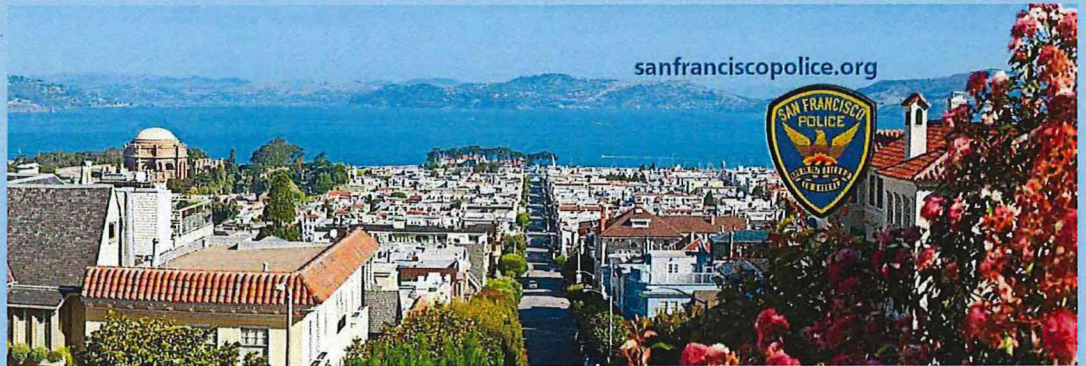

SF Toy Drive



In collaboration with Walgreens drugstores, the San Francisco Police Department has launched its 2018 Holiday Toy Drive, benefitting children in need.

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 12/5/18, Northern Street Crimes unit were patrolling Japan Town when an officer witnessed a possible burglary suspect. Officers witnessed the suspect casing multiple vehicles with a flashlight and eventually broke into the victim's car. Officers approached the subject who then fled on foot, jumped a fence, and attempted to evade police before ultimately being arrested. Officers were able to contact the victim and the suspect was booked without any further incidents.

On 12/9/18, Officers responded to a call of a robbery. The victim told officers that she was walking in the area, holding her cell phone, when the suspects came up from behind her and knocked her phone to the ground and stole it. The victim then chased after the suspect and was punched in the face. The victim continued to follow suspect when two other subjects joined the first suspect and started to pass the phone amongst themselves as the victim continued to attempt to retrieve her phone. The victim eventually lost sight of the subjects. Officers from tenderloin station located the subjects nearby. Officers then conducted a positive cold show and the subjects were arrested without incident. There are two outstanding suspects in this case.

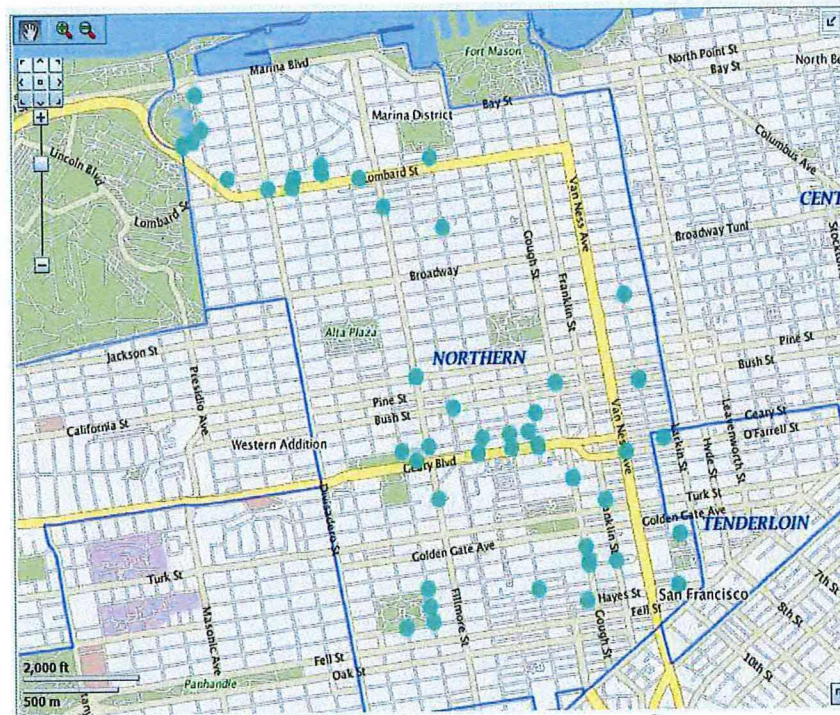

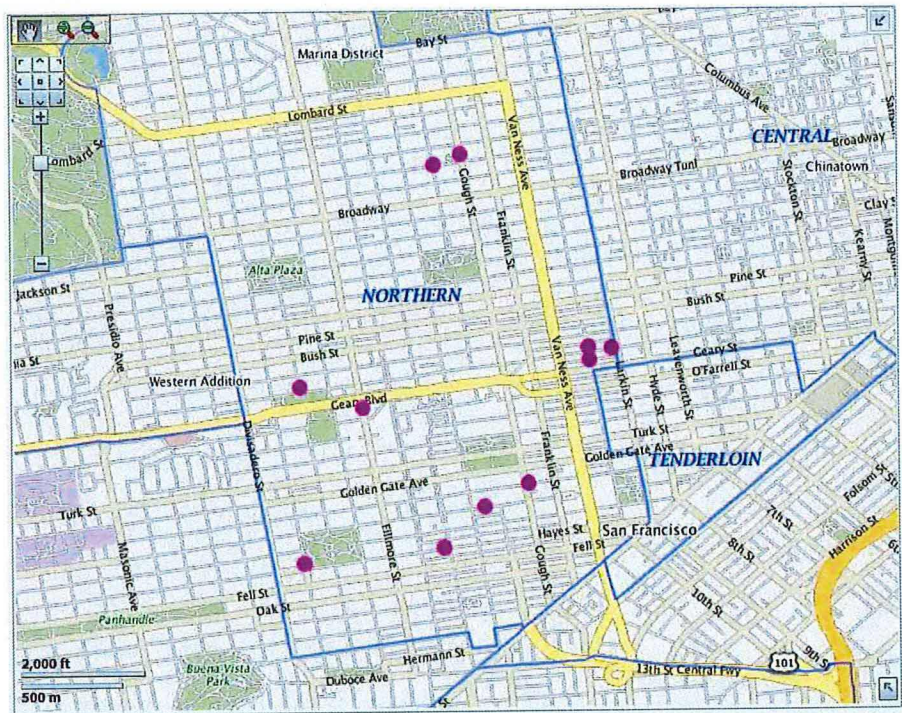

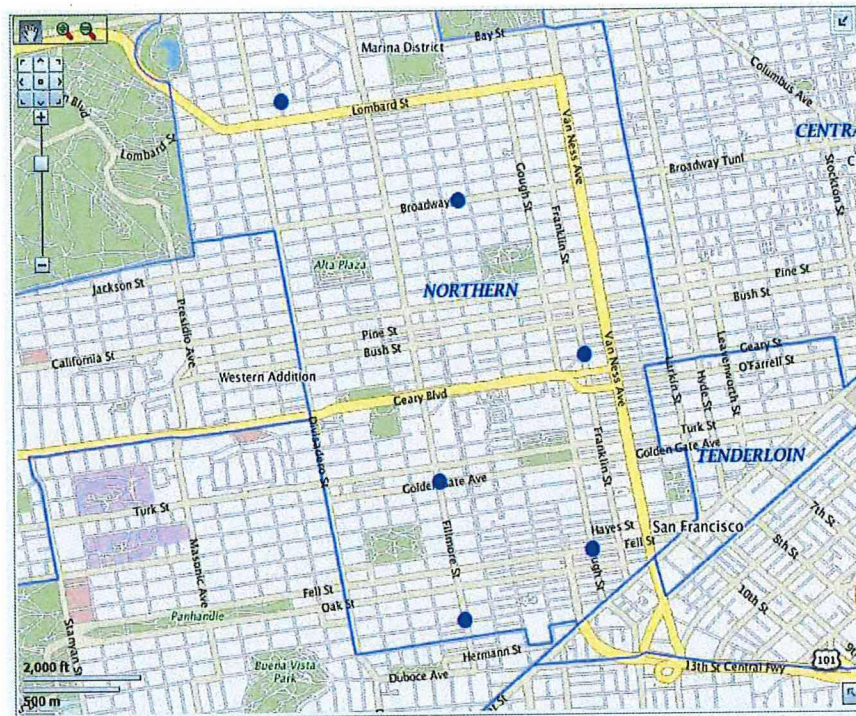

Safe Shopper San Francisco 2018



During this holiday season, the Police Department will be working to enhance safety for residents, visitors, and shoppers. There will be increased foot patrols to shopping areas throughout the city, including the horse/mounted unit, plain clothes officers, and traffic enforcement.

- **Stay alert when using electronic devices. Limit your distractions.**
- **Always be alert to your surroundings and have your keys in your hand as you approach your vehicle.**
- **Park Smart: Help avoid vehicle break-ins, leave nothing visible in your car. Consider moving your vehicle to a different location each time you load packages in the trunk. Try to use parking lots where there are parking attendants.**
- **Keep your wallet in a hard-to-reach place and carry only the cash and credit cards that you will need to complete your shopping.**
- **If someone demands your purse, wallet, or packages, surrender them, make note of the suspect's description and direction they flee and call 911. Property can be replaced.**
- **"If you see something, say something." If you witness criminal activity or see something or someone suspicious, flag down a police officer, call 911 or contact security.**
- **Use 311 to report auto burglaries.**
- **Shop with a companion, especially after dark, whenever possible.**
- **Shield your PIN when using ATMs or other electronic devices in public.**

3. Choose an available exam date that's convenient for you.
4. Schedule your exam.
5. You will receive an email confirming your exam date, time and location.
