Captain Joe Engler's Message

Residents, merchants, and visitors,

With the return of the electric scooter rentals hitting San Francisco's streets this week, I wanted to offer some pointers and advice in order to maintain public safety for everyone on the streets:

First, if you rent an electric scooter to get from point A to point B, please wear a helmet. Not only is it the law, but it is the most important piece of safety equipment you can wear to protect your overall health.

Secondly, operating an electric scooter is only permitted to be used in the streets. This means no use on the sidewalks. If scooters are being used on a sidewalk it increases the risk of injury to pedestrians using the sidewalks, especially the elderly. Let's be considerate to all of our city's residents and visitors who are walking to their destination. And again, there is a law established prohibiting the use of the scooters on the sidewalk.

Third, when operating an electric scooter, California Vehicle Code does not allow multiple people to ride on a single scooter at once.

And lastly, if you use a motor vehicle to get around in San Francisco like so many people do, please be cautious and attentive behind the wheel. More now than ever, multiple means of transportation are becoming available to people and it is important to have respect for everyone using their preferred transportation.

INCIDENT RECAP

On 10/10/18 at approximately 03:46 AM, Northern officers Northern Station Street Crimes officers were in an unmarked vehicle on the 800 block of Geary Street when they noticed a suspicious person concealing narcotics. This particular area receives numerous citizen complaints regarding illicit drug sales. It has been the focus of enhanced policing enforcement. Officers located a tin can used by the suspect to conceal narcotics for sales and detained him without incident. Methamphetamine, heroin, and cocaine was seized and booked.

On 10/13/18 at approximately 12:58AM, Officers responded to report of a burglary in progress on the 1200 block of Fulton Street. The suspect was reported to be in the backyard of the residence. Upon arrival officers saw suspect walking down driveway and onto sidewalk and heading east on Fulton. Officers approached suspect and attempted to detain suspect without initial success. A violent struggle ensued as officers called for more assistance. Officers were finally able to overcome resistance and place the suspect into custody. Several officers suffered minor injuries. The subject was transported to ZSFGH for altered mental status. The suspect was cleared from the hospital and transported to county jail on above listed charges. After further investigation with the reporting party, officers determined that the subject entered the backyard through an open garage door and was unresponsive to questions by homeowners who then summoned police for help.

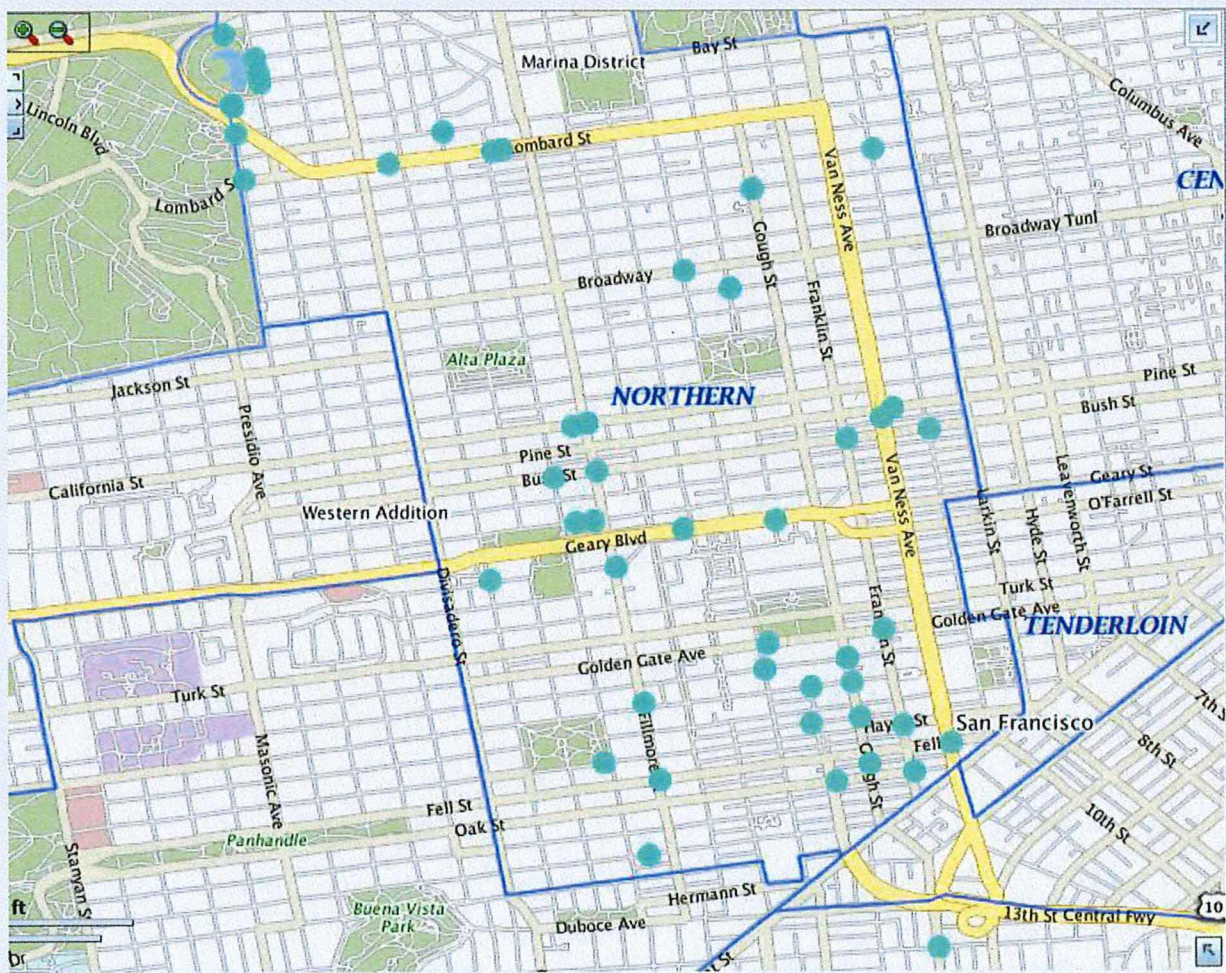

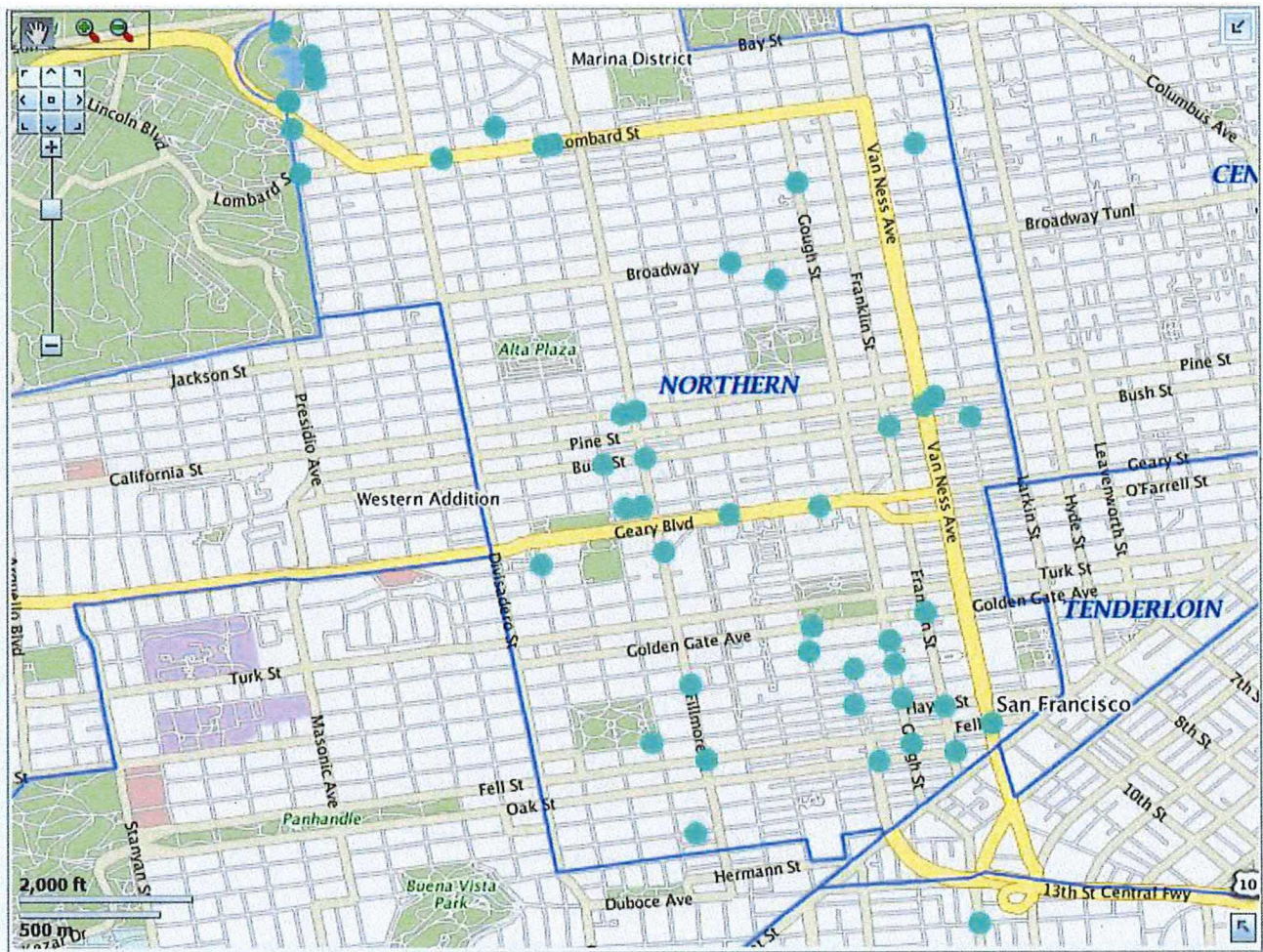

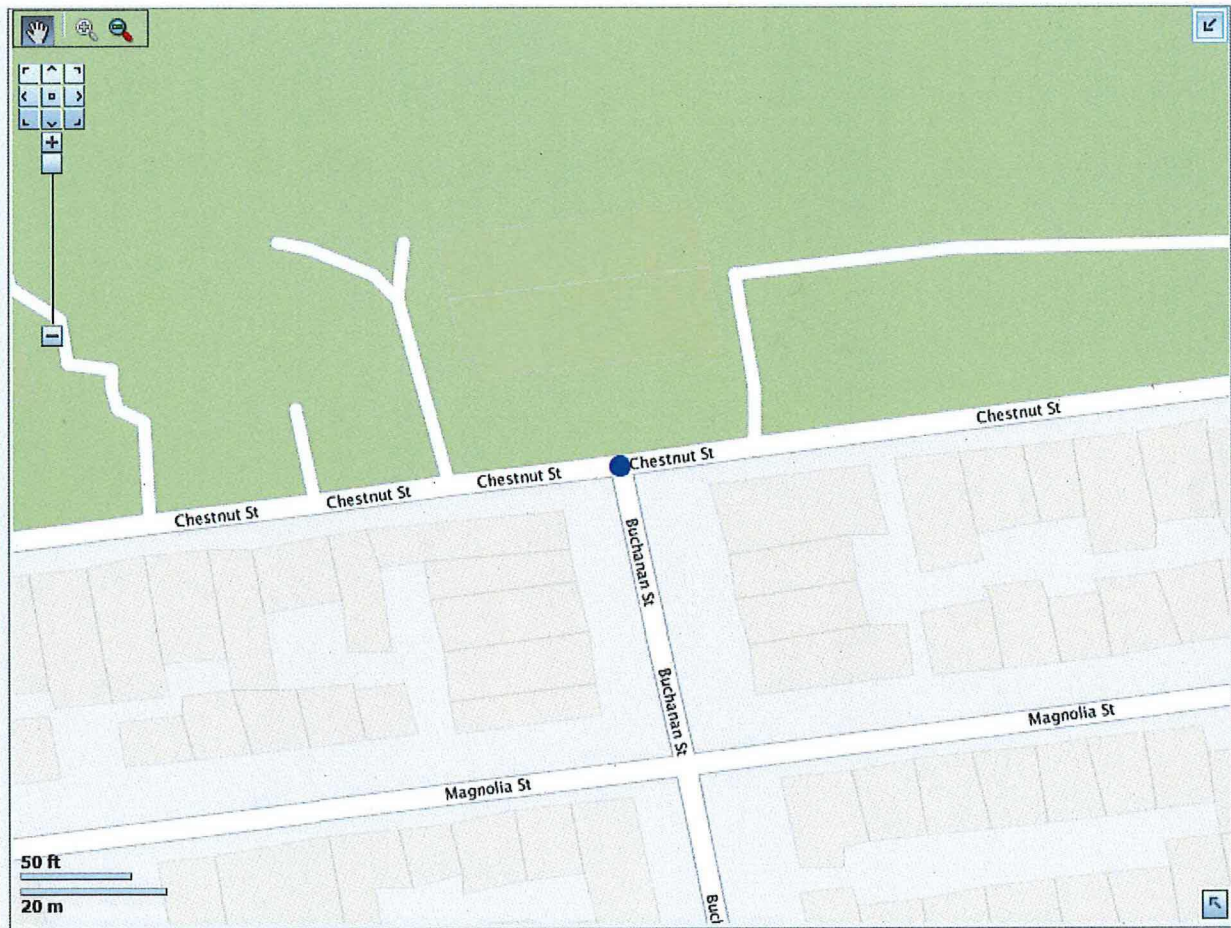
