Notable Recaps

230-310-813: Homicide w/ Gun, Reckless Evasion

05-04-2023 @ 1910 hours, 1800 block of Eddy Street

A victim was standing on the sidewalk when they were approached by a suspect. The suspect fired three shots at the victim and struck the victim once in the abdomen. The suspect fled the scene in a vehicle prior to arrival of the officers. Officers responded on multiple calls of a person shot and rendered aid to the victim. The victim was pronounced deceased by medical personnel at S.F.G.H. This investigation is on-going, and the San Francisco Police Homicide Division is handling the case.

230-315-744: Hot Prowl Burglary, Conspiracy, Theft

05-06-2023 @ 1840 hours, 900 block of Geary Street

A suspect gained unlawful access to the interior of an apartment complex located on the 900 block of Geary Street by getting "buzzed" in. The suspect opened the rear exit door to allow a different suspect into the building. The two suspects then used a screwdriver to pry the door of a unit and gained access.

The rightful residents and a family member of the aforementioned apartment unit returned home and confronted the suspects inside. One suspect locked themselves in the bathroom and the other suspect was held down by the residents. Upon police arrival, both suspects were detained and placed under arrest. One suspect was transported to S.F.G.H. by medics and they spit on medical personnel while en route to the hospital. The two suspects were found to be in possession of the victim's property, property of victims not related to this incident, and they left narcotics and narcotic paraphernalia in the residence. One suspect was also determined to be on probation for burglary. The two suspects were later transported to San Francisco County Jail.

230-307-848: Carjacking, Trespassing

05-03-2023 @ 1645 hours, 1900 block of Franklin Street

Officers responded on a report of a trespasser knocking on doors of an apartment building on the 1900 block of Franklin Street and refusing to leave. Residents followed the suspect out of the building while police responded. During that time, the suspect attempted to steal a double-parked vehicle that was left running. The owner of the vehicle confronted the suspect who could not operate the manual transmission vehicle. A physical altercation ensued where the suspect punched the victim multiple times, and the victim pepper sprayed the suspect. Police arrived and arrested the suspect without further incident. Victims were not injured and refused medical treatment. The suspect was arrested and booked at San Francisco County Jail.

SFPD Makes Arrest in the 400 Block of Duboce Avenue Homicide

On Friday, May 5, 2023, at approximately 11:00 a.m., San Francisco Police officers from Park Station responded to the 400 block of Duboce Avenue regarding a report of an unresponsive person on the ground inside of a building. Officers arrived on scene and located the victim, a 64-year-old female, suffering from an apparent stab wound. Officers rendered aid and summoned medics to the scene.

Despite efforts by first responders, the victim succumbed to her injuries and was declared deceased.

Officers quickly obtained suspect information, located and then detained him within the same building. Officers identified the suspect as, 41-year-old Jesus Esparza of San Francisco, and developed probable cause to arrest him.

Esparza was transported and booked at San Francisco County Jail for charges of murder (187(a) PC), elder abuse (368(b)(1) PC), and resisting arrest (148(a)(1) PC).

This investigation is being led by the SFPD Homicide Detail.

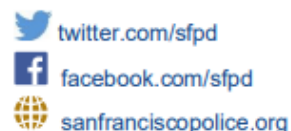

San Francisco Police Seizes Three Vehicles Involved in a Stunt Driving Event in the City

On April 15, 2023, at approximately 11:30 p.m., SFPD officers assigned to the Stunt Driving Response Unit (SDRU) responded to the area of Dolores and 16th Street for a report of numerous cars with a large number of spectators and participants. Our stunt driving response unit was activated and dispersed the group who fled onto city streets.

Investigators from the SFPD SDRU investigated and identified three vehicles involved in the stunt driving event. Investigators authored vehicle seizure orders for two Chevrolet Corvettes and a Ford Mustang, which were authorized by a judge commanding the seizure and impounding.

On April 18, 2023, at approximately 4:00 p.m., San Francisco Police officers from Ingleside Station and members from the SFPD Traffic Company, served a seizure order for one of the Corvettes on the 300 block of Lisbon Street. Officers seized the vehicle and had it towed to the vehicle impound lot for a mandatory 30-day hold.

On April 19, 2023, at approximately 7:00 p.m., San Francisco Police officers from Ingleside Station and members from the SFPD Traffic Company, located the other wanted Chevrolet Corvette in the Lakeview neighborhood. Officers seized the vehicle and had it towed to the vehicle impound lot for a mandatory 30-day hold.

The third vehicle involved, a Ford Mustang, was located and seized by San Mateo County Sheriffs, who had it towed for a mandatory 30-day hold.

Photos of the seized vehicles are attached to this release.

The SFPD works within the confines of our local laws and ordinances to ultimately arrest suspects and seize vehicles that are involved in these stunt driving incidents. At this time no arrests have been made, but our investigators are working to identify those involved.

Officers arrived on scene and located the victim, a 15-year-old male, suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. Officers rendered aid and summoned medics to the scene. The victim was transported to a nearby hospital with life-threatening injuries.

Despite efforts by first responders and medical personnel, the victim succumbed to his injuries and was declared deceased.

This investigation is being led by the SFPD Homicide Detail.

San Francisco Police Investigators Serve Multiple Warrants that Lead to the Arrest of Five Known Gang Members

The search and arrest warrants lead to multiple firearms and firearm accessories seized

Since the beginning of 2023, members of SFPD's Community Violence Reduction Team (CVRT) and the Crime Gun Investigations Center (CGIC) have led a lengthy investigation into a criminal street gang that is based in San Francisco but has several ties all over the Bay Area. They are known to have committed multiple violent and property crimes in the Bay Area.

Through a coordinated effort between the San Francisco Police Department and several bay area law enforcement agencies, multiple search and arrest warrants were obtained and served for members of the local criminal street gang.

On April 19, 2023, SFPD members of CVRT and CGIC, located 29-year-old Maurkece Johns of San Francisco, in the area of Harbor Road and Bertha Avenue where he fled from the officers on foot. After a brief foot pursuit, officers placed Johns into custody. Officers served a search warrant at Johns' residence which resulted in the seizure of two firearms, ammunition, and other evidence related to the investigation. Johns was transported and booked at San Francisco County Jail for multiple gun related charges and resisting arrest (148(a)(1) PC).

On April 27, 2023, officers from the CVRT and CGIC team, along with multiple law enforcement agencies, simultaneously served six search warrants throughout the Bay Area that resulted in four arrests, the seizure of multiple firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition, and other evidence related to the investigation.

The suspects were identified as 29-year-old Eric Jones of Concord, CA, 34-year-old Dajaun Menifee of Hercules, 23-year-old Johnnie Leonard of Alameda, and 34-year-old Kameron Kaywood of San Ramon.

Jones was booked at San Francisco County Jail for an outstanding SF warrant for five counts of auto burglary (459 2nd PC) and for a charge of felon in possession of a firearm (2900(a)(1) PC).

Menifee was booked at Martinez County Jail for an outstanding warrant out of Oakland for numerous firearm related charges. Menifee was also booked for additional charges of felon in possession of a firearm (29800(a)(1) PC), possession of a firearm while on probation (29815(a) PC), felon in possession of ammunition (30305(a) PC), two counts of possession of a large capacity magazine (32310 (a) PC), possession of a loaded firearm in a vehicle (25850(c)(1) PC), and two counts of possession of a firearm as a prohibited person (29825(a) PC).

Leonard was booked at Santa Rita County Jail for an outstanding warrant out of Oakland for numerous firearm related charges and gang enhancement (186.22(a) PC). Leonard was also booked for an additional charge of possession a large capacity magazine (32310 PC).

Kaywood was booked at Alameda County Jail for an outstanding warrant out of Contra Costa County for numerous firearm related charges. Kaywood was also booked for additional charges of possession of an assault rifle (30605(a) PC), possession of a firearm when convicted of a violent crime (29900(a)(1) PC), felon in possession of a firearm (29800(a)(1) PC), two counts of possession of a firearm as a prohibited person (29825(a) PC), felon in possession of ammunition (30305(a) PC), and possession of a large capacity magazine (32310(a) PC).

Photos of the seized firearms and firearm accessories accompany this news release.

The San Francisco Police Department would like to thank the following law enforcement agencies for their assistance in the investigation and the apprehension of the suspects: the San Francisco District Attorney's Office, Oakland PD, San Ramon PD, Contra Costa Regional S.W.A.T., Solano County Regional S.W.A.T., Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF).

On Sunday, April 30, 2023, at approximately 4:35 a.m., San Francisco Police officers from Southern Station responded to 5th and Shipley Streets regarding a report of a shooting. Officers arrived on scene and located the victim suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. Officers rendered aid and summoned medics to the scene. Despite the lifesaving efforts of the emergency responders the victim succumbed to their injuries and was declared deceased.

This investigation is being led by the SFPD Homicide Detail. The investigation determined that the shooting occurred on the 900 block of Folsom St. The victim fled from the scene in a vehicle where it came to rest at 5th and Shipley.

No arrest has been made at this time for this active investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call the SFPD 24-hour Tip Line at 1-415-575-4444 or Text a Tip to TIP411 and begin the text message with SFPD. You may remain anonymous.

PREVENT GARAGE DOOR BREAK-INS

Garages can sometimes be the most vulnerable area of the home and they are often the entry point most targeted by thieves because of the easy access to the home. Here are some tips to help secure your garage and protect it from theft.



ALWAYS CLOSE YOUR GARAGE DOOR

This may seem obvious, but just drive through any residential neighborhood and you'll likely see a few wide-open garage doors. This is an invitation to burglars and at the very least, you're allowing passersby to easily view the contents of your garage.



INSTALL MOTION-SENSITIVE LIGHTS

Homes and garages with poor exterior lighting become more appealing targets for burglars. Ensure all entry points are well-lit. Constant lighting supplemented by motion sensitive lighting is best.



REINFORCE THE GLASS ON THE GARAGE DOOR

Add vinyl adhesive to reinforce garage windows. You can also opt for a frosted or translucent glass design to allow sunlight in while obscuring contents inside.



DON'T LEAVE GARAGE DOOR REMOTE IN YOUR CAR

A garage door remote is basically another key into your home and thieves won't hesitate to use it if they find it. Opt to use a remote on a keychain.



INSTALL AN INTERIOR MANUAL GARAGE DOOR LOCK

When leaving on a vacation or for extended periods of time, disconnect automatic door motor and install a manual lock.



TIE EMERGENCY RELEASE CORD

Tying your emergency release cord into a small ball will make it more difficult to reach by thieves who manage to break the garage windows.



INSTALL SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

There should be at least 1 exterior mounted camera facing the street and registered with the D.A.'s office.



SECURE ANY VALUABLES

Keep all tools in cabinet systems with locks and be sure to hang and lock any bicycles. As much as possible, try to avoid keeping valuable items in the garage or inside vehicles.



HAVE A QUALITY, FUNCTIONING GARAGE DOOR

Garage doors should be as secure, sturdy, and well-built as your front door and should remain in good condition and tight fitting. Deadbolts should also be added to the garage-to-house door.



INSTALL INTERIOR MAIL SLOT HOOD COVER

If the garage door is equipped with a mail slot, a hood cover will prevent any view into the garage and its contents, eliminating enticement to enter.

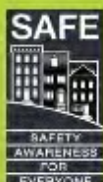
