School will soon be out, with a consequential increase of teenage drivers on the road. The following information may be useful for parents with children, who have recently passed their driving test.

When your child is issued a provisional driver license, it is restricted for the first year, or until they turn 18, whichever comes first. These restrictions include:

- For the first year (or until 18th birthday) they may not transport passengers under the age of 20
- They may not drive between the hours of 11pm and 5am

These restrictions are waived if either a parent/guardian, or licensed driver older than 25 years, are accompanying and supervising.

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is responsible for ensuring traffic safety and statistics show provisional drivers are more likely to receive citations, or be involved in a serious accident, between 9pm to 5am. By imposing these restrictions on provisional drivers, the DMV are trying to reduce accidents and save lives. I doubt many parents would be particularly enthusiastic about the prospect of a car packed with kids speeding around the city at 2am.

Until school gets out, please remember that, when you see a stopped school bus loading or unloading children, with stop sign extended and red lights flashing, traffic from **both** directions must **STOP** and **not** proceed until the school bus finishes loading or unloading. A violation of Vehicle Code section 22454(a) results in a fine of \$695! Many times I have observed school children running for the school bus, with no awareness of traffic or concern for their personal safety. I believe that the last thing any driver wants is to injure or kill a child running for the bus.

Theft From Locked Vehicle, Resisting Arrest, Possession of Stolen Property

Officers observed two suspects casing cars near Ocean Beach. Officers followed the suspects and observed suspect 1 break into the victims vehicle and steal several items.

Officers tactically positioned their vehicles to prevent the suspects escape. Suspect 1 gave a false name to police before giving his true name.

Suspect 1 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Burglary, Resisting Arrest, Possession of Burglary Tools, Possession of Stolen Property

Suspect 2 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Burglary, Possession of Burglary Tools, Possession of Stolen Property, Driving Without a License

The suspect entered the store and the victim immediately recognized him from multiple prior shoplifting incidents. The victim alerted other staff to the suspects presence and prepared to ask him to leave the store. The suspect grabbed a prepared food item in a plastic container and hit the victim in the face and fled the store.

Officers spotted the suspect a few blocks away and detained him without incident. The victim positively identified the suspect.

The victim sustained abrasions to the face and a headache like pain and was transported to the hospital.

A records check revealed the suspect was released on his own recognizance while he had three pending robbery charges.

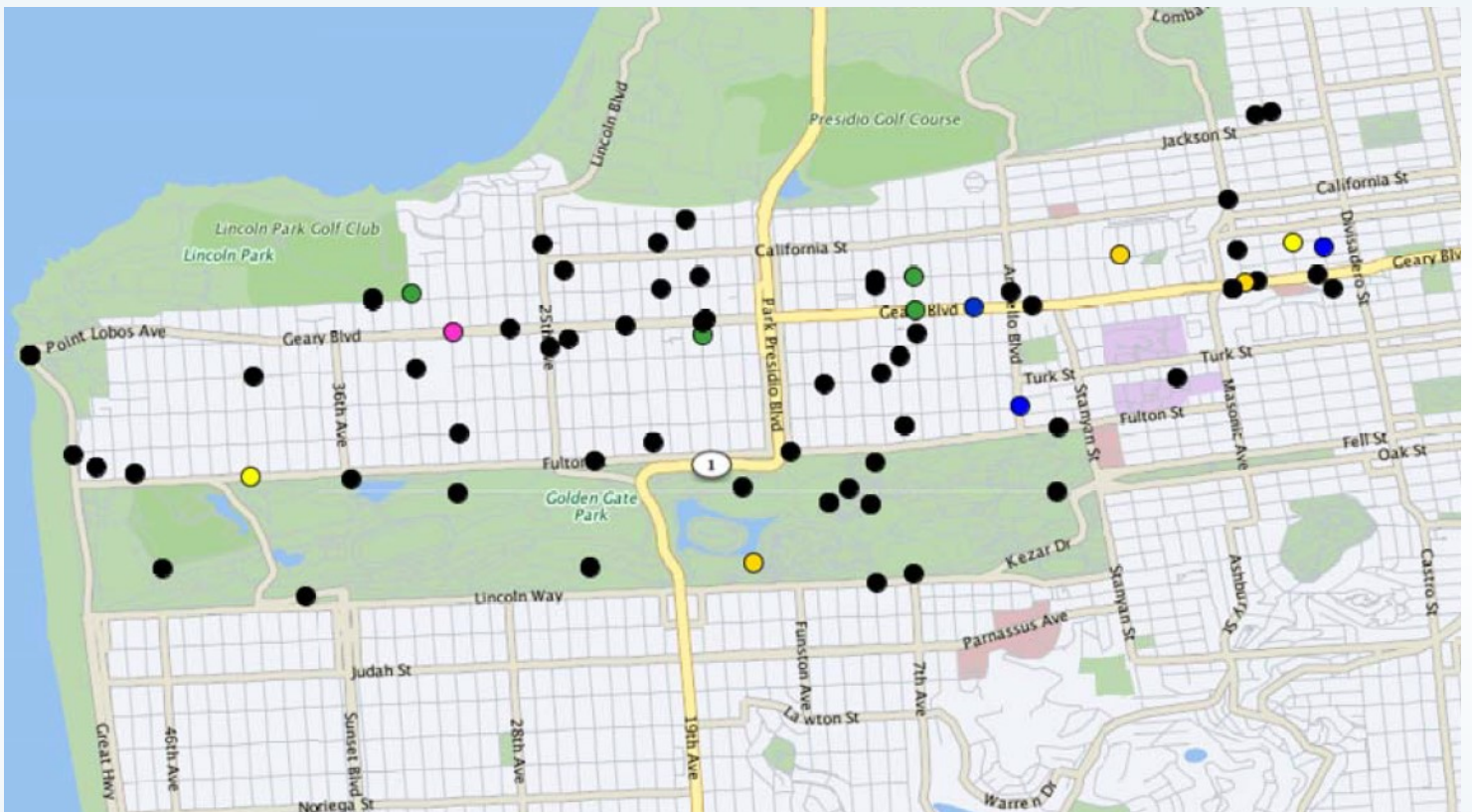
The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Robbery, Elder Abuse, Committing a Felony While out on Own Recognizance.

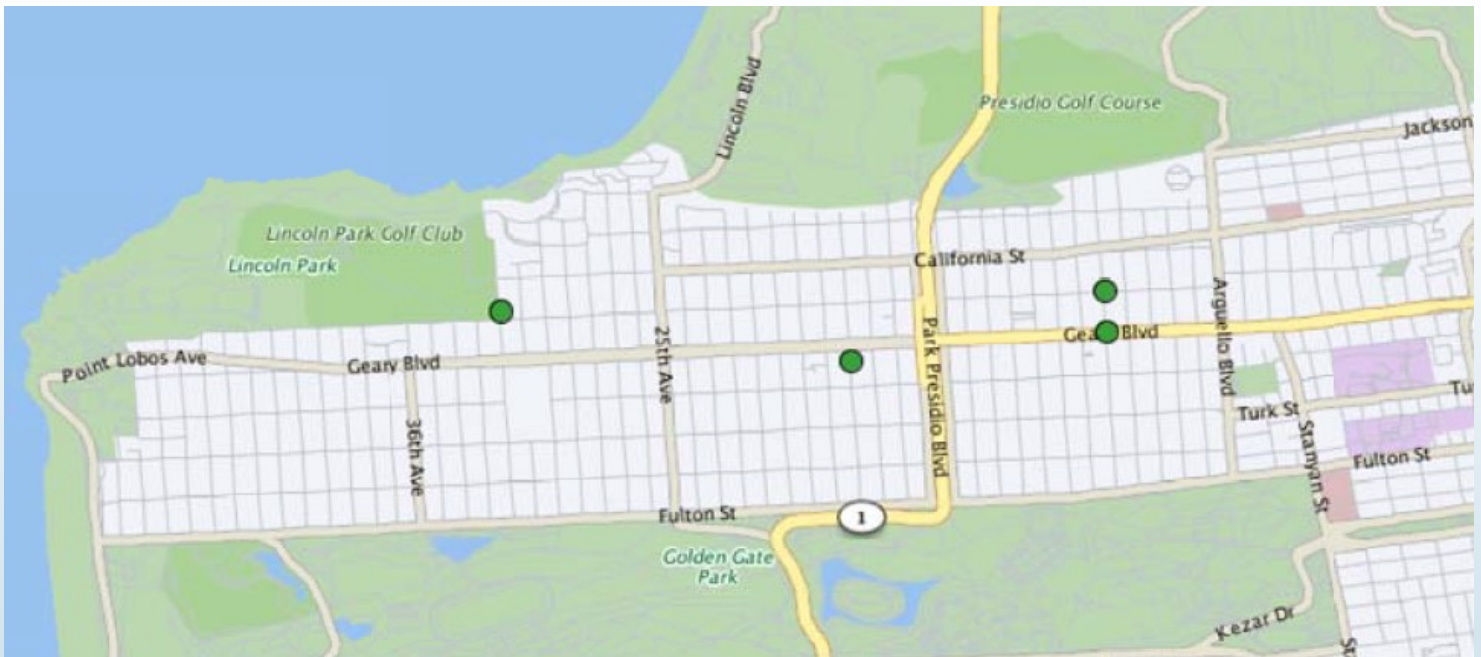

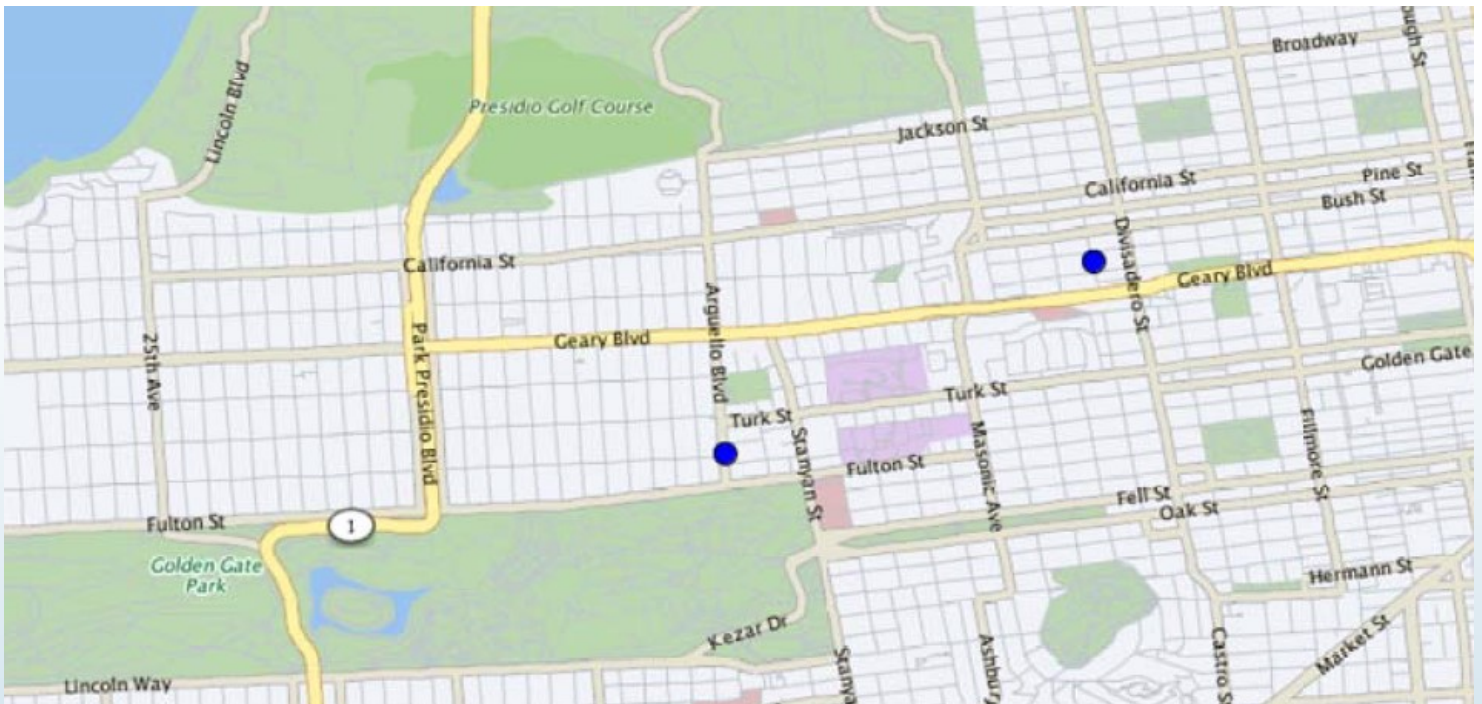
