DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

****Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. ****

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Aggravated Assault

Great Highway/ Fulton St

Officers responded to a call of a transient male attacking a jogger with a golf club.

Officers located the victim upon arrival. The victim stated, a transient male was walking out from the wooded area, behind the bus shelter, on Fulton Street. The male was yelling. The victim didn't believe the male was yelling at him, so he continued on with his jogging. As the victim crossed the street, he heard the yelling getting louder. The victim looked back and saw that the suspect was running towards him. The suspect appeared agitated and was yelling at him. The victim turned to face forward, to avoid tripping and quickly looked backwards again. Now, the suspect was within six feet of him and he could see that the suspect appeared to be holding a golf club. The suspect lunged forward and struck the victim with the golf club on his left shoulder area. The victim feared for his safety and sprinted home.

The officers, accompanied by the victim, searched the area for the suspect. The suspect was not located.

The victim refused medical treatment.

Felony Hit and Run

2/19/2019 08:00

Geary Blvd & 26th Ave

On 2/19, officers responded to a vehicle vs motorcycle hit and run traffic collision with serious, possibly fatal injuries, on Geary Blvd at 26th Ave. Responding medical personnel requested a Code 3 escort to SFGH due to the seriousness of the motorcyclist's injuries.

Approximately 2 hours later, the driver of the minivan returned to the scene and was arrested.

The Suspect was booked at County Jail on the following charges: Felony Hit and Run and Failure to Yield While Turning Left.



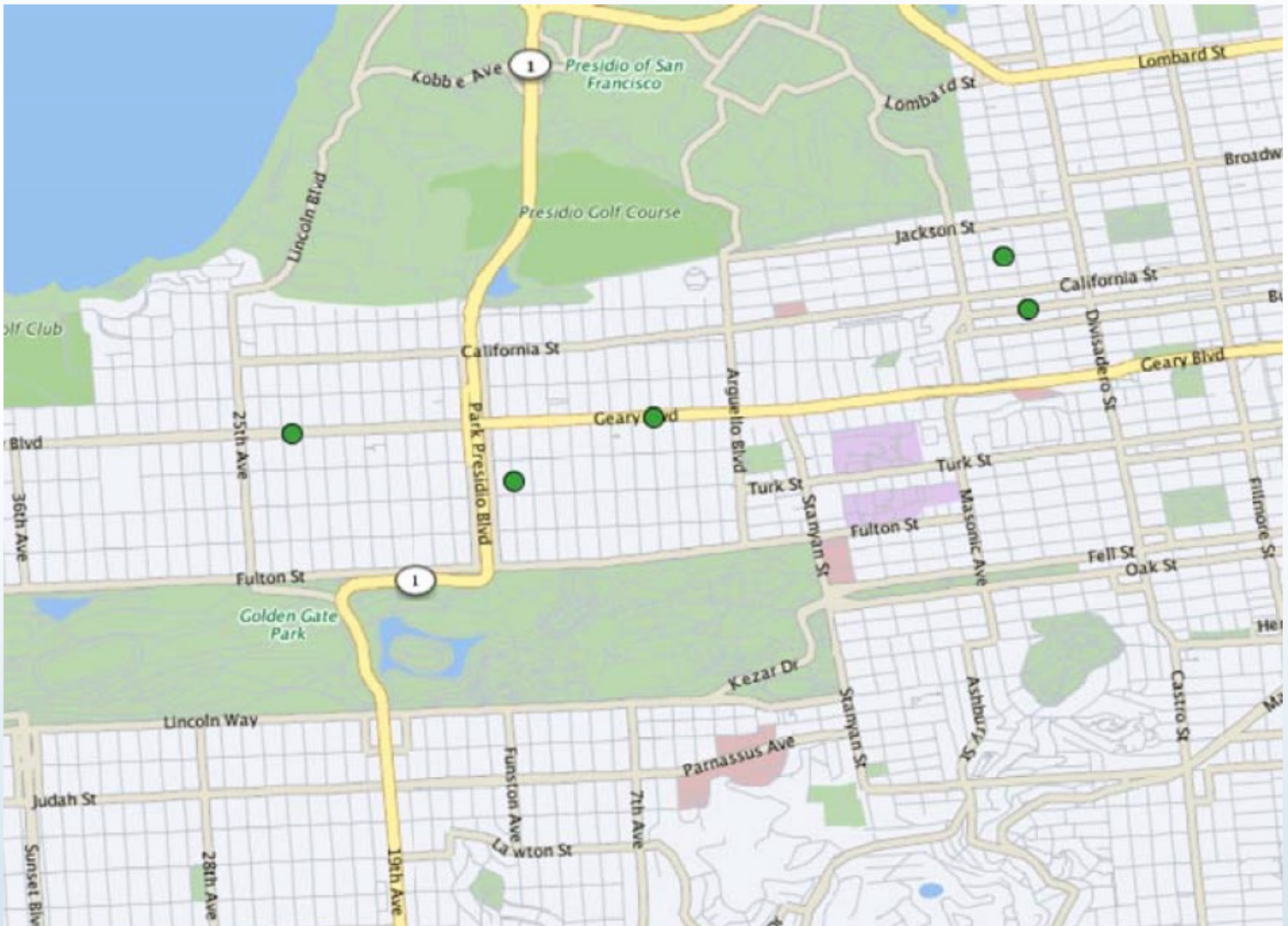

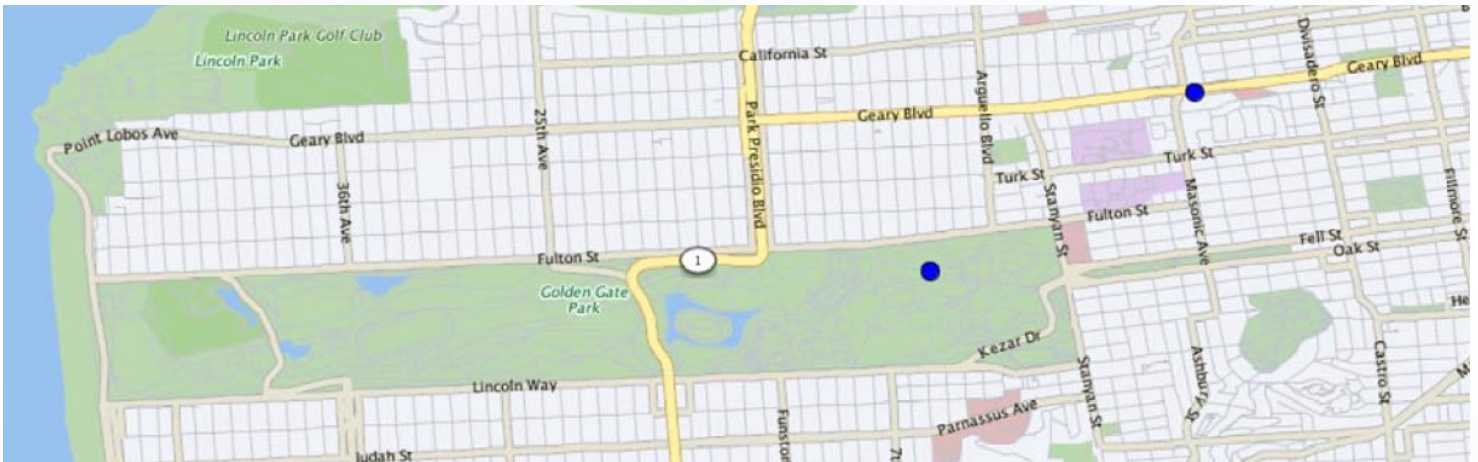

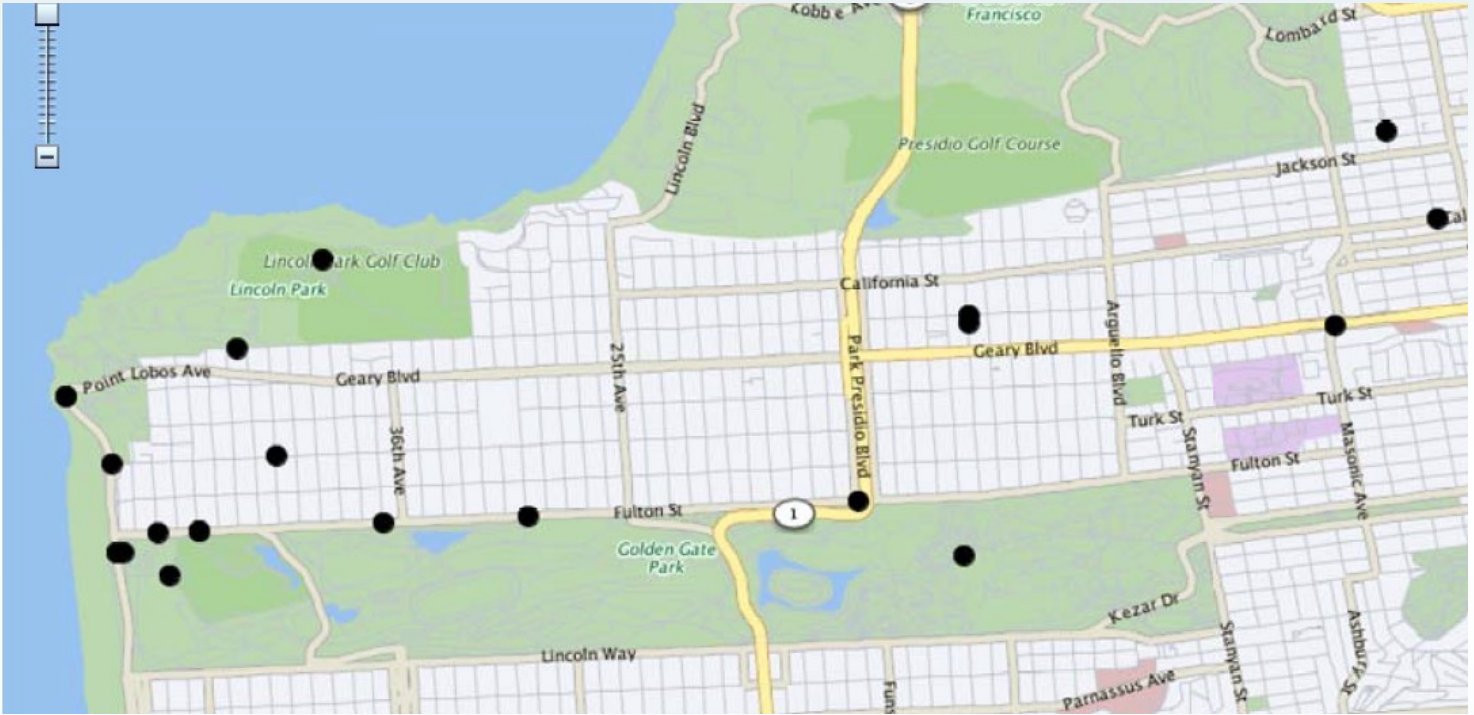

San Francisco Police Are Seeking Public Assistance in Locating Fatal Hit and Run Suspect Vehicle

*Suspect Driving a Silver or Gray Sedan Struck a 64 Year-old Pedestrian
Before Fleeing the Scene*

On February 26, 2019 at approximately 8:07pm, San Francisco police officers responded to California Street and 18th Avenue regarding a hit and run collision.

Preliminary information indicates that the victim, a 64 year-old female San Francisco resident was crossing California Street at 18th Avenue when she was struck by a motor vehicle. The driver of the suspect vehicle failed to stop and fled the scene. The suspect vehicle was last seen traveling northbound on 19th Avenue then eastbound on Lake Street. The victim was transported to Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (ZSFGH) where she later died.

Investigators from the SFPD Traffic Collision Investigation Unit (TCIU) are searching for a silver or gray sedan with possible front end and windshield damage.

Residents and business owners in the area are asked to check their surveillance camera systems for possible images of the suspect vehicle.

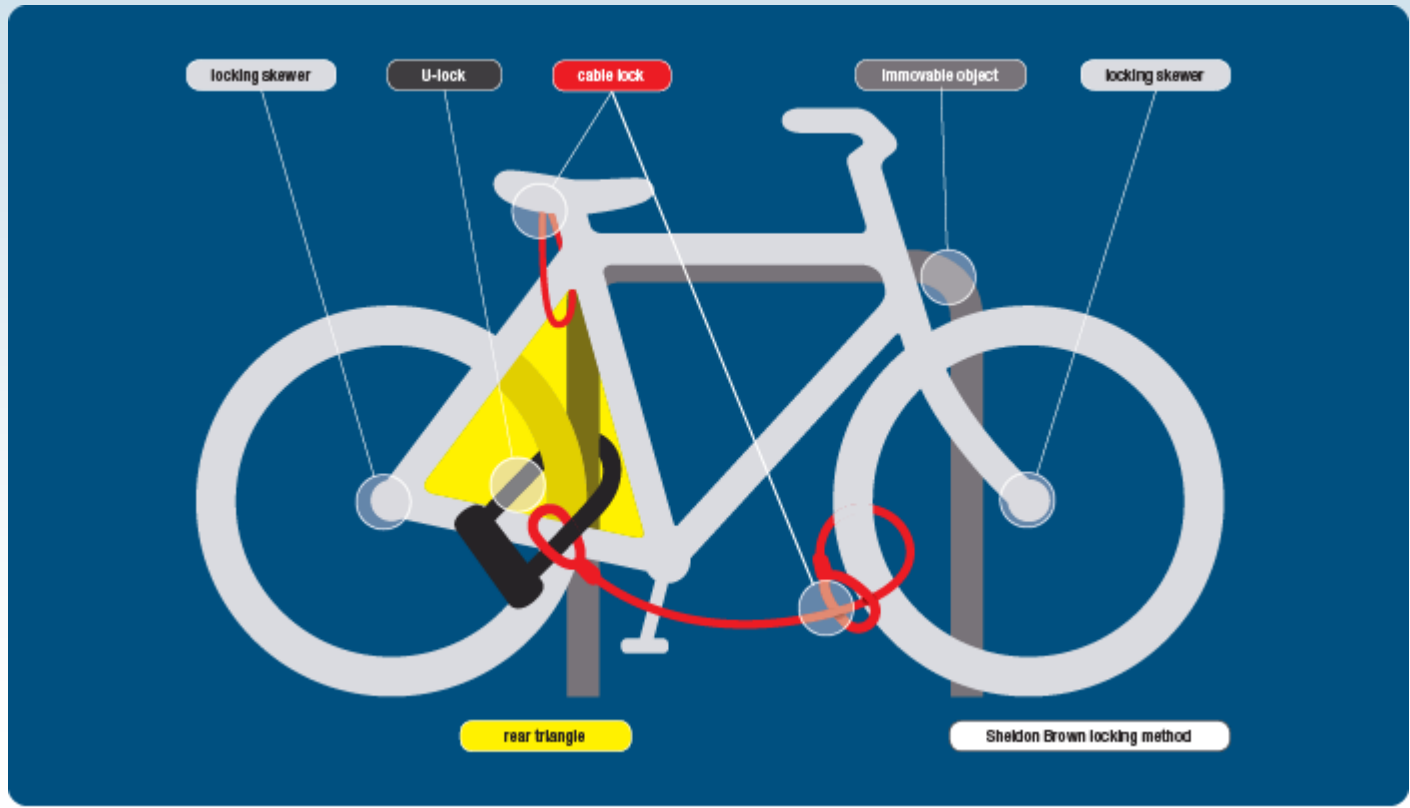

How to Lock Your Bike



- **STEP 1:** Secure rear wheel with small, hardened steel U-lock inside the rear triangle.
- **STEP 2:** Make sure U-lock is secured to an immovable object.
- **STEP 3:** Place secondary metal lock (cable or another U-lock) on front wheel. Also, attach seat to frame with a small cable lock.
- **STEP 4:** Replace quick-release skewers with keyed locking skewers to ensure wheels and saddles are locked to frame.

This is only one of many locking methods. None are 100% guaranteed.
