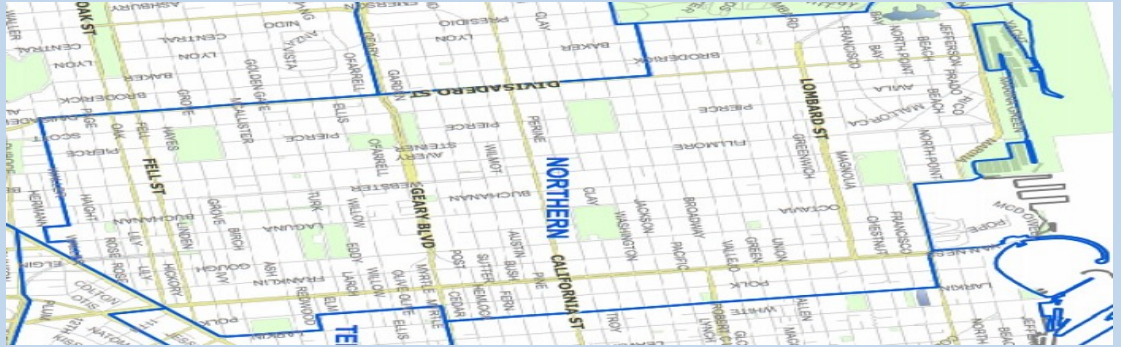

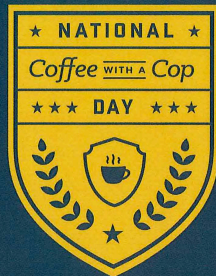

Incident Recaps

On 09/12/18 at approximately 09:33 AM, Northern units responded to the area of Van Ness and Fern Streets regarding an auto burglary. Upon arrival, police immediately detained one subject while another suspect fled on a bicycle.

A witness approached the officers and informed them the suspect who was detained was involved in the auto burglary. Officers located property which was taken from the vehicle on the detained suspect. The detained suspect was booked for his involvement for the auto burglary along with an outstanding warrant and narcotics offenses. The suspect which fled is still outstanding.

On 09/13/18 at approximately 12:57 AM, Northern station officers located a wanted suspect near the intersection of Divisadero and Fell Streets. The suspect was wanted for a previous burglary in a neighboring district on 09/09/18.

While searching the suspect prior to transporting him to the station, officers located a large amount of burglary tools which were seized as evidence.

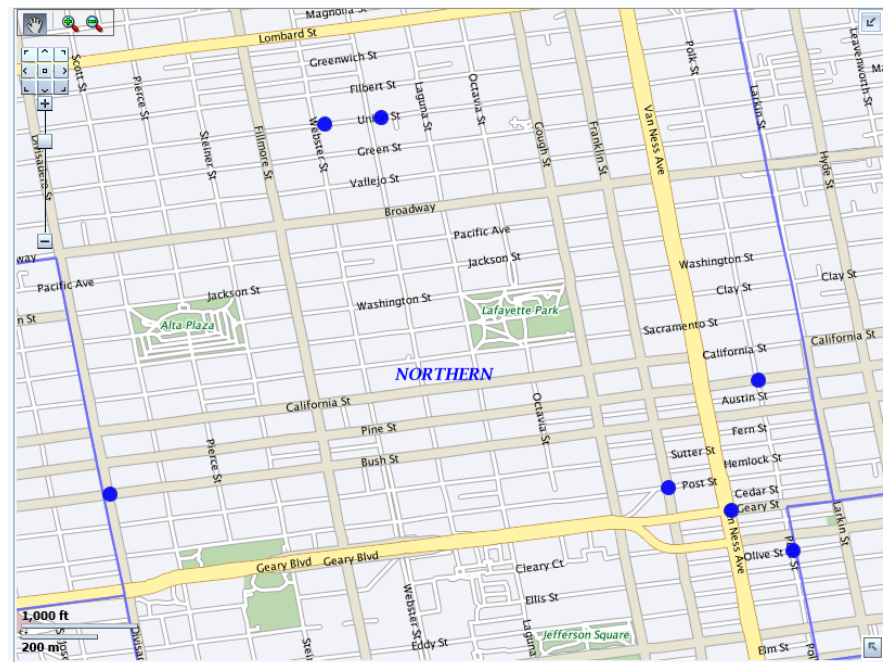

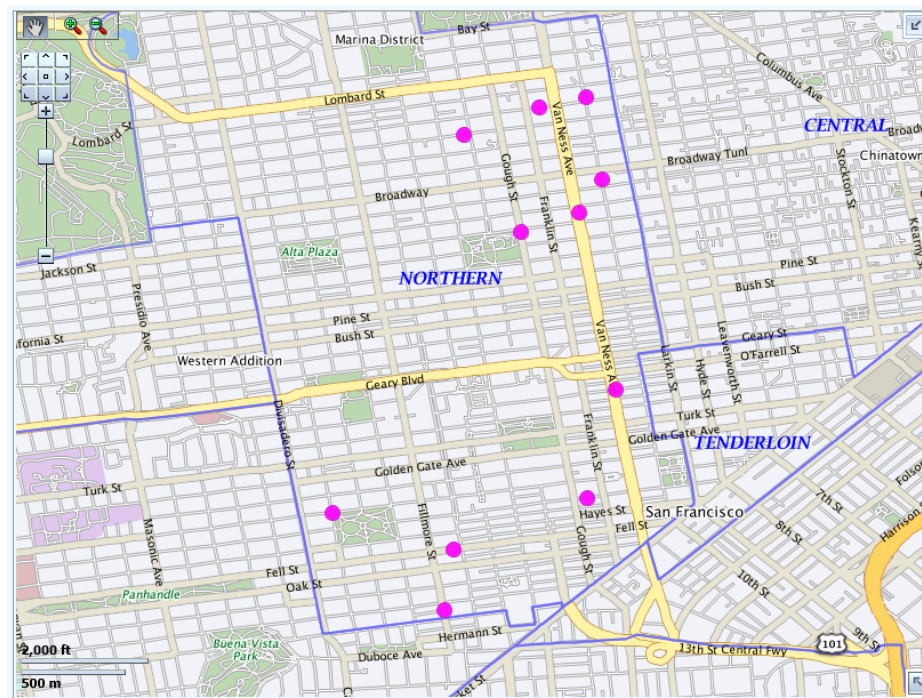


Burglary Statistics 09/11/18 - 09/17/18

SF SAFE offers a range of FREE safety services to San Francisco residents. These services include: Personal safety, child safety, neighborhood watch groups, home security, and many many more!

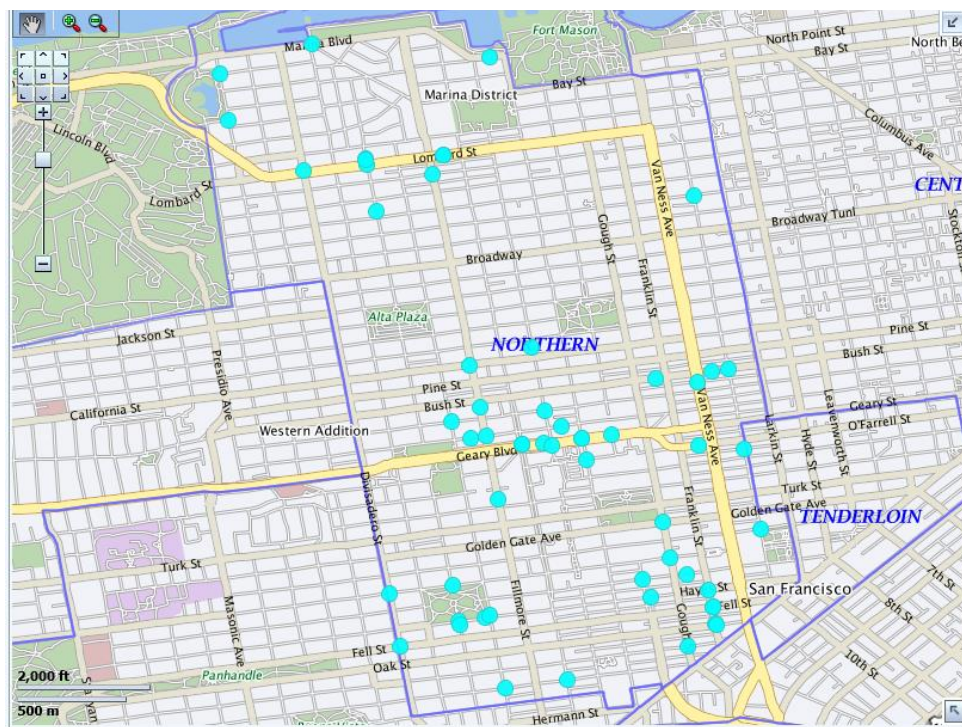
