

As many of you know Tenderloin Station Officers responded to a traumatic incident in October 2017 when fellow Officer Elia Lewin-Tankel was hit by a stolen vehicle. This event changed Elia's life for ever suffering from a traumatic brain injury. Last week the suspect who hit Elia was sentenced to 12 years and 8 months in state prison. Over the past 22 months Elia has exemplified incredible courage and determination which has inspired so many. The outpour of support from the Tenderloin Community has meant so much to the Officers here at Tenderloin Station. We will continue to provide updates on Elia's progress and he continues to improve everyday.


Firearm, Possession of Loaded: Firearm, Possession by Prohibited Person; Driving, License Suspended or Revoked.

Officers were on patrol in the area of Charles J. Brenham/ McAllister St. when they conducted a traffic stop for no license plate. Officers made contact with driver and discovered he/ she license was suspended. The driver was unable to located a licensed driver in the allotted time.

Officers performed an inventory search on the vehicle and located a loaded pistol and 4 extended magazine. Both suspects were transported to Tenderloin Station and booked accordingly.
