San Francisco Police Are Seeking Public Assistance in Locating Fatal Hit and Run Suspect Vehicle

Suspect Driving a Silver or Gray Sedan Struck a 64 Year-old Pedestrian Before Fleeing the Scene

On February 26, 2019 at approximately 8:07pm, San Francisco police officers responded to California Street and 18th Avenue regarding a hit and run collision.

Preliminary information indicates that the victim, a 64 year-old female San Francisco resident was crossing California Street at 18th Avenue when she was struck by a motor vehicle. The driver of the suspect vehicle failed to stop and fled the scene. The suspect vehicle was last seen traveling northbound on 19th Avenue then eastbound on Lake Street. The victim was transported to Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (ZSFGH) where she later died.

Investigators from the SFPD Traffic Collison Investigation Unit (TCIU) are searching for a silver or gray sedan with possible front end and windshield damage.

Residents and business owners in the area are asked to check their surveillance camera systems for possible images of the suspect vehicle.

DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Vehicle Burglary Arrest 03/07/19 20:50 5700 Block Geary Blvd

Officers observed a vehicle park in a lot known for auto burglaries. The driver of the vehicle, Suspect 1, exited the vehicle and used his phone as a light to illuminate and case the interior of the victim's vehicle. The suspect then shattered the rear window of the vehicle and retrieved a backpack. The Suspect then returned to his parked vehicle, with Suspect 2 waiting inside.

Officers tactically positioned a Police Vehicle to prevent the suspects' escape. Suspect 1 attempted to maneuver his vehicle to escape but was unsuccessful after hitting a wall. Officers were able to take both suspects into custody.

Suspect 1 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Auto Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Conspiracy, Possession of Burglary Tools, Resisting Arrest.

Suspect 2 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Auto Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Conspiracy, Committing a Felony While Out on Bail.

Warrant Arrest 03/04/19 15:43 La Playa St/ Cabrillo St

Officers observed the suspect laying on the ground in front of a bus shelter blocking the sidewalk. Officers contacted the suspect to ensure he was not having medical emergency. A records check revealed the suspect had a no bail warrant out of this city for his arrest.



Bumble is similair to Tinder, a popular dating app. Bumble requires the women to make the first contact. Kids use Bumble by creating fake accounts and using a fake age.



Whisper is an anonymous social network that allows users to share secrets with strangers. It also revels the users location



Live.Me is a live streaming video app. It uses your location to share videos so others can see your exact location. Users can earn "coins" as a way to "pay" minors for photos.



Encourages users to rate your profile and chat with strangers.



Ask.Fm is known for cyber bullying. The app encourgaes uses to allow annoymous people to ask questions and get an answer. This has been linked to severe forms of cyber bullying.



Yellow app is designed to let teens flirt with one another in a Tinder like setting.



The app description is "Together we can keep a secret". Allows users to post anonymous rumors about others through audio, text and photos.



Snap Chat - This app promises that you can take a photo or video and it will disappear, with the recent story feature content can stay up to 24 hours and allow your location to be shown.



Wishbone allows users to compare kids against each other and rate them on a scale.



A self procliamed "addicting" video app. Users can chat with people all over the world. User have been exposed to racial slurs, explicit content and more.



Hide It Pro (HIP) is desquised as a music manager but it is meant for hiding anything from photos to text.



Calculator% - One of many secret apps used to hide photos, videos, files and browser history. It looks and acts like a calculator but a psscode will open the vault.



Allows anyone to contact and direct message users. This app is popular becuase you can create a fake account and does not require age verification.
