SFPD Makes Arrests in Central District Shooting

The incident resulted in several arrests

San Francisco, CA – On Sunday, June 18, 2023, at approximately 7:12 P.M., San Francisco Police officers from Southern and Central Stations responded to multiple locations in the Southern and Central Police Districts for a report of a shooting that resulted in multiple vehicle collisions. Officers found three crime scenes at the following locations: Beach and Stockton Streets, The Embarcadero and Kearny Street, and The Embarcadero and Howard Street.

SFPD officers responded to the area of Beach and Stockton Streets when they received several reports that the occupants of a white sedan and the occupants of a black SUV were exchanging gunfire as they were traveling eastbound on Beach Street. The suspects continued to exchange gunfire as they drove through several city streets.

Three uninvolved victim vehicles were struck by gunfire in the area of Beach and Stockton Streets. A 48-year-old male victim inside one of the vehicles sustained non-life-threatening injuries when he was struck by broken glass that was shattered as a result of the gunfire. The victim was transported to a local hospital for treatment.

The vehicles continued to drive south on The Embarcadero. In the intersection of The Embarcadero and Kearny Street, the white sedan struck a 10-year-old female victim, and the black SUV struck a 16-year-old victim, both of whom were crossing The Embarcadero. The 10-year-old victim was transported to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The 16-year-old was treated at the scene for non-life-threatening injuries.

Both suspect vehicles continued south on The Embarcadero. At the intersection of The Embarcadero and Howard Street, the black SUV collided with a fixed object and came to a rest. The white sedan fled the scene. Officers detained the two occupants of the black SUV. The occupants were a 28-year-old female, and 33-year-old male who were both struck by gunfire

during the incident, and both were transported to a local hospital for treatment. The male was treated for life-threatening injuries and later released. The female was treated and later released for non-life-threatening injuries. The male had initially been arrested related to this incident, but was later released pending further investigation.

Throughout their investigation, members of the Night Investigations Unit were able to identify the occupants of the Infiniti to be an auto burglary crew on a spree of auto burglaries throughout the Northern Police District and Central Police District, prior to the shooting incident. Three subjects in the Infiniti were identified as Richard Tuiasosopo, Xavier Pittman, and a male juvenile.

The San Francisco Police Department Night Investigations Unit collaborated with the District Attorney's Office, Major Crimes Unit, towards the issuance of arrest warrants for the arrest of Richard Tuiasosopo, Xavier Pittman, and the male juvenile.

On 10/18/2023, members of the San Francisco Police Department Night Investigations Unit, Special Investigations Division, Fugitive Recovery Enforcement Team, Crime Gun Investigation Center, Community Violence Reduction Team, Burglary Unit, Tactical and Specialist Team, and Robbery Unit arrested Xavier Pittman and the male juvenile. Richard Tuiasosopo was already in custody at Santa Rita jail on charges unrelated to this shooting incident.

Search warrants were served in four Bay Area counties with the assistance of the Richmond Police Department, the Vallejo Police Department, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), and the South San Francisco Police Department.

Thirteen handguns, four assault-styled rifles, and a large volume of ammunition were seized during the execution of these search warrants.

Increased Security Measures Surrounding APEC Leaders' Meeting

SAN FRANCISCO – Increased local security measures will be in place in the days leading up to, during and immediately following the Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation Leaders' Summit in San Francisco Nov. 15-18.

Vehicular, public transportation and pedestrian impacts should be expected in the downtown area around the Moscone Center, the San Francisco waterfront area and the Nob Hill neighborhood.

"While an event of this size will undoubtedly impact the people of San Francisco, the goal of the Secret Service and our law enforcement and public safety partners is to provide a secure environment while minimizing impact and inconveniences to residents and businesses," said Assistant Special Agent in Charge Jeremy Brown, the U.S. Secret Service's APEC Summit Coordinator.

Residences and businesses inside the affected areas will generally be accessible. Drivers requiring access to residential and business parking lots and pedestrians visiting businesses or attending events within the closure area must enter at marked locations, show identification, and will be subject to search by law enforcement personnel. Please plan accordingly and expect delays throughout the week.

The public should also expect parking restrictions. All vehicles that are parked in violation of the emergency no parking signs will be ticketed and towed. Restrictions will begin on Tuesday, Nov. 14, at 10 p.m., and extend through Saturday evening, Nov. 18.

A comprehensive traffic plan and map, to include street closures and parking restrictions, will be available at www.sf.gov/APEC.

All deliveries and services into the secure area must be completed prior to 8 p.m. on the night of Nov. 14. The security perimeter will be closed on Nov. 14 from 9 p.m. to approximately 6 a.m. for a security sweep. After the security perimeter is closed, commercial or delivery vehicles requiring access to a secure area must report to the U.S. Secret Service's Remote Delivery Site/Commercial Vehicle Screening at Pier 27,

27 The Embarcadero, San Francisco, CA 04111 to undergo screening. This screening site will be open starting Nov. 14 at 8 p.m. and continue operations until on November 18 at 10 p.m. All drivers must have a valid driver's license rated for the vehicle they are driving. Upon completion of the screening process, all delivery vehicles will be sealed and must proceed directly to the security checkpoint. If they arrive at the checkpoint with a broken seal, they will be required to return to the screening site for re-screening. All deliveries in the secure area are expected to occur in the overnight and early morning hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

"The San Francisco Police Department is thrilled to welcome visitors from around the world for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation conference," said San Francisco Police Chief Bill Scott. "This will be an opportunity to showcase our beautiful city on a global scale. We are committed to ensuring the safety of everyone in our city during the event and we are using every resource available to protect our city."

Public transport services operated by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will also be impacted in the area around the event venues. Customers who use stations or bus routes in this area should allow additional travel time to account for detours and delays. Please visit the SFMTA website for the latest impacts.

The APEC Leaders' Summit, which is part of the larger APEC Economic Leaders' Week, has been designated a National Special Security Event by the Department of Homeland Security, a designation that is based in part on the event's significance, size and attendees. Designating an event an NSSE allows for significant resources from the federal government, as well as state and local partners, to be used to ensure a robust security plan is in place.

Northern District Officer-Involved Shooting

SAN FRANCISCO (October 9, 2023) — On Monday, October 9, 2023, at approximately 3:09 p.m. San Francisco Police Officers responded to the area of Geary Blvd. and Laguna St. on a report of a vehicle that crashed into a building.

When officers arrived on scene, they found that the vehicle had come to rest in the lobby of the Chinese Consulate. An officer contacted the suspect and an officer involved shooting occurred. Officers rendered aid and summoned paramedics to the scene. Paramedics with the San Francisco Fire Department responded to the scene and transported the suspect to a local hospital with life threatening injuries. Despite lifesaving efforts of officers, paramedics, and hospital staff, the suspect was pronounced deceased at the hospital.

The SFPD and officials from the US State Department are working with the Chinese consulate.

This investigation is ongoing, and SFPD cannot release any further information at this time.

SFPD Investigates Mission District Homicide

On October 7, 2023, at approximately 1:58 a.m., San Francisco Police officers responded to the area of 18th and Mission Streets on a report of a shooting.

When officers arrived, they located an adult male victim suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. Officers rendered aid and summoned paramedics to the scene, who transported the victim to a local hospital with life-threatening injuries. Despite life-saving efforts made by officers, emergency responders and hospital staff, the victim succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased at the hospital. No arrests have been made at this time.

Investigators from the San Francisco Police Department Homicide Detail arrived on scene and are leading this open and active investigation.



PREVENT GARAGE DOOR BREAK-INS

Garages can sometimes be the most vulnerable area of the home and they are often the entry point most targeted by thieves because of the easy access to the home. Here are some tips to help secure your garage and protect it from theft.





ALWAYS CLOSE YOUR GARAGE DOOR

This may seem obvious, but just drive through any residential neighborhood and you'll likely see a few wide-open garage doors. This is an invitation to burglars and at the very least, you're allowing passersby to easily view the contents of your garage.



INSTALL MOTION-SENSITIVE

Homes and garages with poor exterior lighting become more appealing targets for burglars. Ensure all entry points are well-lit. Constant lighting supplemented by motion sensitive lighting is best.



REINFORCE THE GLASS ON THE GARAGE DOOR

Add vinyl adhesive to reinforce garage windows. You can also opt for a frosted or translucent glass design to allow sunlight in while obscuring contents inside.



DON'T LEAVE GARAGE DOOR REMOTE IN YOUR CAR

A garage door remote is basically another key into your home and thieves won't hesitate to use it if they find it. Opt to use a remote on a key hair.



MANUAL GARAGE DOOR

When leaving on a vacation or for extended periods of time, disconnect automatic door motor and install a manual lock.



TIE EMERGENCY RELEASE CORD

Tying your emergency release cord into a small ball will make it more difficult to reach by thieves who manage to break the garage windows.



INSTALL SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

There should be at least 1 exterior mounted camera facing the street and registered with the D.A.'s office.



SECURE ANY VALUABLES

Keep all tools in cabinet systems with locks and be sure to hang and lock any bicycles. As much as possible, try to avoid keeping valuable items in the garage or inside vehicles.



HAVE A QUALITY, FUNCTIONING GARAGE DOOR

Garage doors should be as secure, sturdy, and well-built as your front door and should remain in good condition and tight fitting. Deadbolts should also be added to the garage-to-house door.



INSTALL INTERIOR MAIL SLOT HOOD COVER

If the garage door is equipped with a mail slot, a hood cover will prevent any view into the garage and its contents, eliminating enticement to enter.


