CAPTAIN'S MESSAGE:

Hello Richmond District Residents,

Fall is upon us with cooler weather, shorter days, and less visibility. One of my Traffic Officers took a photo of a pedestrian in a crosswalk in the early morning during sunrise. The pedestrian is barely visible against the rising sun.

Please slow down, stop at all stop signs, and take an extra second to look for pedestrians, bicycles, and other vehicles.

In the Spring and Autumn, we see an increase in pedestrian collisions during the morning and evening commute, often caused by reduced visibility resulting from the rising (or setting) sun in the driver's eyes. In the picture below, there is a pedestrian in the crosswalk, but they are extremely hard to see due to the sun's glare. The pedestrian, with the sun behind them, can see the car perfectly, so they assume they can be seen and continue walking in front of the car! When driving conditions are challenging like this, please take a little extra care at crosswalks and intersections.




OFFICER OF THE MONTH ANNA CUTHBERTSON

CITIZENS OF THE MONTH LINDA AND WILSON LEE





DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/ door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault- An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily in jury.

**<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.


Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Warrant Arrest 11/10/18 2900 Block Geary Blvd

Officers responded to the Muni Corp yard regarding a trespasser and located the suspect nearby. A records check revealed the suspect had an outstanding warrant for his arrest out of this city for a similar violation. Muni refused to press charges for the trespassing.

The suspect was arrested and booked on the warrant at County Jail.

Methamphetamine Offense, Possession of Stolen Property Arrest 11/7/18 700 Block 35th Ave

Officers responded to a call regarding a person trying to break into the premise with a screwdriver. Officers located the suspect who was in possession of a screwdriver and claimed she stayed at the house with her friends from time to time and was just trying to see if the doorbell worked.

A records check revealed the suspect was on probation with a search condition. During the search, Officers discovered suspected methamphetamine, methamphetamine paraphernalia, and stolen property.

The suspect was arrested and cited from the scene on the following charges: Possession of a Controlled Substance, Narcotics Paraphernalia, Possession of Stolen Property.






