Ernest Jones was born at St Luke's Hospital in the Ingleside District in 1985. EJ's home was at Arch and Holloway Street in the neighboring Taraval District. EJ's mother worked as an educator for the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) for 45 years; his father worked for SF MUNI as an Inspector.

EJ attended St. Emydius Grammar School and later attended St Ignatius High School. EJ attended Dominican University for his undergraduate studies and received a Masters in Public Administration from the University of San Francisco.

EJ's professional career in Public Administration began with the SFUSD where he assisted families and students with their needs and education. EJ wanted to further his public service and have more tangible impact on families, so he began working at the Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center and with residents of the Alemany housing complex. There, he affected positive community engagement by starting the "City Eats Program" where 1,000 homeless people are fed nutritious meals every Saturday of each month. EJ continues to serve challenged and underserved communities and has a desire to make a positive impact on people's lives.

EJ takes great pride in planning block parties where residents from communities such as Holly Park and Alemany Housing Complex celebrate their neighborhood. When asked about the recent Holly Park Block Party, EJ took pride in the success of the event where residents, neighbors (including Mayor Breed), and neighborhoods came together in a spirit of collaboration, preparation, and connection. Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Pathways to ALERT membership:

- 1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit www.sfgov.org/sfnert. Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at sfpdalert@sfgov.org. After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
- 2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.



San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Northern District Homicide

On Sunday, August 19th 2018 at approximately 10:25 PM, San Francisco Police officers responded to Larkin Street and Geary Street regarding a stabbing. Officers located 41 year-old San Francisco resident Scott Turner laying on the ground, suffering from several stab wounds. San Francisco Fire Department paramedics responded and rendered aid, but Turner unfortunately succumbed to his injuries at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital.

The SFPD Homicide detail commenced an investigation that led to the identity of the suspect. On October 20th 2018, Tenderloin Station officers located and arrested 22 year-old Daly City resident Zachary Green in the Tenderloin district.

Green was charged with murder and booked into San Francisco County Jail. Due to pending identification matters, his booking photo will not be released at this time.

Although an arrest has been made, investigators are asking anyone with information on this case to contact the San Francisco Police anonymously at 415-575-4444 or text-atip to TIP411 with SFPD at the start of the message.

SFPD Responds to Incident Involving Knife Wielding Subject

On Friday October 26, 2018 at approximately 1015 AM, San Francisco police officers from Southern Station responded to the 100 block of 4th Street for a report of a male cursing and jabbing a knife toward people. Officers arrived on scene and observed a subject waving a knife and yelling incoherently. The incident occurred in a downtown area known for its high pedestrian traffic. Several public and private events were taking place nearby.

Officers developed a plan of action in accordance with their Crisis Intervention Training. A sergeant assumed command and designated officers' roles, including less lethal cover and a hands-on arrest team.

The subject did not respond to verbal commands to drop the knife. Officers devised a plan to subdue the subject. One officer tackled the subject from behind while others assisted in restraining him on the ground, where an officer delivered knee strikes to disarm the subject. A knife was recovered. The subject was then placed in handcuffs and taken to an area hospital for evaluation. One officer sustained minor injuries.

All officers activated their body worn cameras during the incident. As with any incident involving a use of force, a supervisory evaluation will be conducted to ensure that the use of force was within policy.

SFPD Pink Patch Project Raises \$25,000 for Charity

On **Tuesday, October 30, 2018**, the San Francisco Police Department, in partnership with the San Francisco Police Officers Association, will present a \$25,000 check to Bay Area Cancer Connections, a non-profit organization that provides personal care and support to breast and ovarian cancer patients and their families. The funds were raised through the Pink Patch Project, a collaborative effort created to raise awareness and funds for breast cancer research and treatment.

During October, which is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, SFPD members and more than 170 other participating law enforcement agencies nationwide wore specially designed pink versions of their department patch to encourage public awareness about the importance of early breast cancer detection.

The presentation of the check will take place 11:00AM Tuesday at SFPD Headquarters (1245 3rd Street).
