**Ofc. Albert Tien was born and raised in Methuen, Massachusetts. SF Native Rose Ann Harris was born at San Francisco General Hospital and raised in the Mission District. Rose attended St. Anthony's, Le Conte, the Lytton School, and Mission High School. After living in Visitacion Valley, she moved to the Excelsior in 1989 where she now resides.

Rose is an exemplary community member and volunteer. Rose volunteers for dozens of groups that support neighborhood connection and wellness, including the Excelsior District Improvement Association, the Outer Mission Merchants and Residents Association, McLaren Park Collaborative, the Excelsior Action Group, the Wildlife Conservation Network, Neighborhood Emergency Response Team, the District 11 Council, and others. ### Robbery

Officers responded to the 700 block of Cayuga Avenue to investigate a robbery with a gun. The victim told the responding officers that he was walking when he was approached by the suspect who brandished a handgun in his waistband. The suspect stole the victim's necklace and cell phone. While speaking with officers, the victim noticed the suspect who had just robbed him emerge from a nearby residence. The victim quickly pointed out the suspect, who was taken into custody and transported to Ingleside Station. While officers were at the station conducting their robbery investigation, a second victim of this gun wielding suspect came to Ingleside Station to report he had also been chased and robbed at gunpoint. This victim was walking when the suspect approached him as well, then chased him, and pointed a gun at him demanding his items. Neither of the victims were injured during their incidents. **Vehicle Arson**

A victim was awoken by someone pounding on her front door. The victim looked out her window and saw that her vehicle was engulfed in flames. The fire department responded and extinguished the fire. Surveillance video showed that a vehicle pull up next to the victim's vehicle. A suspect was then seen exiting and throwing a lit flare into the victim's vehicle, starting the fire. **Vehicle Arson**

The above mentioned hooligans struck again! This time officers responded to the 300 block of Chicago Way on another vehicle fire. Just like before, surveillance video caught the arsonists in the act. It showed the same suspect throwing a lit flare through the back window of the victim's vehicle. The victim was alerted by her neighbor about the incident. **Robbery**

Ingleside Officers Foxworth and Espinosa were dispatched to a robbery that had just taken place. The female victim was very upset and crying, but unharmed. She told the officers that she was sitting on a park bench when a suspect sat down next to her. The suspect slid close to the victim and placed a weapon to her side, demanding money. A suspect attempted to exit the store with a full shopping cart of items without paying. As security tried to stop him, the suspect plowed his way into the parking lot using the shopping cart. The suspect then grabbed a glass bottle from the cart, and swung it at the security guard, nearly striking him. The suspect then walked away with bottle in hand, while security recovered the remaining items from the cart. Luckily responding officers were alert and took the suspect into custody before he could hit anyone with the bottle. Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

1. Graduate the SFPD NERT course (<http://sf-fire.org/neighborhood-emergency-response-team-nert>), or,
2. Graduate the SFPD Community Police Academy course (<https://sanfranciscopolice.org/community-police-academy>)
3. Pass a basic DOJ/FBI Background check.
4. Sign up for the next 8 hour ALERT new volunteer training class.





### SFPD Participates In Pink Patch Project

On Tuesday, October 1, 2019, the women and men of the San Francisco Police Department will join law enforcement agencies around the country in the Pink Patch Project, a collaborative effort created to raise awareness and funds for breast cancer research and treatment. ### **San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Southern Auto Burglary**

On Monday September 23, 2019 at approximately 10:18AM San Francisco Police officers from Southern Station were on bike patrol in the area of Russ and Natoma Streets. Officers observed a subject, later identified as 32 year-old Jessica Didia of San Francisco, sitting on and obstructing the sidewalk with several bags around her in violation of San Francisco Municipal Code.

A computer inquiry revealed that Didia was on probation and subject to a search condition. Officers searched Didia's bags and found several items labeled with two different names as well as the name of a local school. Officers contacted the school. The school immediately contacted students that were on a field trip at the Hall of Justice in San Francisco. The students went to their vehicle and determined that several items were missing, including, computers, backpacks, and calculators. The items were returned to the students.

Officers placed Didia under arrest. Didia was booked at San Francisco County Jail on charges of receiving stolen property, obstructing the street/sidewalk and probation violation. Due to pending identification matters a booking photo of Didia is not being released at this time.



## Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.



### Distracted Driving Prevention

- ✓ Never Text and Drive
- ✓ Silence your phone before you drive
- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving



## Cell Phone Law

 Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.

 To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.

 When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.

 A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.

 You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.
