The police non-emergency line, 415-553-0123, can be used for noise complaints, wellness checks, or to report crimes that are not in progress.

### **JESSE FINK**





#### DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

#### **Examples of Suspicious Activity:**

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

#### **DEFINITIONS OF CRIME**

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**— An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

\*\* $\underline{\text{Assault}}$  is when a person swings their arm and  $\underline{\text{battery}}$  is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\*

**Aggravated Assault**— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft**– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

### Elder Adult Abuse, Conspiracy 6/2/19 14:54 Geary Blvd/ 3rd Ave

The Elderly Victim was walking down the street when he was hit in the back of the head unprovoked. The Victim then saw two suspects run past him and get on the bus. The Victim boarded the bus and alerted the driver that he had been assaulted by the two suspects. The driver closed the doors to the bus and called the police. The suspects were able to exit the bus before police arrived.

Officers viewed footage of the incident and were able to identify both suspects. Officers located Suspect 1 at his residence and placed him under arrest. An airsoft gun was located in the suspect's possession.

Suspect 1 was arrested and booked at Juvenile Justice Center on the following charges: Elder Abuse, Conspiracy, Resisting Arrest

Suspect 2 is still outstanding

# Vandalism to Vehicle, Evading a Police Officer Recklessly 6/1/19 18:30 Great Hwy/ Lincoln Way

The Victim observed the Suspect hit another vehicle while backing up. The Victim told the Suspect he should leave his info on the car and offered him a pen. The Suspect drove away at a high rate of speed and intentionally ran into the Victim's motorcycle.

Richmond units located the vehicle at multiple locations in the district and the vehicle recklessly evaded police multiple times.

A BOLO was put out by Richmond Station Investigation Team regarding the incident for the vehicle and the Suspect.

The vehicle was located by Daly City PD on 6/2/19.

Ingleside Officers located and arrested the Suspect during an unrelated narcotics case.


The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Vandalism, Reckless Evading







- 1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at <a href="https://www.jobaps.com/sf">www.jobaps.com/sf</a> (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
- 2. Go to <u>www.nationaltestingnetwork.com</u>, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination\*.

\*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration. The Police Reserve Officer Program is comprised of community members, such as yourself, and retired police officers who wish to volunteer as a Reserve Police Officer. These officers supplement the full-time officers in a variety of duties throughout the Department. This program is ideal for individuals who have an established career but always wanted to experience being a Police Officer. Reserve Officers can enjoy the best of both worlds, maintain their chosen career while helping to police an internationally known city. There will be a Level III Reserve Police Academy starting on September 23, 2019 and it will conclude on December 4th. The Reserve Academy takes place on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6pm to 10pm and all day on Saturdays from 8am to 5pm. The cost for the Academy is 1765.00. This is the minimum requirement to be a Level III Reserve in the state of California. This is a volunteer position with great training opportunities and experiences seldom seen. The Level III Academy is 168 hours long.
