#### San Francisco Police Are Seeking Public Assistance in Locating Fatal Hit and Run Suspect Vehicle

Suspect Driving a Silver or Gray Sedan Struck a 64 Year-old Pedestrian Before Fleeing the Scene

On February 26, 2019 at approximately 8:07pm, San Francisco police officers responded to California Street and 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue regarding a hit and run collision.

Preliminary information indicates that the victim, a 64 year-old female San Francisco resident was crossing California Street at 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue when she was struck by a motor vehicle. The driver of the suspect vehicle failed to stop and fled the scene. The suspect vehicle was last seen traveling northbound on 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue then eastbound on Lake Street. The victim was transported to Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (ZSFGH) where she later died.

Investigators from the SFPD Traffic Collison Investigation Unit (TCIU) are searching for a silver or gray sedan with possible front end and windshield damage.

Residents and business owners in the area are asked to check their surveillance camera systems for possible images of the suspect vehicle.



# RICHMOND OFFICER DELIVERING GROCERIES IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE RICHMOND DISTRICT NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER (RDNC)



#### **DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY**

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

#### **Examples of Suspicious Activity:**

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

#### IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

#### **DEFINITIONS OF CRIME**

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

\*\*<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft**– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

The suspect knocked on the victim's door and accused him of smoking marijuana. As the suspect turned to leave, the victim clearly saw a black firearm in the suspect's hand.

Officers arrived and got the victim to a safe location. Officers then tactically approached the suspect's residence and located and seized the firearm. The suspect and the firearm were positively identified by the victim.

Officers responded to a call of an auto break-in in progress. The witness gave a detailed description of the suspect and updated dispatch on the suspect's location. Officers quickly arrived and detained the suspect. The witness saw the suspect and told officers "That's him!"

The suspect initially gave officers a false name and stated he was a juvenile. The suspect was ultimately positively identified as an adult. A search of the suspect located a window punch in his pocket.

Store employees located the stolen property from the auto boost nearby and were able to reunite it with the victim.

The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Burglary, Vandalism, Possession of Burglary Tools


