Ingleside Captain's Message

While April 18 is a day where we pause and remember the 1906 earthquake and fire, there is no day like the present to action plan on earthquake and disaster preparedness for yourself, your family, your block, and your neighborhood. In the spirit of constantly challenging ourselves to be better and more prepared to adapt and overcome stress and adversity, Sup. Safai's Office and Ingleside Police Station partnered with the Neighborhood Empowerment Network to run a "Shake Tank" earthquake simulation. The April 24 event, graciously hosted by Pastor Barbara Cornejo at the Daring Faith Celebration Centre, lived up to its tagline: "Experience your tomorrow, today," when resident leaders from the Cayuga neighborhood engaged in the earthquake simulation with representatives from BART, Riordan High School, Recreation and Parks, the Mission Childcare Consortium, School Resource Officers, the Department of Emergency Management, CalOES, FEMA, SFFD, City College of SF, and many others. There were many positive takeaways from this event, with the biggest takeaway being the fierce urgency of getting ourselves as ready as we can be, so that we have the capacity to help others. What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Pathways to ALERT membership:

- Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit <u>www.sfgov.org/sfnert</u>. Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at <u>sfpdalert@sfgov.org</u>. After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
- If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.



San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Violent Bayview Robbery Series

On January 15, 2019, at approximately 8:45 PM, San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to 3rd Street and Paul Avenue regarding a robbery. The victim, a 24 year-old female, said she was approached by an unknown male who punched her, causing her to fall to the ground and lose consciousness. The male took the victim's property and fled the scene.

On March 14, 2019, at approximately 2:35 AM, San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to the 1900 block of Keith Street regarding a robbery. The victim, a 52 year-old female, said she was approached by an unknown male who punched her in the head several times causing her to fall to the ground. While on the ground the male kicked her and demanded her money. The male took the victim's property and fled the scene.

On March 19, 2019, at approximately 10:00 PM, San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to 3rd Street and Paul Avenue regarding a robbery. The victim, a 62 year-old female, said she was approached by an unknown male, but could only remember that she lost consciousness. The victim awoke to find many of her personal items missing.

On April 17, 2019, at approximately 9:15 PM, San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to the 6200 block of 3rd Street regarding a robbery. The victim, a 24 year-old female, said she was approached by and unknown male who punched her causing her to fall to the ground. While on the ground the male punched the victim several more times. The male took the victim's property and fled the scene.

On April 24, 2019, at approximately 9:50 PM San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to the 3800 block of 3rd Street on a report of a robbery.

The victim, a 45 year-old female, said she had just withdrawn money from an ATM. The victim said that she was confronted by an unknown male who demanded her money. The male punched the victim twice and took her money. The suspect ran to the victim's vehicle, which was parked nearby with the keys in the ignition. The victim got into her car in an effort to retrieve her keys. The victim was able to get her keys back, but not before the male bit her on the hand. The male fled the scene on foot.

On April 25, 2019, at approximately 9:15 PM, San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to Hollister Avenue and Ingalls Street on a report of a robbery. The victim, a 20 year-old female, said that she was approached by an unknown male. The male grabbed her by the arm and punched her in the face causing her to fall to the ground and lose consciousness. The victim awoke to find many of her personal items missing.

On May 3, 2019, at approximately 9:10 PM San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to the 1200 block of Hollister Avenue for a report of a robbery. The victim, a 30 year-old female, said that she was approached by an unknown male who punched her causing her to lose consciousness. The victim awoke to find many of her personal items missing.

On May 4, 2019, at approximately 2:05 AM San Francisco Police officers from Bayview Station responded to the 2500 block of 3rd Street for a report of a robbery. The victim, a 40 year-old female, said that she was approached by an unknown male who punched her in the face two times. The male and the victim struggled over the victim's purse. The male pushed the victim to the ground causing her to hit her head and lose consciousness. When the victim awoke she watched the male running away from the scene with her purse.

Believing that the same suspect was responsible for this series of violent robberies, the SFPD Robbery Detail took over the investigation from the Bayview Station Investigation Team. The investigation led to the identification of the suspect as 52 year-old Donnell Guidry of San Francisco. On Wednesday, May 15, 2019 Guidry was arrested and booked at San Francisco County Jail on one count of first-degree robbery, seven counts of second-degree robbery, one count of mayhem, one count of attempted carjacking, six counts of assault with means of force likely to cause great bodily injury, one count of criminal threats, and two counts of committing a felony while on bail.

Due to pending identification matters Guidry's booking photo is not being released at this time.

Investigators have recovered unique evidence that might belong to another victim that has not reported a crime or a victim from another jurisdiction. Anyone with information regarding a keychain with a picture of a Korean Won (currency) that may be related to these crimes is encouraged to contact the San Francisco Police Department.

While an arrest has been made, this remains an active an ongoing investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call the SFPD 24 Hour Tip Line at 1-415- 575-4444 or Text a Tip to TIP411 and begin the text message with SFPD. You may remain anonymous.

San Francisco Police Make Arrests in Attempted Homicide And Stabbing Incident

On May 10th 2019, officers responded to the 300 block of The Embarcadero regarding a possible shooting and stabbing call. Officers observed a male victim on the ground bleeding from his stomach from an apparent gunshot wound and a female victim sitting nearby with a stab wound to the hand. Medical personnel arrived and transported both victims to the hospital. The female victim was listed in non-life threatening condition and the male victim was listed in life-threatening condition.

Officers learned that the male and female victims were arguing with the male victim's exgirlfriend, who was later identified as 28 year-old San Francisco resident Leola Isaacson. Witnesses stated that Isaacson pulled out an edged weapon and stabbed the female victim in the hand. A witness stated that an unknown male suspect, later identified as 39 year-old transient Nick Shaw, shot the male victim in the stomach before fleeing the scene.

Based on an investigation into the incident, Leola Isaacson was taken into custody on May 11th 2019 at San Francisco General Hospital. Isaacson was booked at San Francisco County Jail on charges of assault with a deadly weapon, possession of a controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia.

On May 16 2019 at approximately 7:30PM, officers responded to the area of Delancey Street between Federal Street and Beale Street. The investigation led officers to believe that Shaw was hiding underneath the Bryant Street overpass.



SFPD Makes Arrest in Ingleside Homicide

On May 20, 2019 a missing person report was generated by Ingleside Station for 73 yearold San Francisco resident Benedict Ching.

A co-worker contacted a family member of Mr. Ching to advise her that he did not show up for work on May 18, 2019. On May 20, 2019 at approximately 11:40 AM police officers from Ingleside Station accompanied Mr.Ching's family member to his home to conduct a well-being check. Police made entry into the home and discovered a body, believed to be Mr. Ching. Investigators determined that his disappearance and death was a result of foul play.

The SFPD Homicide Detail began an investigation that led to the identification of two possible suspects: 44 year-old Douglas Lomas and 35 year-old Stephanie Ching, both of San Francisco. Homicide investigators received information that Lomas and Ching were on enroute to China. With the assistance of the federal Homeland Security Investigations SFPD was able to locate, identify, and detain the subjects who landed in Beijing, China. The subjects were flown to Virginia and are currently being housed in the Loudoun Adult Detention Center in Leesburg, VA where they were arrested and booked for homicide.

Investigators are currently working on the extradition process to bring the subjects back to San Francisco. Booking photos of the subjects are not available at this time.

The arrest of the suspects comes via collaboration with Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) San Francisco. HSI was instrumental in locating and coordinating this arrest without incident.





Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.

Cell Phone Law



Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.



To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seveninch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.



When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.



A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.



You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.
