Frustrated by the relentless scourge of illegal July 4th Fireworks every year? If so, Ingleside Station needs your help. Please: 1) contact us about problem locations where illegal fireworks have been ignited in the past, and 2) if you see something; say something.

We need specific locations with either the addresses or intersections where the big, house shaking, fire hazard creating, injury-causing fireworks were detonated in years past. During the month leading up to the 4th, we will be compiling a list of these locations in anticipation of 4th of July illegal fireworks activity so that we can stop the big, dangerous gatherings from even starting. Email us at: sfpd.fireworks@sfgov.org; you may remain anonymous/confidential.

If you witness illegal fireworks being ignited (in progress), please call 911. Describe the suspect(s) at an exact location where illegal fireworks are being ignited as it is occurring; reporting the sound of fireworks is not specific enough. The mission here is to seize and prevent fireworks prior to the 4th, so that our July 4th plans will be successful. **Do not use the**Fireworks email to report in-progress fireworks as it is not monitored 24/7.

We are finalizing plans for July 4th's "Phase 2" and will update the community once completed.

We are grateful for the assistance of San Francisco Rec & Park, the San Francisco Fire Department, DPW, DEM, the Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center, and Amy Beinart from Supervisor Ronen's office for their guidance.



A warm night and a driver oblivious to traffic signals. That was the unfortunate recipe that prompted a citizen to call police at one in the morning. The citizen told dispatch that he was almost hit by the driver of a pickup that blew through the signal at Bayshore and Geneva. The witness followed the driver west on Geneva while calling dispatch. Ingleside officers Lozano, Seavey, McCall, and Buckner were nearby and quickly found and stopped the driver at Edinburgh and Geneva. He had bloodshot eyes, droopy eyelids, and was sweaty with a flushed face. There was an open bottle of beer in the center console. He was given a roadside sobriety test and failed miserably. He consented to a blood alcohol test which was performed at Mission Station. After the test the suspect was arrested and charged with DUI and transported to the County Jail. Report number: 190415975

Ingleside officers Scott, Cortez, Lopez-Rodas were called to assist California Highway Patrol officers who responded to a shooting of two men in one vehicle who were shot by the occupants of another vehicle. The victims were found on the Northbound San Jose Avenue exit of Highway #280. The officers found numerous shell casings in the area. Ingleside officers Lee and Barajas were dispatched to San Francisco General Hospital to investigate a stabbing. At the hospital, the victim told the officers he was injured by an unknown assailant while he was preventing suspects from attacking the woman driver of a car. The incident started when kids, during a water balloon fight, hit the woman's car with a balloon. The driver got out and started arguing with parents who then threatened her with physical harm. 



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Pathways to ALERT membership:

- Complete NERT training and receive certification.
 To register for NERT training courses, please visit www.sfgov.org/sfnert. Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at sfpdalert@sfgov.org. After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
- If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.



Sewer Replacement & Pavement Renovation

Project Description

S.F. Public Works has partnered with the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete infrastructure improvements along <u>Alemany Blvd.</u>

<u>Street.</u> Public Works will manage the project and we've hired D'Arcy & Harty Construction, Inc. to complete the work.

Construction is scheduled to begin in late lune 2019 with completion expected in December 2020.

This project will include sewer main replacement, street base repairs, curb ramp and bulb-out installation, minor traffic signal work at the Santa Rosa Ave. and Silver Ave. intersections and repaving between Congdon Street and Seneca Avenue. Please note, not all blocks will include sewer main replacement work. <u>Please visit our project webpage for additional information on which blocks will include sewer work</u>.

Sewer service will not be interrupted during construction. Please continue to use your household plumbing per the usual.

Once the sewer work is complete, crews will begin preparations to repave the street. Preparations will include installation of curb ramps and bulb-outs followed by street base repairs. Street base repairs will require the contractor saw-cut sections of the roadway, remove the broken concrete and pour back fresh concrete. Replacing the street base now will improve the longevity of the new asphalt road.

Since there are several blocks included in this project, it may be weeks or months before we reach your block. We are sending you this notice in advance of any work on the project.

Neighborhood Tip:

Please call 3-1-1 to report any issues in the neighborhood such as potholes, burnt-out traffic signals or streetlights, leaky fire hydrants, broken curbs or sidewalks, illegal dumping, etc. 311 is the primary customer service center for the City of San Francisco. They'll route your concern to the appropriate agency for follow-up.

Impacts and Restrictions

Street parking may not be possible on the block during construction work hours. In some cases, parking may not be possible on part of the adjacent block as we taper the traffic lanes to accommodate the work zone. Please see posted barricade signs for exact work hours, days, and locations, because they may vary depending on the construction task. The "no parking" signs will be posted at least 72 hours in advance to alert motorists of parking restrictions.

Vehicles parked in the construction zone during the posted work hours will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Please allow extra travel time during construction work hours.





Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.







Cell Phone Law



Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.



To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seveninch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.



When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.



A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.



You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

Ability to Pay in San Francisco Traffic Court

If you cannot afford to pay your ticket, you have a right to ask the traffic clerk or judge to consider your financial circumstances.

The court will look at your financial information, and then will decide whether to:

- 1. Reduce Your Fine, and/or
- 2. Offer you Community Service, and/or
- 3. Offer you an Affordable Payment Plan


Any time after you have been found guilty of a ticket, you can request the court to reduce your fine because you can't afford it.



The court will give you a form called Can't Afford to Pay Fine (TR320/CR-320) so you can explain why you can't afford to pay.



Provide as much detail as you can on the form about your income, expenses, why you can't afford to pay, and what you would like the court to do.



Attach documents showing your income and expenses, or explain on the form why these documents aren't available. Submit your form to the court.



The court will read it and let you know the decision by mail. Check with the court if you haven't heard back after 30 days.



If you've had a change of circumstances or need to provide more info about your situation, you may submit another request.


