

Residents, merchants, and visitors,

Ice skating at the Civic Center, tree and toy giveaways at the Fillmore Mini-Park, carolers making the rounds in Cow Hollow and a few lingering elves on Polk Street are all reminders that the holiday season is upon us. While many of us are lucky to enjoy the riches of an abundance of friends and family during this celebratory season, I want to give special acknowledgment to a special group of people within our community.

The Northern district has so many kind citizens who champion those who find themselves facing challenges and adversity this time of year. Mary Conde of Another Planet Productions has collected over 2,000 toys for donation to needy children from anonymous donors attending concerts at the Bill Graham Civic Center. The Guardsmen, a philanthropic organization of professionals who year in and year out raise money to champion sending 2000+ kids to Summer camp and providing funds to subsidize private education for over 200 at-risk youth. Rob Connolly of the San Francisco Boys and Girls Club, an organization that secured 412 jobs for teens and \$982,000 in college scholarships for San Francisco youth in 2018. Reverend Dr. Amos C. Brown of the Third Baptist Church spearheaded the "Bridge to Arts and Music" after-school program for San Francisco youth. This particular program brought together the SF Conservatory of Music, Third Baptist Church, Congregation Emanu-El, and the San Francisco Interfaith Council, with support from the Koret Foundation and Yamaha Music / Music Exchange to bring a first class music program to the Fillmore.

There are so many champions of our community that very quietly and selflessly toil away to make our neighborhoods great and to bring hope to our most vulnerable. As we bring this year to a close and celebrate the holidays, the men and women of Northern Station salute you.

SFPD members teamed with SF Housing Authority, SF Park and Rec, NBA star Baron Davis, and Justin Alford from Steezy Cares put together an awesome community outreach. Toys and Christmas trees were given to community members in need this holiday season.







#### **INCIDENT RECAPS**

On 12/10/18, a home invasion robbery occurred and various property was stolen, including credit cards that were later used to commit fraud. A department wide email was distributed with an attempt to identify the subjects seen in the video surveillance.

On12/15/18, Officers responded to a call of a robbery at Walgreens Drugstore. Upon arrival, the Walgreens security officer (victim), pointed officers in the direction of the suspects; one of which was located hiding in a nearby parking lot. The subject was positively identified by the victim. The victim stated that the subject was a habitual shoplifter and had entered the store with three other suspects. All four suspects were see putting various amounts of cosmetic products in their bags. The victim instructed the suspects to surrender the stolen property, to which they refused. At one point, a physical altercation ensued, and one suspect threw a shopping basket at the victim, striking him in the head. All four suspects fled the store before officers arrived. At this time, one subject was arrested, one admonished, and two are still outstanding and unidentified.

On 12/17/18, while on patrol, Northern Housing Officers detained one subject believed to be one of the suspects. The sergeants assigned to the case (Robbery Detail) responded to the scene and recognized the subject from the video surveillance to be wearing the same hoodie. During an interview, the subject admitted to being at one of the stores where the credit card was fraudulently used. Also during the interview, the subject denied partaking in this robbery, but admitted to being in the presence of the other two suspects acting as a


"look out" during a different robbery. The subject was subsequently arrested without incident.





### Safe Shopper San Francisco 2018



During this holiday season, the Police Department will be working to enhance safety for residents, visitors, and shoppers. There will be increased foot patrols to shopping areas throughout the city, including the horse/mounted unit, plain clothes officers, and traffic enforcement.

- •Stay alert when using electronic devices. Limit your distractions.
- •Always be alert to your surroundings and have your keys in your hand as you approach your vehicle.
- Park Smart: Help avoid vehicle break-ins, leave nothing visible in your car. Consider moving your vehicle to a
  different location each time you load packages in the trunk. Try to use parking lots where there are parking
  attendants.
- Keep your wallet in a hard-to-reach place and carry only the cash and credit cards that you will need to complete your shopping.
- •If someone demands your purse, wallet, or packages, surrender them, make note of the suspect's description and direction they flee and call 911. Property can be replaced.
- "If you see something, say something." If you witness criminal activity or see something or someone suspicious, flag down a police officer, call 911 or contact security.
- •• Use 311 to report auto burglaries.
- Shop with a companion, especially after dark, whenever possible.
- •Shield your PIN when using ATMs or other electronic devices in public.
