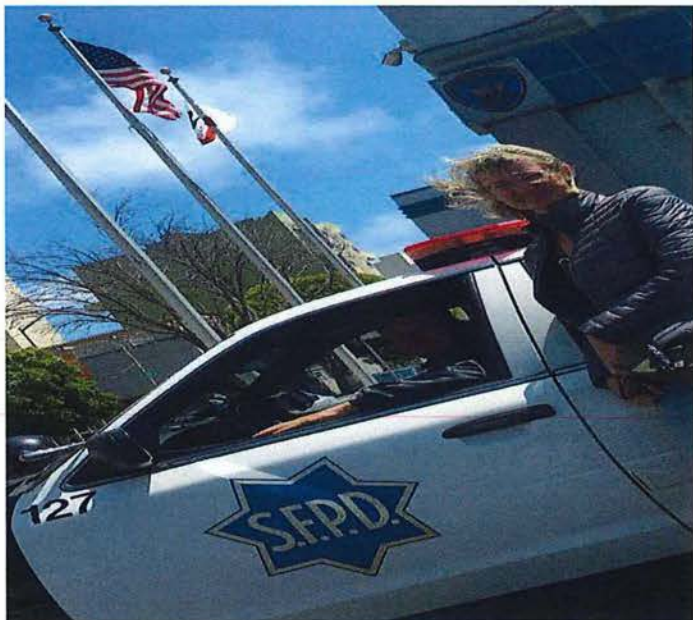

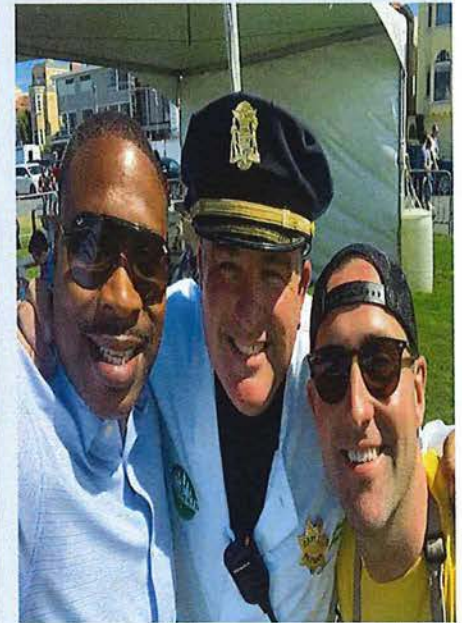
Featured Officer - Officer Stephen Hom , Union Street Foot-beat

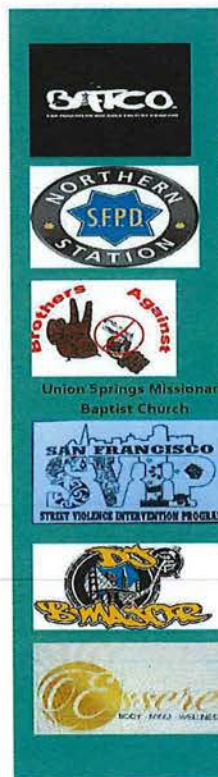

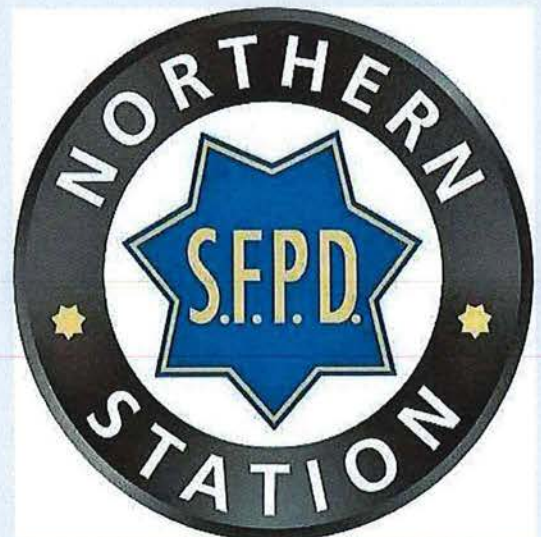

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 9/10/19 at approximately 1800 hours, officers were on patrol when they witnessed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed in the area of Lombard/Pierce. Officers advised dispatch of the reckless vehicle, however, did not pursue it due to the risk it posed to pedestrians. Officers continued their patrol when a few blocks away pedestrians waved officers down pointing to the scene of a hit and run injury accident that involved the same vehicle from earlier. Several witnesses notified the officers that they saw a suspect with a firearm fleeing the area. Officers were unable to locate the suspect. An officer later found the firearm a block away from the incident. A subject was standing two feet from the firearm pretending to tie his shoe. He then fled from officers, leaving the firearm, and after a brief foot pursuit was arrested. Officers seized the firearm. Several officers, including Northern Station's Housing Unit, and Plain Clothes Officers, responded to the scene in an attempt to locate the suspects, video surveillance, and witnesses. Northern Plainclothes Officers located a second suspect matching description provided by witnesses, however was unable to get a positive Cold Show identification for the second suspect as well as the arrested subject. Due to the fact that the subject was not identified by witnesses, he was only arrested for resisting arrest (fleeing on foot), pending retrieval of video surveillance and further investigation. The victim of the hit-and-run sustained non-life-threatening injuries.

On 8/10/19 at approximately 2340 hours, officers responded to the McDonald's parking lot (1100 Fillmore St) regarding a shooting where four victims were shot. Officers located two victims sitting on the ground with injuries who were quickly transported to the hospital. Officers located three parked vehicles with damage from fired bullets. One vehicle was detained by the first responding officers and they located a victim in the passenger seat who had been shot and was then transported to the hospital. Officers then detained a second vehicle that had the fourth victim inside who had been shot and was transported to the hospital. Within the second vehicle was a backpack officers believed belonged to the victim and opened it in an attempt to identify the victim. Inside the backpack was a black semi-automatic pistol (black semi-auto with extended magazine, no further info). Due to the firearm being concealed within the backpack and located inside the vehicle that was in control of the arrested subject, officers arrested him for possession of a loaded firearm. Multiple officers from various districts, as well as the NIU and GTF units responded to the scene. At this time, the investigation is still ongoing, being conducted by GTF. The suspect who committed the actual shooting is still outstanding.

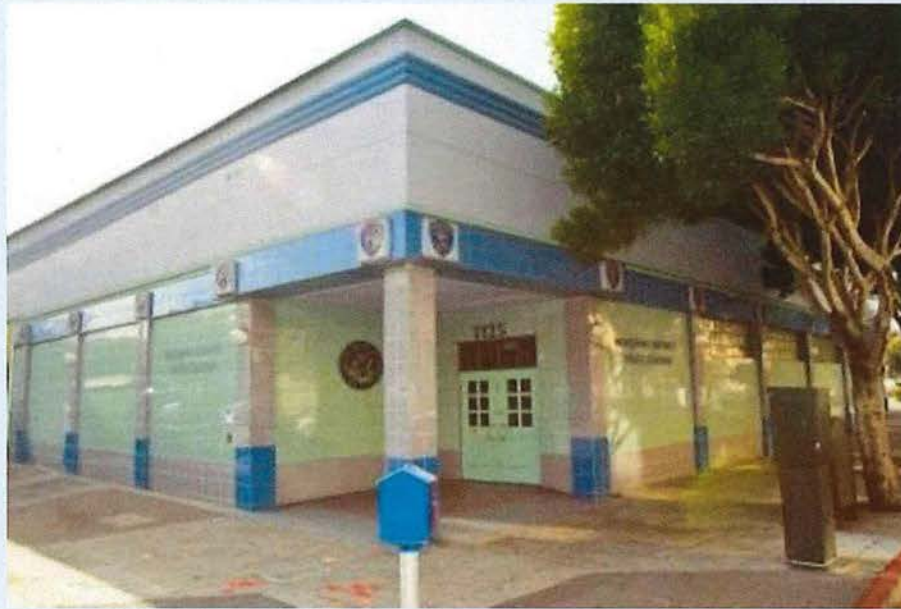

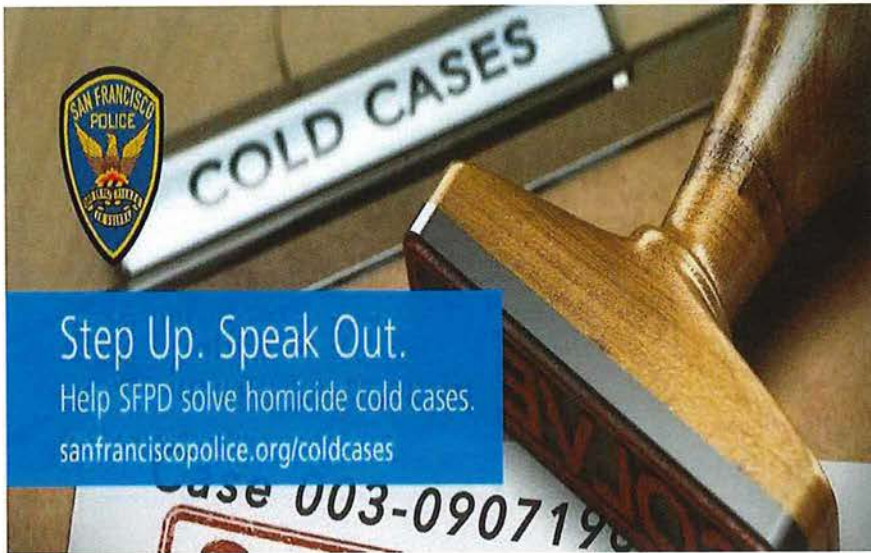

1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
2. Go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
