## **INCIDENT RECAP**

**On 11/16/18, Officers responded to Polk street regarding a burglary. The victims stated that upon returning to the hotel, they noticed that the screen on their room was removed and window open. After investigation of the room, the officer noticed the bathroom door locked. Believing the subject to be inside, the officer ordered the subject to exit the bathroom. The subject was in possession of items belonging to the victims and was arrested without incident.**

**On 11/18/18, Officer was flagged down and directed to a group of victims. Officer observed four victims who sustained multiple injuries. Upon interviewing one victim, they stated the group was waiting for rides outside of a bar when they were approached by the subject. The subject proceeded to flirt with one of the victims who continued to ignore the subject. Another victim tried to get the subject to stop harassing the initial victim. During this time, the subject threw a punch and began attacking all four victims, knocking one out in the process. At some point during the fight, the subject hit the victim over the head with a bottle. The subject fled the scene and was later arrested by officers a block away. A cold show was used to positively identify the subject. The intoxicated subject was arrested without incident.**

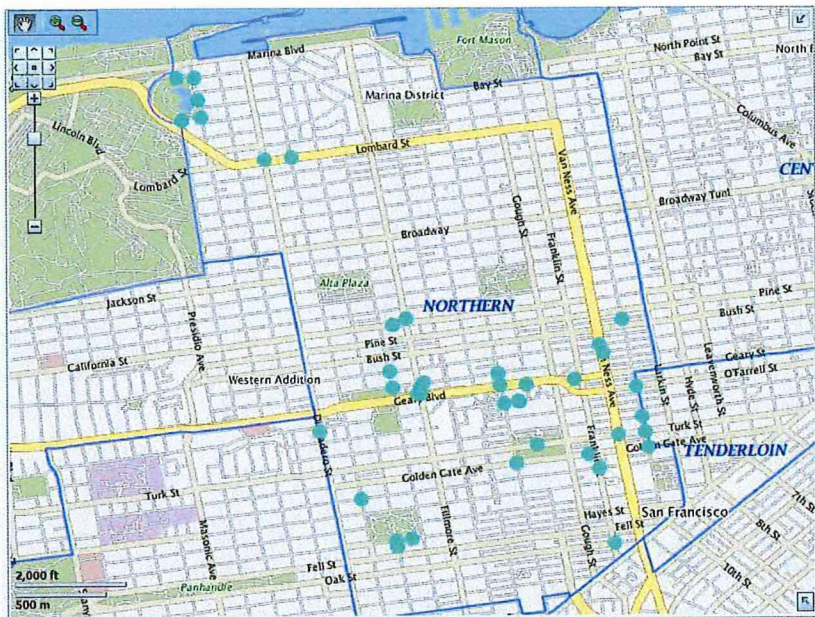

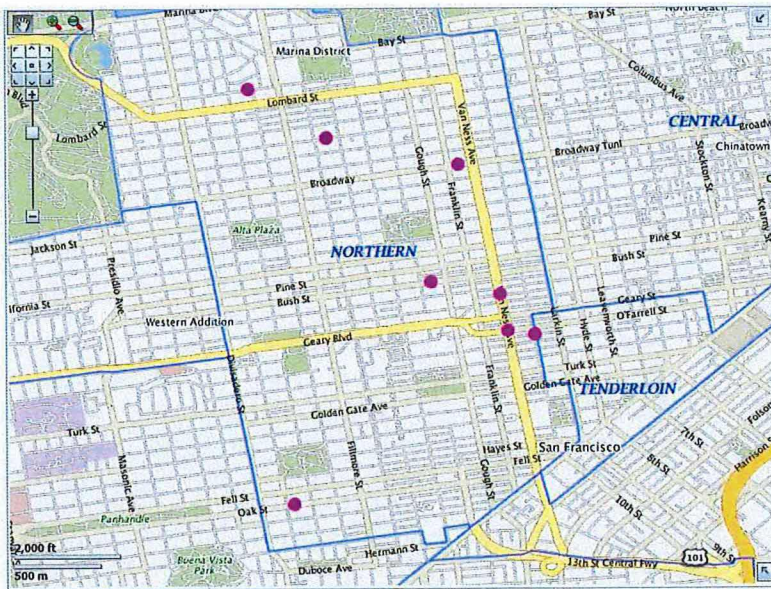

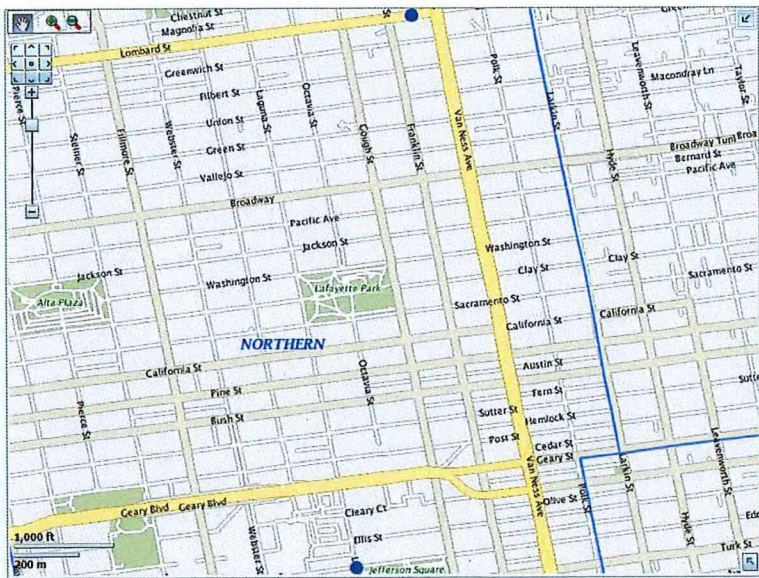
