Ofc Joel Hornstein



Ofc. Hornstein joined the San Francisco Police Department on October 30th, 2006 and has worked at Ingleside Station for the past 10 years. Formerly a paramedic and currently a Field Training Officer, he brings his top skills in both policing and patient care to the late day shift. He has recently been awarded a Silver Medal of Valor for heroically rescuing an elderly person from the 5-alarm 29th & Mission Street fire. He also earned a life-saving award for saving the life of a person choking at the Nugget Rib Cook-Off in Sparks, Nevada. Whether on-duty or off-duty, he brings calm to the chaos.

In addition to these significant events, he proactively responds to our community's everyday call for service and events needing police attention. Ofc. Hornstein and his partner responded so quickly to a residential burglary in progress call in Visitacion Valley, that they observed the suspects and pursued them on the freeway and down Tunnel Road in Brisbane.

Discharging of a Firearm

Ingleside Officers Wong and Buckner responded and viewed surveillance video showing the driver of an Isuzu firing several shots out the window of the vehicle. The driver of the Isuzu then exited the vehicle and walked to a nearby residence. The officers went to the residence and talked to the owner, but were unable to determine who was driving the car. A minor traffic collision on busy San Jose Avenue prompted dispatch to send Ingleside Officers Hoge, St. Clair, Labson, and Mar. When the officers arrived they found the woman driver, who was at fault, hunched over in the driver's seat of her vehicle. An empty bottle of watermelon vodka was in the rear floor board. The officers determined she was too intoxicated to take a roadside sobriety test. She was transported to San Francisco General Hospital for assessment. Later, a warrant for a blood alcohol test was obtained, and a phlebotomist performed the procedure at the hospital. The suspect was cited for the DUI and remained at the hospital for treatment. 5:05pm 200 Blk. Circular Resisting Arrest

A woman called police when she spotted a strange man sitting in her car parked in front of her home. Ingleside Officers Radin and Garza responded and ordered the suspect out of the car. He locked the doors and refused to come out. The owner unlocked the doors using a remote key fob and the officers opened the driver's door and again ordered the suspect out of the car. Again he refused several times. Finally, Radin and Garza had to reach into the car and pull the suspect out placing him in custody. They cited him at the scene for resisting arrest. A report of a collision between a vehicle and a light pole prompted witnesses to call police. Ingleside Officers Chan, Buckner, and Frisk responded and found the driver and two passengers of a Toyota pickup at the scene. The driver admitted to having six beers in Oakland before the accident. He was given a roadside sobriety test and failed just about all the exams. He was placed into custody and consented to a blood alcohol test sequence which was administered at Mission Station. His two test revealed an intoxication level significantly higher than the minimum allowed to drive in California. He was arrested and transported to San Francisco General Hospital for treatment. Ingleside Sgt. Kumli and Officer Figueroa were dispatched to a call of a man lying in the driveway of a home and not moving. When the officers arrived they found the suspect incoherent and disheveled and unable to provide any information about who he was or why he was there. A search of his clothing revealed counterfeit currency, several stolen credit and debit cards, 31 blank checks, and two key rings, one with 29 keys, and the other with four keys for a KIA. An alert homeowner noticed a black Infinity, without license plates, driving up and down her street. She then watched as the Infinity stopped and a passenger exited, walked up to her locked gate, and rang the doorbell. The victim opened her front door, but not her gate, and the suspect asked if "Jason was home". The homeowner said no "Jason" lived there and the suspect turned around and walked back to the Infinity, got in, and was driven away. This is a sad case where an elderly woman fell victim to a pair of scammers who stole a large amount of her money. The victim told Ingleside Officers Watts and Jimenez-Almanza that she was approached by two men who took her to a van where they claimed to have a lottery ticket worth \$15,000. One of the suspects took out a phone and claimed to call the "lottery hot line" confirming the amount. The pair told the victim she could share in the winnings by lending them \$5000. She agreed and went home, picked up the funds, returned and gave the suspects the money. Then, one of the suspects called the "lottery hot line" again and said lottery officials needed a proof of residency. He told the victim to go home and get her PG&E bill and return so he can give lottery officials the information. The victim left and when she returned with the bill the suspects were no longer there. 5:15pm 5200 Blk. Diamond Heights Aggravated Assault

A woman, parking her car in the Safeway parking lot, decided to help security officials stop two suspected shoplifters. She told Ingleside Officers Ahern and Mar at Ingleside Station that she maneuvered her Prius into a position to stop the suspect's escape in a BMW that was parked next to her. The maneuver didn't work because the suspects, not worrying about damage to their car, repeatedly rammed the victim's Prius until she moved out of the way for their escape. Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

1. Graduate the SFPD NERT course (<http://sf-fire.org/neighborhood-emergency-response-team-nert>), or,
2. Graduate the SFPD Community Police Academy course (<https://sanfranciscopolice.org/community-police-academy>)
3. Pass a basic DOJ/FBI Background check.
4. Sign up for the next 8 hour ALERT new volunteer training class.

Muni Subway Closes Early for Critical Maintenance

The SFMTA maintenance crews work hard every night after Muni Metro subway service hours to maintain the tracks and equipment underground. On most nights, this gives them only about two hours to get work done. In order to complete critical maintenance tasks that cannot be completed during normal windows, we are planning two weeks of early subway closures, so crews have more hours each night to do this vital work.


DETAILS:  **STARTS THIS MONDAY, AUGUST 12TH**

Starting August 12 and continuing for approximately two weeks, the subway between Embarcadero and West Portal will close early at 9:30 p.m. When the subway closes early, buses will run above ground to connect all stops, beginning at 9:30 p.m. through the normal end of train service at 1 a.m. Owl service will remain unchanged. Trains will start regular morning service each day.

TRANSIT SERVICE PLAN - 9:30PM TO END OF NORMAL SERVICE AT 1AM

-  Shuttle buses will serve all Muni Metro stops between Embarcadero/Brannan and St. Francis Circle
-  Train service between Balboa Park and St. Francis Circle
-  Buses will run between Embarcadero/Brannan and Zoo. No L trains running.
-  Train service between Ocean Beach and Church/Duboce (Inbound N trains become outbound N trains at Church/Duboce)
-  Train service between Balboa Park and Church/Duboce (Inbound J trains become outbound J trains at Church/Duboce)
-  Train service between Sunnydale and Embarcadero/Brannan

CUSTOMER INFORMATION:

- Inbound N Judah and outbound J Church trains will use the accessible stop entering the Duboce Portal to serve passengers needing the ramp.
-  For service on Market Street, Muni customers can board bus shuttles at a bus stop marked with the half-moon sign.
- Muni customers are encouraged to leave extra travel time during subway closures.
- Regular bus fares will apply on bus shuttles and valid transfers will be accepted.

The extended window will give us an opportunity to do complex work aimed at making subway operations more reliable and prevent future breakdowns.

An additional early shutdown window is planned for December.

San Francisco Police Seek Public's Help to Solve 2016 Homicide

San Francisco Police Homicide Inspectors are seeking assistance in solving the 2016 murder of Keron Lamotte.

On October 7, 2016 at 7:06PM, Mr. Lamotte was shot and killed as he observed an artist painting a mural on the side of a building at Plymouth Avenue and Broad Street. The San Francisco Police Department has authorized a \$25,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for Keron Lamotte's murder.

Keron's mother, Ms. Jones has commissioned a billboard announcing the reward. On **Wednesday, August 28, 2019 at 10:30AM**, Keron's mother will hold a news conference in front of the Ingleside Presbyterian Church located at **1345 Ocean Avenue** to publicize the billboard and appeal for witnesses to come forward.

Ms. Jones, along with Taraval Police Station Captain Nicholas Rainsford, representatives from the SFPD Homicide Detail and Media Relations staff will be available to the press.

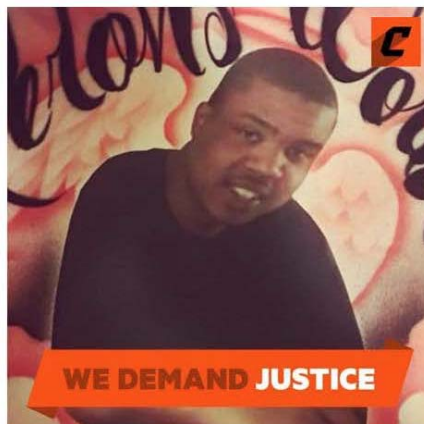

San Francisco Police Investigate Officer Involved Collision (Update)

On Saturday, August 24th 2019 at approximately 5:20 PM, Northern Station plainclothes officers were in foot pursuit of two auto burglary suspects in the area of Geary Boulevard and Webster Street. The officers called for additional assistance. An unmarked police car responded at which time a collision occurred, in which one suspect and one officer were struck by the vehicle. Both were transported to the hospital. As of Monday, August 26th, the suspect remains hospitalized in life-threatening condition. The officer that was admitted for non-life threatening injuries has been treated and released.

A second suspect involved in the auto burglary investigation, 30 year-old Leunides May of San Francisco, was arrested and booked at San Francisco County Jail on the following charges: burglary, conspiracy, possession of stolen property, possession of a burglary tool and resisting arrest. This is an active and ongoing investigation in the early stages. The San Francisco Traffic Collision Investigation Unit is handling the investigation. San Francisco Police Make Arrests on Market Street/ 6th Street Shooting

On Tuesday August 20th, 2019 at approximately 5:34 PM, Tenderloin Station officers responded to an altercation on the 1000 block of Market Street regarding a shots fired call. Responding officers were able to quickly locate a victim in this incident who was suffering from a wound to his face. Officers immediately rendered aid to the victim who has since been released from the hospital.

Investigators from the Tenderloin Station Investigative Team located surveillance footage showing three suspects running across Market Street. One of the suspects fired several rounds from a pistol towards a crowd of people. The surveillance footage also shows one of the three suspects physically assaulting an unknown person. Cell phone footage taken by a pedestrian also reveals one of the suspects brazenly shooting a pistol toward a nearby crowd.

A crime bulletin was distributed to members of the SFPD and to local law enforcement agencies. Two of the suspects in this incident were identified by officers from the Oakland Police Department as 18 year-old Oakland resident Lerron Simpson and 21 year-old Oakland resident Elijah Ernest. Investigations also revealed that Ernest was a Parolee at Large with a warrant for his arrest.

On Monday, August 26th at the direction of Tenderloin Station investigators, Simpson and Ernest were located and taken into custody in Oakland by members of the Oakland Police Department. A firearm was located and seized at the time of their arrest. Simpson and Ernest will be booked into San Francisco County Jail for attempted murder as well as several firearm related charges.

The third suspect in this incident, who has also been identified, is a juvenile and is still outstanding.

Project Description

S.F. Public Works has partnered with the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete infrastructure improvements along Alemany Blvd. between Seneca Avenue and Congdon Street. Public Works will manage the project and we've hired D'Arcy & Harty Construction, Inc. to complete the work.

Construction is scheduled to begin in late June 2019 with completion expected in December 2020.

This project will include sewer main replacement, street base repairs, curb ramp and bulb-out installation, minor traffic signal work at the Santa Rosa Ave. and Silver Ave. intersections and repaving between Congdon Street and Seneca Avenue. Please note, not all blocks will include sewer main replacement work. Please visit our project webpage for additional information on which blocks will include sewer work.

Sewer service will not be interrupted during construction. Please continue to use your household plumbing per the usual.

Once the sewer work is complete, crews will begin preparations to repave the street. Preparations will include installation of curb ramps and bulb-outs followed by street base repairs. Street base repairs will require the contractor saw-cut sections of the roadway, remove the broken concrete and pour back fresh concrete. Replacing the street base now will improve the longevity of the new asphalt road.

Since there are several blocks included in this project, it may be weeks or months before we reach your block. We are sending you this notice in advance of any work on the project.

Neighborhood Tip:

Please call 3-1-1 to report any issues in the neighborhood such as potholes, burnt-out traffic signals or streetlights, leaky fire hydrants, broken curbs or sidewalks, illegal dumping, etc. 311 is the primary customer service center for the City of San Francisco. They'll route your concern to the appropriate agency for follow-up.

Impacts and Restrictions

Street parking may not be possible on the block during construction work hours. In some cases, parking may not be possible on part of the adjacent block as we taper the traffic lanes to accommodate the work zone. Please see posted barricade signs for exact work hours, days, and locations, because they may vary depending on the construction task. The "no parking" signs will be posted at least 72 hours in advance to alert motorists of parking restrictions.

Vehicles parked in the construction zone during the posted work hours will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Please allow extra travel time during construction work hours.

Street cleaning restrictions will still be in effect.

Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.

- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving





Cell Phone Law

 Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.

 To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.

 When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.

 A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.

 You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.
