

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 8/2/19, a carjacking incident occurred in the Mission District, where a Ford Ecoline was stolen. On 8/3/19 at 2328 hours, Northern Station Officers saw the stolen vehicle at a Shell gas station (800 Franklin St). Officers reviewed the SVS return and confirmed the vehicle was the same that was stolen out of the Mission district. Officers approached the vehicle and detained two subjects without incident. Officers performed a cursory search of the subjects, and located a pocket knife but no other weapons. Officers then checked the VIN of the vehicle and confirmed again that it was stolen. Officers notified Mission SIT of the arrest and then the subjects were both transported to Northern Station for further questioning. Officers responded to Richmond California to transport the owner of the vehicle to Northern Station to conduct a cold show. The victim did not recognize the first subject; the second subject, he wasn't positive if it was the same suspects who committed the carjacking but said that he looks similar to the original suspect. The assigned sergeant from the Robbery Unit took over the investigation. Both subjects were booked and the vehicle was towed to the CSI lot.

On 8/4/19 at 0119 hours, officers were assigned to a fixed post assignments in front of McTeague's bar (1237 Polk St.) The officers witnessed security guards escorting the subject out of the bar who then started to act aggressively when the security guards requested assistance from the officers. Before the officers could approach the subject, he punched the victim with great force, causing the victim to drop to the ground. The officers then ran toward the subject and attempted to detain him. The subject resisted arrest but the officers were able to gain control of the subject. During the investigation, several by standards began to swarm the officers' position, at that time, officers requested emergency back up to maintain officer safety. Once back up arrived, officers were able to transport the subject to Northern Station for further investigation. Due to the officers witnessing the incident, the subject was not interviewed and was booked for the assault.







- 2. Go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
