

JESSE FINK





Richmond Station Officers observed a large tree branch, with a large crack, that was about to fall into the road. Officers notified DPW and blocked traffic until the limb was removed.



DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault— An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Exhibiting a Firearm, Possession of a Firearm by Prohibited Person 6/17/19 22:50 600 Block 44th Ave

The Victim and the Suspect got in a verbal argument regarding a delivery. The Suspect returned to his car and the argument continued. The Suspect then pointed what appeared to be a firearm at the Victim.

Units arrived and located the Suspect inside his vehicle. Officers removed the Suspect from the vehicle and located a loaded firearm concealed in the Suspect's waistband in a holster.

A records check revealed the firearm was not registered to the Suspect. The records check also revealed the Suspect was prohibited from possessing a firearm.

A search of the vehicle revealed an illegal expandable baton and a paintball gun.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Terrorists Threats, Brandishing, and multiple weapons charges.

Officers responded to a call regarding a stolen vehicle that was being tracked by the owner. Officers located the vehicle in a parking garage at the address. The Suspect was then located downstairs in the store and was in possession of the keys to the vehicle.

A records check revealed The Suspect was on probation out of Alameda County for a similar offense.



- 1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
- 2. Go to <u>www.nationaltestingnetwork.com</u>, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration. The Police Reserve Officer Program is comprised of community members, such as yourself, and retired police officers who wish to volunteer as a Reserve Police Officer. These officers supplement the full-time officers in a variety of duties throughout the Department. This program is ideal for individuals who have an established career but always wanted to experience being a Police Officer. Reserve Officers can enjoy the best of both worlds, maintain their chosen career while helping to police an internationally known city. There will be a Level III Reserve Police Academy starting on September 23, 2019 and it will conclude on December 4th. The Reserve Academy takes place on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6pm to 10pm and all day on Saturdays from 8am to 5pm. The cost for the Academy is 1765.00. This is the minimum requirement to be a Level III Reserve in the state of California. This is a volunteer position with great training opportunities and experiences seldom seen. The Level III Academy is 168 hours long.
