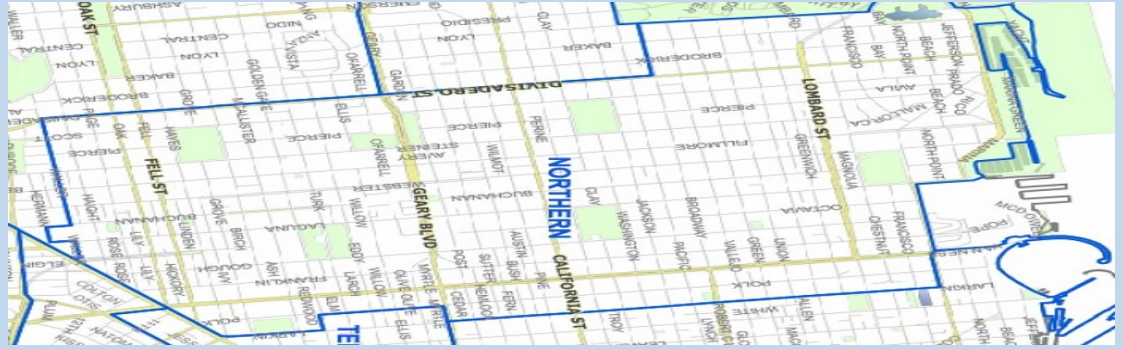

### Captain Joe Engler's Message

Residents, merchants, and visitors,

When the smoke from the Camp Fire located in Paradise entered San Francisco yesterday, I could not help but to take a minute and focus my thoughts on those being directly impacted by the fire. With Paradise being located less than 200 miles away from our city, I thought it would be a good opportunity to introduce the National Fire Protection Association to people who may not know about it.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has a website that is full of information to help prepare people if a fire were to take place in or out of their homes. The website covers so many topics that can be so helpful to all of us, however I just want to point out a few that I think we as San Franciscans should keep in mind.

If there are multiple people living in your residence, take a few minutes and develop a plan in case of an emergency, like a fire. When you are able to develop the plan, practice it a few times. And most importantly, when you plan your escape routes, make sure they are clear of debris and large objects that might hinder you getting outside.

Also, set up your home to work with you in case of a fire. Smoke and carbon monoxide alarms play such a tremendous role in aiding your awareness in case of an emergency. If you have sprinklers in your home, know that the NFPA's report states 97 percent of house fires are contained to the room of origin when a home is equipped with a sprinkler system.

## **INCIDENT RECAP**

**On October 29, 2018 a violent strong-arm robbery occurred on the MUNI 38 line in the area of Geary and Laguna. Video surveillance showed the suspect drag the victim nearly off the bus as he struggled to take her phone. Northern Station's video retrieval officer obtained this video evidence and issued a crime alert. Several officers assisted in identifying Smith and alerting investigators to the fact he is known to frequent the Mid-Market Street corridor. On November 3, 2018, Northern Station Street Crimes officers located the suspect at Market and 4th Street as he awaited to board a MUNI bus. Officers mirandized Smith and he admitted that it was him in the crime alert flyer. He refused to further elaborate.**

**On 11/03/18 at 5:27PM, Northern Station Street Crimes officers observed an auto burglary occur in the area of Fulton and Steiner (Alamo Square). Officers observed a black Chevrolet Impala with tinted windows involved in the crime. Officers had been investigating a series of auto burglaries in the district and had information that this type of vehicle was involved with a known suspect. The S.F. Sheriff's were contacted who had access to the suspect's ankle monitor. Northern units were able to track him to his home in the Bayview District. Both the suspect and vehicle were located and taken into custody without incident.**
