The Richmond District had a big weekend with three days of Outside Lands. All hands were on deck to ensure a safe and fun event for all.


School is starting soon so we expect to see an uptick in traffic and children will be out going to and from school. It's always a good idea to drive slowly and look for pedestrians.





DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault— An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**<u>Assault</u> is when a person swings their arm and <u>battery</u> is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault—Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

INCIDENTS IN THE RICHMOND DISTRICT THIS WEEK

Driving Under the Influence 8/9/19 03:21 200 Block 21st Ave

Officers observed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed in a residential area, narrowly avoiding colliding with the patrol car.

Officers conducted a traffic stop. The driver smelled of alcohol and showed signs of intoxication.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Driving Under the Influence, Speeding.

Aggravated Assault, Vandalism, Reckless Driving 8/5/19 12:23 1000 Great Hwy

The Victim got in her vehicle near Lands End after taking photographs. The Victim stated the Suspect then drove his vehicle directly in front of hers, blocking her in. The Victim was blocked in for several minutes before she was able to maneuver out. The Suspect then followed the Victim and drove in front of her vehicle several times preventing her from exiting the parking lot.

The Victim was finally able to exit and the Suspect continued to follow, driving on the wrong side of the road and cutting off the Victim. The Suspect then made a u turn and drove on the wrong side of the road again, directly at the Victim, who had to swerve to avoid a collision.

The Suspect then exited his vehicle and punched the side mirror and shards of glass struck the Victim. The Suspect then sped away.

Dash cam video captured the incident in its entirety.

Officers were able to identify the driver and the vehicle.

Officers contacted Antioch PD to be on the lookout for the driver and the vehicle. Several hours later Antioch PD located the driver and vehicle. SFPD officers responded and arrested the suspect.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Aggravated Assault, Reckless Driving, False Imprisonment, Vandalism to Vehicle.


MAP OF CRIMES






