## Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on April 9th, 18th, 22nd and 26th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these non-motorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

## Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct a Traffic Safety Enforcement Operation on April 10th, 17th and 24th with a focus on distracted driving, especially through the use of handheld cell phones and texting. Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road, or your hands off the steering wheel. These are some of the most dangerous things we do behind the wheel that many people do not think about because these actions are so common.

It is important to recognize the dangers of distracted driving. In California, cell phone laws were enacted to help prevent distracted driving and make roads safer. The law prohibits driving while holding a cell phone in your hand. If the cell phone is used in a hands-free manner, such as voice command or the use of a mounting device, it is completely legal. While driving, you can single swipe or tap the screen to activate or deactivate a feature or function, but you cannot text, scroll or tap multiple times. The law allows using your cell phone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.

Any driver under the age of 18 cannot use a cell phone or any other electronic wireless device at all (not hand-held, hands-free, Bluetooth, speaker phone, or any other means) except for the above emergency purposes.





## **DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY**

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

#### **Examples of Suspicious Activity:**

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

## IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

### **DEFINITIONS OF CRIME**

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

\*\*<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft**– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

## Burglary, Stolen Property, Probation Violation 4/4/19 16:53 3600 Block California St

The suspect attempted to gain entry to the store through several windows. He was successful with one and crawled through about half way. The suspect grabbed an item near the window inside the store. Victim 1 yelled at the suspect, he let go of the item, and climbed back out the window.

Officers arrived a few moments later and detained the suspect right in front of the store. The suspect was identified by Victim 1.

A search of the suspect revealed an amazon package addressed to Victim 2. A records check revealed the suspect was on probation for Burglary and Possession of Stolen Property.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Probation Violation.

## Terrorist Threats, Exhibiting Deadly Weapon 4/3/19 22:26 MLK Dr/ Middle Dr

During the initial incident on 4/2/19, The suspect attempted to steal several items from Safeway and was confronted by security. After the suspect and security were outside, security stated the suspect pulled a black revolver out of his jacket and stated "You want me to blast you?!" The suspect then fled in an unknown direction.

Officers from Richmond Station viewed video footage of the incident and were able to identify the suspect as a known transient in Golden Gate Park.

Homeless Outreach Officers worked with Park Rangers to locate and arrest the suspect within hours of the original incident.


The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Terrorist Threats, Exhibiting a Deadly Weapon, Park Code Violation.
