 1 then walked back in angrily with his fists balled up and walked to the counter. Suspect 1 picked up the items he put down on the counter originally and walked towards the exit. Reporting victim 1 attempted to block suspect 1 from exiting with a wooden pole. Suspect 1 then took the wooden pole from reporting victim 1's hand and began to swing the wooden pole towards reporting victim 1 striking him and then proceeded to strike the front glass window of the premises. Officers Connell and Officer Kajasa transported suspect 1 to Mission Station where he was subsequently booked on the charges listed above.

Malicious Mischief, Vandalism to Vehicle Burglary Vehicle, Att.

On 12/24/2018 at approximately 1820 hours, Officer Deidrick and Officer Portillo were in full police uniform, driving a marked San Francisco Police Department vehicle when they responded to 16th Street and San Bruno Avenue, regarding an auto burglary.

Upon arrival Officer Portillo observed a female suspect 1 on 16th Street, next to the driver side door of a red Lexus SC400 with a black knife in an unknown hand. Suspect 1 appeared to be sticking the knife into area of the driver side door handle of the driver door. Officer Deidrick told suspect 1 to drop the knife and suspect 1 complied. Suspect 1 told Officer Portillo that the vehicle belonged to her. Officer Portillo did a computer check on the red Lexus and it showed it was registered to reporting victim 1.

Mission Incidents continued

Officer Deidrick seized a knife from under the red Lexus. Officer Deidrick spoke to reporting witness 1, he told her at approximately 1653 hours he was driving by on 16th Street when he observed a subject sticking a knife inside the driver side door lock and also waving the knife in the air and yelling at passerby's before he called the police. Officer Chicas, Officer Perez, Sergeant Russell and Sergeant Petuya responded to the scene as backup. Officer Portillo spoke with reporting victim 1 via phone and he came to the scene. Reporting victim 1 stated that he did not know suspect 1 and she did not have permission to enter or use his vehicle. Reporting victim 1 checked his vehicle for damage and observed that there was damage to the driver side door and that the door lock was damaged. Reporting victim 1 told me the damage to his door was new and was not there prior to today. Officer Portillo called the Serramonte Lexus dealership and informed them of the damage to reporting victim 1's vehicle who estimated the cost of the damages to be \$570. Suspect 1 was transported to Mission Station where she was booked on the above listed charges.




