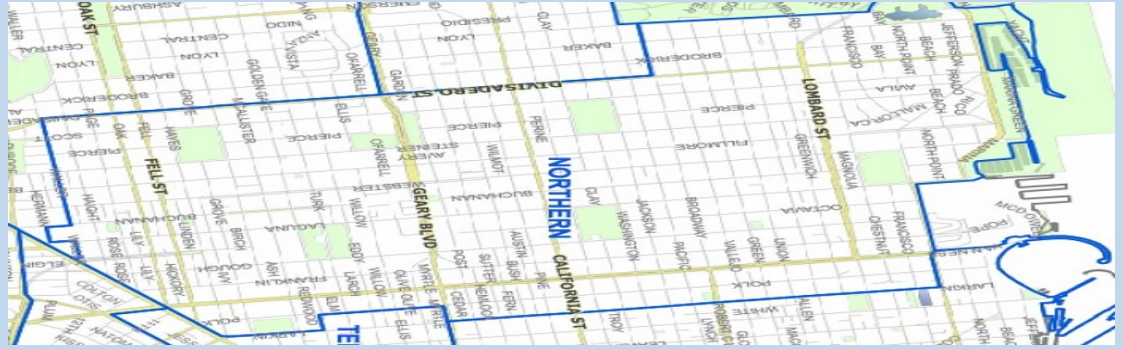

INCIDENT RECAP

On 09/18/18 at approximately 02:42 PM, Sergeants from Gang Task Force were in the area of Alamo Square due to the fact this area has seen an uptick in criminal activity. They were in plainclothes driving an unmarked police vehicle. They on-viewed a robbery in progress and immediately engaged in a foot pursuit. As the subject was being chased, an officer noticed a high-capacity pistol magazine in the subject's possession. Officers eventually caught up with the subject, gave commands for him to raise his hands, which he complied. The officer then seized the loaded .40 caliber Glock pistol. Northern officers located the female tourist victim who confirmed that the suspect tried to rob her.

On 09/19/18 at approximately 04:59 PM, While on patrol in the area of Japantown, Northern Station Street Crimes officers witnessed a victim chasing two subjects yelling: "Give me back my phone!" As officers began the pursuit of the subjects, an officer recognized one subject from prior arrests, and eventually located and arrested them without further incident. The victim saw the officers take the subjects into custody and they were positively identified as that perpetrators who stole her phone. The phone was located on top of a roof to a business the suspect discarded as they were being chased.

4. Schedule your exam.
5. You will receive an email confirming your exam date, time and location.
