

Hello Richmond District Residents,




OFFICER OF THE MONTH ANNA CUTHBERTSON

CITIZENS OF THE MONTH LINDA AND WILSON LEE



DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily in jury.

** Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault—Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.


Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Burglary 10/23/18 1545 Hours 400 Block 9th Ave

The Victim was home when her dog started barking. The Victim looked at surveillance video and saw a suspect stealing a package from behind her security gate. Units responded to the area and located the suspect. The suspect was also found to be in possession of suspected methamphetamine paraphernalia and a concealed fixed blade knife.

The suspect was arrested and booked at the County Jail on the following charges: Burglary 1st degree, Concealed Knife, and Narcotics Paraphernalia.

Aggravated Assault With a Weapon 10/27/18 1118 Hours La Playa St/ Cabrillo St

Victim 1 jogged by the suspect when he felt a sharp pain to his lower back area. Victim 1 turned around and saw the suspect with a BB gun that looked like a shot gun. Victim 1 continued jogging away so he could call the police.

Victim 2 was driving out of the parking lot when he felt a sharp pain to his chin and heard the noise of what he thought was a BB gun. Victim 2 exited his vehicle and confronted the suspect and did not let him leave until police arrived.

Responding units detained the suspect and located the BB gun.







SFPD Pink Patch Project Raises \$25,000 for Charity

On **Tuesday, October 30, 2018**, the San Francisco Police Department, in partnership with the San Francisco Police Officers Association, will present a \$25,000 check to Bay Area Cancer Connections, a non-profit organization that provides personal care and support to breast and ovarian cancer patients and their families. The funds were raised through the Pink Patch Project, a collaborative effort created to raise awareness and funds for breast cancer research and treatment.

During October, which is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, SFPD members and more than 170 other participating law enforcement agencies nationwide wore specially designed pink versions of their department patch to encourage public awareness about the importance of early breast cancer detection.

The presentation of the check will take place 11:00AM Tuesday at SFPD Headquarters (1245 3rd Street).

San Francisco Police Department Receives Traffic Education and Enforcement Grant

The San Francisco Police Department has been awarded a \$237,700 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for a year-long enforcement and public awareness program. The traffic safety program is intended to educate the public on safe roadway habits and deter people from violating traffic laws or practicing other unsafe behaviors that lead to injuries and fatalities.

The grant from OTS will fund various education and enforcement activities for the 2019 federal fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2018 to Sept. 30, 2019):

- DUI checkpoints and saturation patrols to take suspected alcohol/drugimpaired drivers – and those unlicensed or with a revoked/suspended license – off the road.
- Traffic safety education presentations for youth and community members on distracted, impaired and teen driving, and bicycle/pedestrian safety.
- Patrols at intersections with increased incidents of pedestrian and bike collisions.
- · Speeding, red light and stop sign enforcement.

In 2016, 3,623 people were killed in crashes across the state, a 7 percent increase from 2015, according to the <u>National Highway Traffic Safety Administration</u>. Particularly alarming is the rise in pedestrian deaths, with 867 pedestrians killed on California roadways in 2016, a nearly 33 percent increase from 2012. Along with the growing dangers of distracting technologies like phones and drug-impaired driving, this grant funding will provide opportunities to combat these dangerous and illegal behaviors.

"Almost all crashes are preventable," OTS director Rhonda Craft said. "Education and enforcement go hand in hand helping change behaviors that cause devastating crashes."
