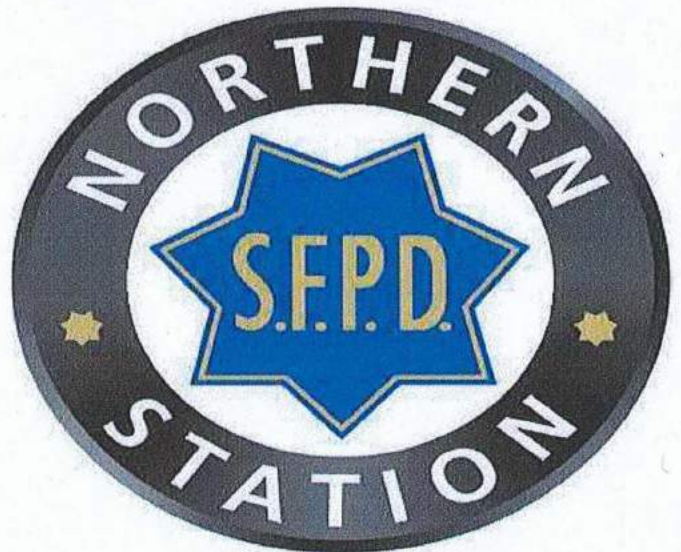
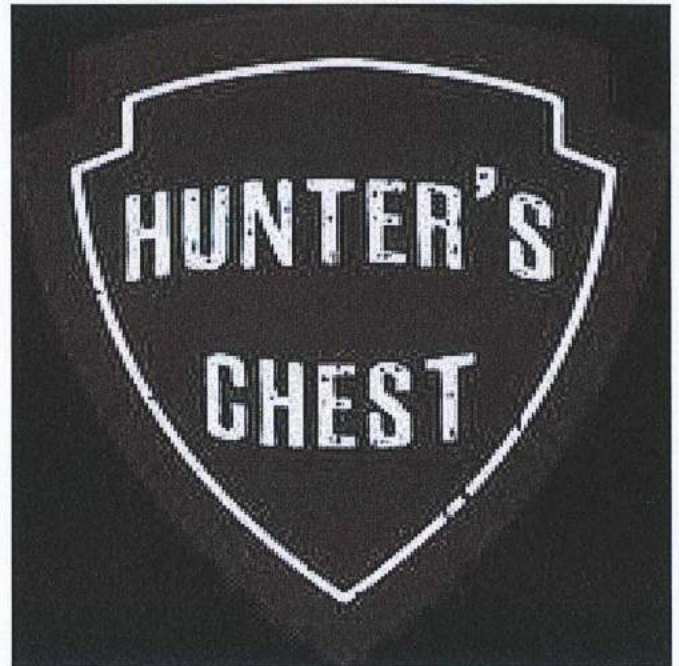

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 3/18/19 at about 0102 hours, Officers responded to a call of a burglary in the area of Van Ness/Geary. While in route, officers witnessed a vehicle speeding away from the area and running stop lights. Officers believed the vehicle may have been involved with the burglary due to its reckless behavior, and proximity to the burglary. Once officers caught up with the vehicle, they effected a traffic stop. Believing the subjects may have been involved in the burglary, officers ordered the occupants to exit the vehicle in order to conduct a cursory search for weapon on their persons, with negative results. After officers did a computer search on the driver of the vehicle, it was determined that he was on probation, has a restraining order prohibiting him from possessing firearms, a suspended license, and has a warrant-less search condition. Due to these facts, the officers determined the vehicle the subject was driving needed to be towed. During an inventory search of the vehicle, officers located a loaded firearm, with extended magazine concealed in the center console. All subjects were then placed under arrest for possession of the firearm.

On 3/16/19, swing watch officers responded to 2083 Union St. (Sephora) in regards to the theft of over \$1600 worth of perfume products. The responding officers were able to get photos of the suspects and the photos were then sent out to all units via a crime bulletin. On 03/19/19, officers from the Tenderloin police district spotted one of the suspects from the crime bulletin and made contact with him. The officers positively identified the suspect and placed him under arrest & transported him to Northern Station where he was booked on grand theft and conspiracy. Late that same day a swing watch Sergeant from Northern Station was on patrol and recognized the other suspect from the crime. The Sergeant made contact with suspect, positively identified her, and placed her under arrest for grand theft, conspiracy, and a probation violation.

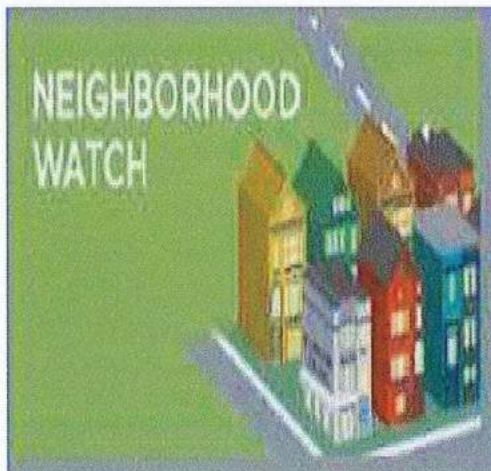


Safety-San Francisco

SAFE, with support from SFPD and DPW, will get Neighborhood Watch signs installed on individual blocks. Groups are able to apply for Neighborhood Watch signs after forming active groups. Signs are a way to publicize the efforts of your group, letting others know that yours is a SAFE neighborhood and one in which crime will not be tolerated.
