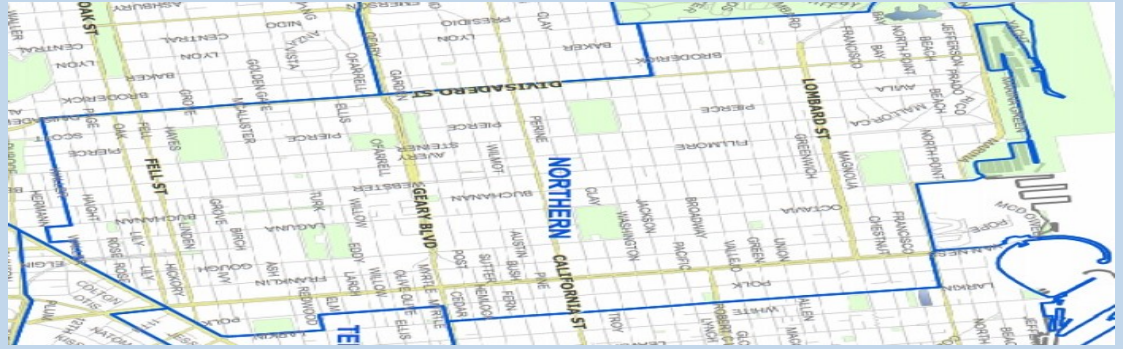

INCIDENT RECAP

On 10/07/18 at approximately 09:45 AM, Northern officers responded to a call at 640 Steiner Street regarding two subjects breaking into vehicles. Officers responded to the area and detained both subjects who were walking away from the scene. The officers met with the reporting party who could identify the subject who broke into the car and the other who reached inside. He also took photos of the subjects during the commission of the crime. Officers conducted a positive cold show with the witness and arrested both subjects accordingly. One subject possessed a spark plug chip and the other subject is on probation for auto burglary.

On 10/06/18 at approximately 10:45PM, Officers located a stolen vehicle being driven by a female subject near Steiner and Filbert Streets. Officers effected a traffic stop. Officers spoke with the registered owner who stated that he was on a date with the subject, who had asked to borrow his keys in order to buy cigarettes. When the subject did not return, the victim reported the vehicle as stolen. The vehicle was recovered without further incident and stored at Auto Return.

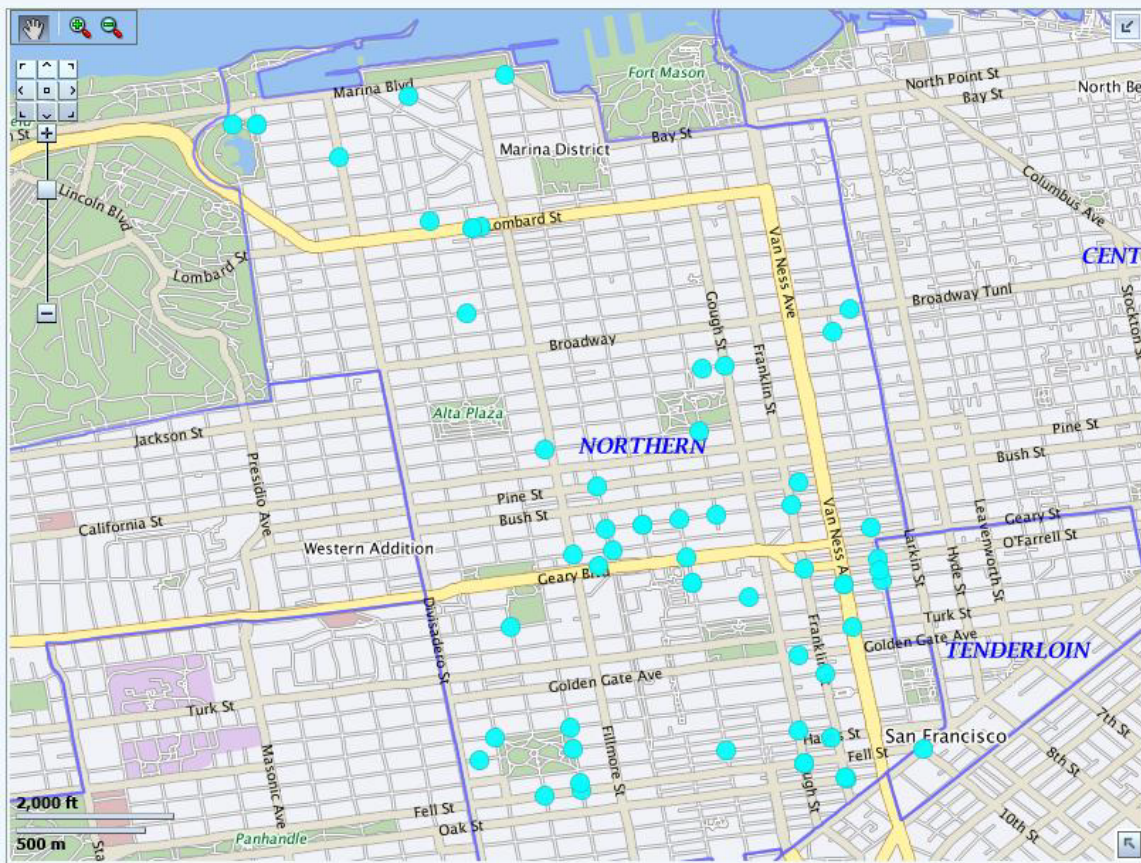

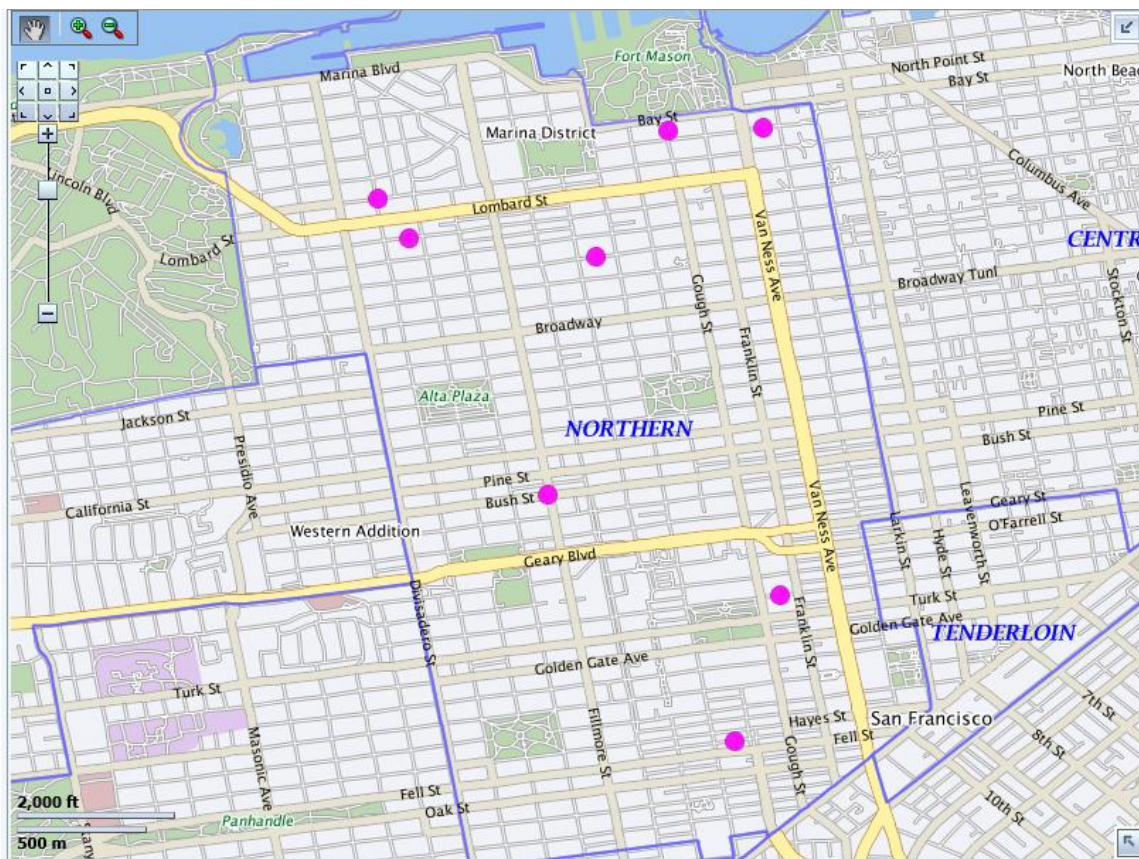

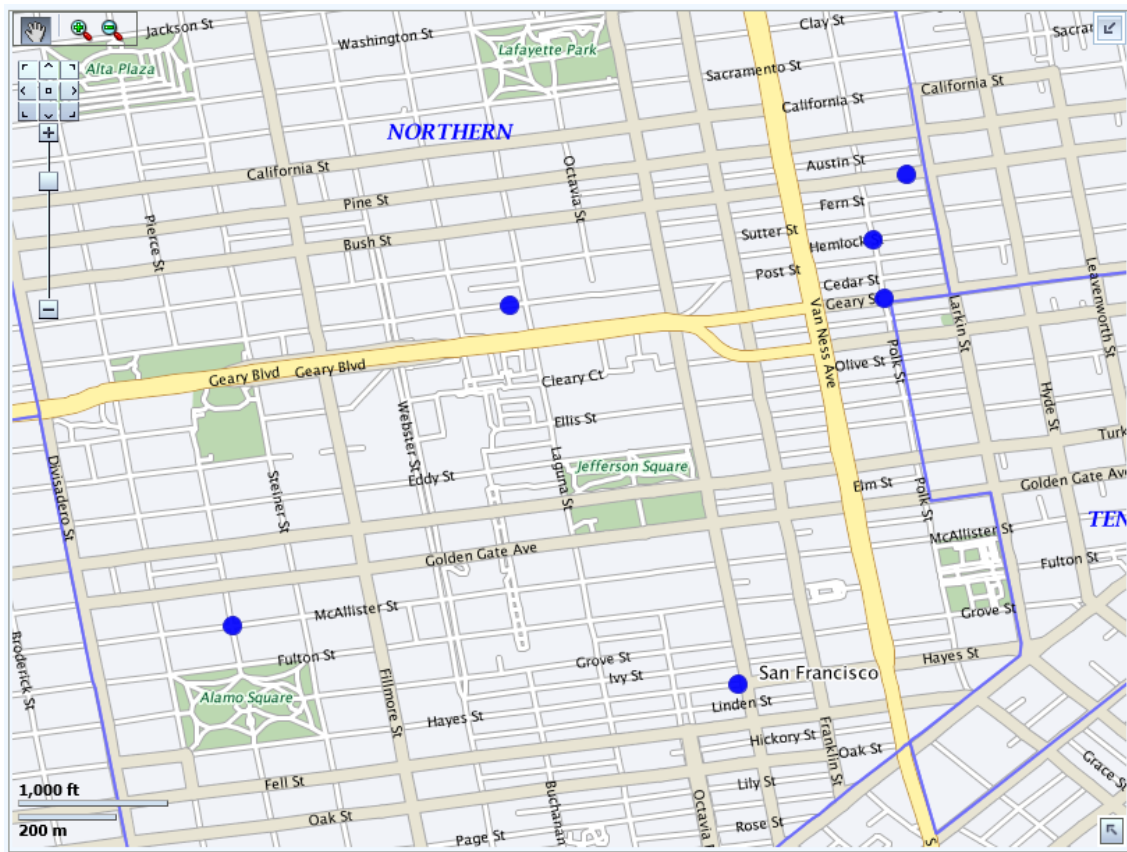

4. Schedule your exam.
5. You will receive an email confirming your exam date, time and location.
