Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on June 3rd, 11th, 19th, and 27th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these nonmotorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Assault, Att Homicide W/ Gun 6/6/19 19:28 28th Ave / Geary

The Victim was working on his car outside when the Suspect rode by on a bicycle and fired several rounds striking the Victim in the back of the head.

Witnesses heard the gun shots and saw the Suspect riding away. The Victim and witnesses were able to identify the suspect.

The Victim sustained injuries and was transported to the hospital.

On 6/11/19, Richmond Officers located and arrested the Suspect. The gun was also recovered.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Carrying a loaded fire arm, Brandishing a Weapon, Using a Firearm in the Commission of a Felony, Att Murder, Assault W/ Deadly Weapon, Narcotics Violation.

Recovered/ Stolen Vehicle, Possession of Stolen Property, Possession of Prohibited Weapon 6/7/19 23:41 7th Ave/ Hugo St

Officers observed a vehicle parked in a red zone with no front plate. A records check revealed the rear plate and the vehicle to be stolen. The vehicle was occupied by the Suspect who was taken into custody.

A search of the Suspect revealed brass knuckles fitted with a window punch.

A records check revealed the Suspect was on probation out of two different counties and was also prohibited from operating a vehicle without an ignition lock.


The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Unlawful Taking of a Vehicle, Possession of Stolen Property, Possession of Burglary Tools, Possession of Brass Knuckles, and Multiple Vehicle Code Violations.







Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration. The Police Reserve Officer Program is comprised of community members, such as yourself, and retired police officers who wish to volunteer as a Reserve Police Officer. These officers supplement the full-time officers in a variety of duties throughout the Department. This program is ideal for individuals who have an established career but always wanted to experience being a Police Officer. Reserve Officers can enjoy the best of both worlds, maintain their chosen career while helping to police an internationally known city. There will be a Level III Reserve Police Academy starting on September 23, 2019 and it will conclude on December 4th. The Reserve Academy takes place on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6pm to 10pm and all day on Saturdays from 8am to 5pm. The cost for the Academy is 1765.00. This is the minimum requirement to be a Level III Reserve in the state of California. This is a volunteer position with great training opportunities and experiences seldom seen. The Level III Academy is 168 hours long.
